

'Tis the Season for Corn Mazes, Pumpkins & Cider

October begins this week. Cooler weather, colorful leaves, autumn festivals and all sorts of other activities distinguish this transitional month to make it very unique. For Fr. Frank, who lives out on the North Fork, these days are a bit of a challenge, particularly on weekends. That area of Long Island becomes a hub of autumn activities. Unfortunately, the roads are limited and gridlock becomes part of the experience as well. Remember everyone, patience is a virtue.

I can't begin to express my gratitude for all the people who made last weekend's Fall Festival come to life. There is a separate page which identifies the many parishioners who offered helping hands as well as local businesses who supported our effort. Be sure to also look at the pages of pictures which captured some of the happy events of the day. Thank you to our new Coordinator of Religious Education, Tricia Clarke, who came up with this idea, formed a great committee of parishioners and brought it to completion.

The weather could not have been any better. In fact, it almost felt more like "welcome back summer" rather than a fall festival. There is a tradition in the parish which dates back to its earliest days; rather than charge a specific price for events or activities, we simply invite a free will offering. We are not able to do this with every aspect of parish life, but when we can it is a great dynamic. Some parents were surprised and delighted that there was no cost associated with a pony ride, or pumpkin painting, or even food. There was a great spirit of community as folks gathered for a hamburger, some music and a festive environment to simply be with one another. Although we have not yet formally evaluated everything that took place, I think we have a winner which will make it onto our calendar every year. Moments like this help to define and carry on the spirit of Holy Cross.

I will be away this weekend making my annual retreat. Normally this time in prayer is a full week, but this year it is only a long weekend. For me, this kind of experience is even richer if there is a journey involved. I love to travel. This year my travels bring me back to a place where I have already made several beautiful retreats, the Land of Enchantment, New Mexico. Please remember me in your prayers as I will hold Holy Cross and the many good people who are part of this community in my prayers.

Next Saturday we will be remembering the Feast of St. Francis (which actually falls on Friday) with the annual blessing of the animals. If you have a little critter that is a pet and brings you joy, I would be happy to bless it next Saturday afternoon at 3:00 PM in the courtyard.

LITURGY BYTES

Thought for the Week: Come, enter the Sacred, receive the message...

Do you remember the parish Church you attended growing up----what it looked like, its size etc. This week I would like us to focus on another important part of the Liturgy and that is the environment in our churches.



Even though the Eucharist is central to our focus and of prime importance for our participation, our surroundings also influence us when we are present at Mass. Everything in a church is there to enhance our participation in the religious rites we celebrate. Every building which serves as a church says something about who God is and about those who come to worship.

Most of us have probably never heard what the building and its furnishings are telling us or that these elements affect our participation. Most people take for granted the shape, decorations and furnishings of the building.

Locally for many folks in this area of Long Island, over 30 years ago in 1988, the “Mother Church of Ronkonkoma” – St. Joseph’s, was divided and 3 new parishes were formed. Perhaps some of you, like myself, experienced those early days of worship. Some were fortunate enough to find temporary homes in the lower chapel of the Cenacle Retreat House, or at the Cleary School for the Deaf and even in a bank building. Temporary makeshift altars with modest furnishings were used to create sacred space to gather the families week after week to celebrate our most precious gift – the Mass – and to develop faith-filled communities.

Presently, do you pay attention to the banners or decorations when you come to Church? Perhaps these items are more noticeable to you on special feasts and holidays. What about the size of the Church’s worship space ---- a small chapel vs. a large cathedral? Does the size of the room put you in a different mood? What about the temporary places used for Mass, like school auditoriums? I am sure we all would respond differently to the above questions.

If you have the opportunity to visit different churches, what do you first think about when you enter that sacred space? Is it the size, the furnishings or the community it serves? How about those large buildings where the altar seems miles away or those Gothic churches with the high vaulted ceilings? On a different note, what about those tiny, wooden, country churches with the very short aisles and simple décor? How are these various spaces engaging us into the wonder and awe of God?

We all have our preferences for the kind of building we think best helps us actively join in the worship of God. I know firsthand that great care was taken in constructing the 3 “new” parishes carved out of St. Joseph’s in our area. Over and above the design of the building, beautiful art, well-designed furniture and well-crafted liturgical items also foster participation. They are there for a purpose.

I invite you to choose something the next time in Church to reflect on: maybe the altar or the crucifix. Suggested reflection questions: Does the altar call us to come to His table to be fed alongside our sisters and brothers in Christ, or does the crucifix suggest the terrible price of sin that helps us realize that through the Mass, Jesus liberates us from our sins because of His great love for us? I hope your choice will enhance the message you hear as you enter the Sacred.


