



Here Comes Autumn

On Friday, summer officially comes to an end. While hurricane season started back in June, we usually associate autumn as the time when most of these storms strike. As I write this column, there are ominous reports of Florence heading towards North Carolina with great fury. When Mother Nature rears up with anger, sadly there is often great destruction as well as suffering. One day at lunch this week the staff here recalled all the headaches and disruptions of life we experienced when super-storm Sandy hit Long Island. We pray that everyone in the path of Florence prepares well and takes themselves out of harm's way.

This past Tuesday our nation remembered the anniversary of the 2001 terror attacks. I always find that day to be somber and reflective as we recall everything that unfolded during those chaotic hours. If you recall, that first Sunday after the attacks, Masses were packed. So many people came to the Church to seek consolation and to share the pain of that time of grieving, waiting and coping within the context of the community. It is a remarkable and beautiful thing that buried deep within the heart and soul of many people is an awareness that the Church is there in a time of crisis. We need to be present to offer God's hope and life to all who are in need. We continue to pray for all those who bear physical and emotional scars in the aftermath of that tragic day in our history.

This week Holy Cross welcomes Bishop Robert Coyle. He will be celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation for 159 of our young people on Wednesday. It is certainly a busy day; there are three different ceremonies. It is always a happy and exciting day. A day like this only comes about because of the efforts of so many people. We are grateful to catechists, parents, coordinators, liturgical ministers and our Religious Ed Office for their commitment and work in bringing this day to life. Congratulations to our newly confirmed and their families.

There has been a bit of "critter activity" around my house this week. A band of wild squirrels broke into my outdoor storage cabinet and ate all my fish food. And, a family of mice has settled into my pantry and is eating all my priest food. I'm trying to move them along as gently as I can by using a have-a-heart trap, but they are skillfully avoiding it.

I don't know about your yard, but mine is becoming mighty soggy. We have had so much rain and so little sunshine. I feel as though, if I sit too long in one place, moss may start growing on me. If April showers bring May flowers, what do September monsoons bring?

Don't forget that Sr. Pat Duffy will be here this afternoon to offer a few words of spiritual inspiration. We hope you can be there for her presentation.







Army Chaplain Falsely Accused

Army Chaplain, Maj. Scott Squires, was accused of discrimination, and threatened with six months in a military prison, when he declined to include a same-sex couple in a marriage retreat. Although he explained that he would include the couple in a subsequent retreat conducted by another chaplain, the investigator recommended that Squires be punished.

Citizens inundated the Pentagon and Congress with telephone calls and emails urging the military to exonerate Maj. Squires and he was represented by First Liberty Institute (FLI). "Chaplains do not have to give up their First Amendment rights in order to serve fellow soldiers," said an FLI attorney. The U.S. Army complied with FLI's request to reverse the investigator's conclusion and Chaplain Squires was completely exonerated.

Rep. Doug Collins (R-GA), who also is a military chaplain, said, "The case of Chaplain Scott Squires highlights how imperative it is that we protect freedom of conscience for every individual in the U.S. military, including the chaplains who minister to them."
