

Farewell to Summer

Sunday is the last full day of summer; autumn officially arrives on Monday. I hope it was a good one for you.

I will not be here for the 11:30 Mass today. I will be putting on my "Dean's hat." One of the functions of the Dean is to witness the installation of a new pastor. I will be at the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish in Centereach. Fr. Joseph Alenchery is being installed as the new pastor. This will be my first time functioning in this capacity; I hope I get it right. As you may recall, it is a simple ceremony that takes place within the context of Mass. There are formal introductions to leaders within the parish such as trustees, Parish Staff and Pastoral Council members. The new pastor is also required to sign an Oath of Fidelity and a Profession of Faith.

Last week, I stopped in to say "hello" to the collection counters. When I entered the room they were in the midst of opening the Renovations and Major Repairs envelopes. I was surprised at how many there were. When the total button was hit, there was over \$3,000 that came from about 165 families. I am grateful that so many parishioners offer this support in addition to their regular weekly offering to the parish. There is a great spirit of Stewardship at work in gifts being offered to the parish, and those gifts are being used well.

There is an effort made to care for and maintain our facilities. Some of the maintenance done may not be immediately visible. There was a great deal of work which took place this summer. Attention was given to the parish grounds with an abundance of weeding and removal of branches, small tress and shrubs that were beginning to take over our property. Much of the outside of the building and colonnade around the courtyard was bleached and washed. It was a delicate balance of removing dirt without damaging the stucco which is becoming more fragile over time. Even the statue of the Welcoming Christ got a good scrubbing.

Thursday will be a busy day here at Holy Cross. Bishop Henning will be here to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with 158 of our young people. There are three Masses that take place during the day. (Daily Mass will take place at 8AM on Thursday.) Moments like this cannot take place without the combined efforts of many people: parents, catechists, our Religion Education Office, and all those who assist with the celebration of the Masses. I am grateful for all those who help. Please keep our young people in your prayers on this important day of their lives.

WHAT'S NEW?

Liturgy Bytes



Picking up our topic from last week – the Assembly, congregation, people of God, etc., our comments will be more practicable, and I hope helpful!

Participation is more than reciting prayers, responding to the priest or singing the hymns. Participation is way more than that. It involves every person in the Church-- body, soul, mind and heart. We are invited to join in this great act of worship by making certain bodily gestures together.

Consider making a specific commitment to enhance your participation at Sunday Liturgy. A few suggestions that might help are:

- 1. Make Sunday Mass the centerpiece of your day.
- 2. If possible, read the Scripture readings during the week so they will be familiar to you. You can also get to Church early and read them prior to Mass beginning.
- 3. Be more aware of God's presence within the silence during Mass. Try to be attentive during times of silence to listen to God's voice within you.
- 4. Try to get to know the people sitting around you in the Church.
- 5. Be mindful to thank and praise God during your prayer moments during the week.
- 6. At the time of the presentation of the gifts, try to be aware of all you have offered to God this week in the way of your time, talent and treasure.
- 7. Try to be more reverent during Mass by thinking about what you are doing during each part and of what your actions mean as you make the sign of the cross, kneel, process forward for Communion and genuflect or bow.
- 8. Make a sincere effort to carry the Mass with you into the world. You can try to respond to the Gospel by being more aware of the needs of others and working harder for justice.

Don't be overwhelmed by the above list of suggestions, pick one or two to begin. Sometimes just being made aware of these pointers is all we need --- those little reminders go a long way!

We are familiar with the part of the Mass when petitions are offered. Today it is referred to as the Universal Prayer, although through the years it has also been called the General Intercessions or The Prayer of the Faithful. The prayers that we currently use come about through a variety of ways. Sometimes we write our own. We also have several on-line resources and books that we use in creating the prayers for each week. Additionally, there is a parishioner who assists in writing them.



We are offering the opportunity for parishioners to suggest needs or intentions that could be prayed for at our weekend Masses. Identify issues within our world, nation, community or Church. This would not be the place to mention individual people or private prayers such as "for my cousin, Daisy." (Our Petition Book in the atrium is available for these special intentions.) Please suggest any prayers you would like to see included in our worship. Keep the following guidelines in mind:

- Be succinct; the prayer needs to be limited to one or two short sentences.
- Normally prayers begin with "For." For our nation, ...
- This is not the place for prayers of gratitude. In Thanksgiving for . . .
- Prayers should not include any particular agenda or personal opinion.

Depending on how many requests we receive, we will try to include at least one intention per week. It may be necessary to edit the prayer so that its format is consistent with the other prayers.


