

# A MAN AND HIS ROCKET

*Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael*



Allow me to offer a random reflection for Thanksgiving that was inspired by a recent overnight trip to New England.

If ever you happen to drive through the town of Warren, New Hampshire, you cannot help but see there is a retired Mercury Redstone rocket in the middle of the town square. I am familiar with the town of Warren. As a child, my family used to go to a summer resort in that town every year. In my high school years, I worked at that same resort. I came to know some of the people who call Warren their home.

Henry Asselin (although everyone called him Ted) called Warren his home. His life began there; his life ended there. Along the way he served in the US Army for twenty-two years which brought him to many corners of the world. He was a smart man, he was a simple man, and he understood people well. He was the kind of guy who everyone liked, and he left a lasting impression in your heart once you met him. I got to know him as manager of the resort where I worked.

He concluded his military service in Huntsville, Alabama, where he worked on the Mercury Redstone project. The end of his military career coincided with the end of the Redstone project. He learned that the remaining missiles were going to be scrapped. He was saddened at the thought of losing this piece of American history. He asked if he could have a rocket. He was told yes, but he had to move it himself. What do you do when you claim ownership of a 70-foot rocket? You bring it to your hometown. He and his wife Sheila paid \$2,000 (about \$15,000 today) to hire a truck. He did so for two reasons. First, to give his town something unique and something to be proud of. But more significantly, he wanted it to be a source of inspiration to the children to let them know they can dream for the stars. Alan Shepard also came from a small town in New Hampshire.



I find it inspirational that some people will do selfless and heroic things for something they believe in. Some people will do what is necessary to make a mark in a small slice of life, even if there is not a multitude of people who will recognize what is done. It is this inner desire to do good and make a difference that makes America an amazing place. It is that same spirit that allows God's kingdom to be built in our midst.

I'm sure everyone has a "Ted" in their life: someone who did great things, in gentle ways, for selfless reasons, and left a great impression along the way. Let us be filled with gratitude for those people who raise the bar as to what life can be and to what we can each accomplish. Happy Thanksgiving.







# CELEBRATING CHRIST THE KING

LITURGY BYTES *by Michele Hall*



This weekend we reach the end of the Liturgical Year with the feast of Christ the King. This feast day was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. As a response to the rise of secularization, atheism, and communism in the world and to publicly acknowledge the supremacy of Jesus Christ over all people and nations, Pope Pius XI issued the encyclical *Quas Primas*. This encyclical added the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ the King" to the Church liturgical calendar. It designated the feast to be celebrated on the last Sunday of October. However, in 1969, Pope Paul VI further enhanced this feast. To emphasize Christ's universal reign, he changed the feast day name to "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe." He also changed the feast date to the last Sunday in the liturgical year, emphasizing even more strongly the connection between Christ's kingship and His second advent (coming) to judge the world.

In our parish, each year on this feast, we re-commission those in our community who serve in the liturgical ministries of Lector, Eucharistic Minister, Usher, Musician, Altar Server, and Sacristan. A simple prayer of blessing is done at each Mass with those in attendance who serve in the above-mentioned ministries. Today, I close with the ***Servant's Reward***, words many good people are able to relate to in all they do for our parish.

***One day, when you are in heaven, someone will come up to you and thank you for the way you touched their life with hope and encouragement. The person's words will take you by surprise. Soon another person will seek you out, and then another and another. As you listen to each one's story, you will begin to discover all the ways that God used your life when you were completely unaware of it. You will find that it was not only through the big things you did but also through the small things—through a spoken word that was not planned, a spontaneous act of kindness, a loving attitude, or a simple prayer of concern. To your joy, you will discover that in all these ways and more, God used you to deposit an eternal measure of His love into many needy hearts.***

Please be mindful of the following instructions for ease of distribution:

We are requesting gift cards from these local stores (Kohl's, Target, Wal-Mart) to enable our families to purchase for themselves and their children the items they need. We are also requesting supermarket gift cards to enable each household to have a special holiday meal.

**(Reminder: gift cards need to be activated at the register)**

Sometimes Angels get separated from the actual gift card when they are returned. We ask that you, **in permanent marker, mark the amount of each gift card purchased directly on the gift card.** This can be done on the top right of the front or back of the card. This would be very helpful in eliminating the time-consuming job of calling for amounts on cards of unknown amounts.

I thank you in advance for your help in this matter.

Some Angels are coded (orange, purple, green, red) for the agencies we reach out to each year (Mercy Haven, Talbot House, Pronto, Olsen's Rest Home). If you choose one of these angels, **attach the Angel on top of the item with tape and return it to the Atrium by Sunday, December 8th.**

**When you purchase a gift card, please put the gift amount on the gift card.**

This information is needed so parish outreach can distribute the cards equally. **Gift cards do not need to be wrapped.**

Please put the gift card in an envelope and place it in the GIFT BOX on the table near our Angel signs.

**Please do not wrap gift items.**

This makes it easier on sorting day to count and distribute to the agencies.

*Thank you in advance for your understanding.*

Gifts and gift cards can be returned for the next 2 weekends at Mass or dropped off during the week at the Parish Office.

**PLEASE NOTE: Sunday, December 8th, is the last day to return gifts and gift cards.**






