



WHAT WILL YOU BRING?



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. This is the familiar part of the Christmas story when the three wise men make precious offerings to the child Jesus. I have always maintained that the Magi did not set out with the intention to bring gifts. They had been hired by Herod (who had ill intentions for Jesus) to go on a fact-finding mission and to report back to him what they witnessed. But rather than being spectators of that event, they were drawn into it. Having come into the presence of the child Jesus, they were inspired to give precious gifts. They also had a change of heart and did not return to Herod. Having encountered the Lord, they literally had to walk a different path.

Gift giving can be a meaningful experience. It's not about the amount of money spent, but rather an expression of love for those with whom we exchange gifts. A well-chosen gift reflects that we know something about the person and are affirming who they are. The gift can recognize we know a need in that person's life that we want to address. A gift can be a bond that affirms and strengthens a relationship.

What gift will you bring to the Lord? As the old expression goes, "It's hard to shop for someone who has everything." God doesn't need stuff. God wants our hearts. God desires we become the people he made us to be. God wants us to be people who live in peace with ourselves, one another, and with Him. What do we need to do to deepen that self-awareness and to deepen our relationship with God? What would bring more peace to your heart? Do you need to work on strengthening a relationship in your life? Do you need to overcome anger and resentment that surrounds what is happening in our politics and culture? Do you need to live a more balanced and healthy lifestyle? Do you need to not be consumed with fear and worry? These things are more than New Year's resolutions; they can be lifegiving steps forward in your faith journey.

When you give the perfect gift, there is tremendous joy in your own heart. This is even more so in our relationship with God. Ironically, the more we give away, the more we are fulfilled. Conversely, when we are stingy with honesty, vulnerability and trust, life becomes very narrow and very shallow. We are the ones who ultimately benefit when we enter more deeply into that mystery of God among us. As we reflect upon precious gifts offered by the wise men, may we be reminded that we too can offer precious gifts. The source of what we offer comes from the depths of our hearts.

Next week is the Baptism of the Lord. In particular, the 11:30 Mass is going to be abounding with enthusiasm and joy. We are inviting all those families who celebrated a baptism here in the past two years. It will be a festive day to celebrate our faith, this community, and the way in which God's gift of life continues to unfold.

On the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, the Church celebrates the manifestation of the Son of God to the world. Little is known about the visitors from the East who paid the Holy Family homage, but their story reminds us that great things happen in the humblest of places. The Magi followed the star to find the newborn Jesus in Bethlehem, which means House of Bread.



From the House of Bread came the Bread of Life. Following the example of the Magi, visit a church and pray before the Real Presence in the tabernacle.

Reflect on the world around you and look for examples of the miraculous way God allows things to occur in the humblest of places.
