

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael


Allow me to vent about two driving related issues. First, I had a beautiful week in Washington at the preaching seminar I attended. But yikes, the drive to and from was miserable, almost seven hours each way. I departed on a Sunday morning after the 8:00 Mass, and getting out of New York was not too bad. But, from the Delaware Memorial Bridge to Baltimore, the driving was at a snail's pace. The return trip was better in Maryland, but then the traffic was brutal once I got off the Verrazano Bridge. Next time, I'm taking the train. For those of you who have a lengthy daily commute in the car, God bless you. That kind of thing can whittle away at your spirit.

My second gripe is with the E-ZPass people. Back in June, I went to Atlantic City as I sometimes do. Between the bridges and the Garden State Parkway, there must be a dozen tolls on the roundtrip. I received notices for not paying at three different toll booths. (No, this is not one of those scam texts that have become common place; it's the real thing. They included pictures of my car driving through the E-ZPass lane.) I had my pass mounted on the windshield for the entire trip. Nine tolls registered properly, three did not. There is a \$50 fine for each offense. There is a convoluted appeal process that I am attempting to negotiate. But trying to talk to someone is impossible. It would be easier for me to get a private audience with Pope Leo than it would to get someone to talk to on the phone. I'm hoping the process works and this will quickly pass.

I hope the days of summer are passing at a leisurely pace for you. I'm enjoying this season. As I was not sure about my staying or being transferred from the parish until late spring, I did not make any plans for any extended vacations. I will be taking a few days around Labor Day, but other than that I'm enjoying my time here. I am trying to make the best of the nice weather when it comes along. I enjoy working around the house. I've had a few barbeques and am trying to make the most of the opportunities of the season. On these pleasant days, the staff and I enjoy our lunch together at the picnic table outside the back of the office.

If ever you stop by during the week and you hear me making unusual sounds in the Worship Area, chances are I am not going haywire. Rather, I am practicing some of the voice and breathing exercises I learned at the seminar. We take for granted our ability to speak. But when we are made aware of the many nuances that comprise a spoken word, there is a complexity to it. The capacity of the lungs, the position of the jaw, and the movement of the tongue can all impact the way a spoken work is heard. I don't know if you will notice any significant differences in the way I preach. But having a deeper awareness of all the subtleties of speaking does give greater possibility to the way in which something is spoken. I wish I had some of this training earlier in my formation. But sometimes it takes the passing of years to truly appreciate the wonder and intricacies of our own lives.


