What do Flex-Glue and the Holy Spirit have in Common?

Did you ever see the commercials for those glue products that do so much? I have never used them and this is not an advertisement for them, but there seems to be something miraculous about them. They work in all conditions, even underwater. They work immediately. But wait, there's more; they have mighty strength and can accomplish great feats. One product can do so many things in so many different situations. Hmmm, it got me thinking...

We celebrated Confirmation here almost two weeks ago, but I am still reflecting upon the experience. It is remarkable how one moment can touch so many people in very different places.

- For those who work to bring about a day like this, it brings a sense of great fruition when the day is done. For catechists, our Religious Ed Office staff and volunteers, there is a powerful feeling of satisfaction. In different ways, many good people were instrumental in bringing our young people to this celebration in their faith life.
- For those who serve at the liturgies: musicians, servers, sacristans and ushers, there is a tremendous sense of joy (that is mixed with a dose of exhaustion) for the day. We shared in and witnessed something beautiful.
- For our regular Church-going families, it is a moment of strengthening and celebrating something that is already an important part of their life - their faith.
- For parents, there is a sense of pride (and maybe a little trepidation) as they witness their children moving towards adulthood.

But wait, there is more; we had 159 young people receive the Sacrament. Shouldn't the church be packed on Sunday in the weeks following that moment? This is where it gets a little tricky. While there may be a desire to see a broader and more visible impact in regards to weekend Mass attendance, we cannot limit the work of the Spirit to this one criteria.

We need to allow the Spirit to unfold in the hearts of all people in the way in which it was meant to happen. While we would hope that a positive and uplifting celebration would inspire greater Mass participation, we need to be open to the possibility that for some, their faith will be lived in a different way. Seeds may have been planted, but they have not yet come to full bloom.

The Spirit can work in all situations: for those who sit in the front row and for those who may be more on the fringe of parish life. The Spirit can open a heart in an instant, or it may slowly be at work in the life of a person. The good news is you don't have to order by midnight or pay for shipping. We need to live with an open heart and allow the Spirit to bring us and our community life in abundance.




