





WHO DO YOU SAY THAT I AM?



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

This question is raised in today's gospel by Jesus as he speaks with Peter and the other disciples. It is a question worthy of reflection even today. As simple as it may seem, this is actually a rather complex two-sided question. Whatever answer is given will provide some insight into who Jesus is. But, equally important, the answer reveals aspects of the one who provides the answer. If someone sees forgiveness in Jesus, it is likely in relation to a place of sin or regret in that person's life. If someone sees Jesus as the one who heals, it likely comes from a place of pain or brokenness. What we see in Jesus is a reflection of our own journey and our own hunger.

When I was chaplain in the high school, every year we would choose a spiritual theme for the year. One of the more successful choices we made was this very passage, "Who do you say that I am?" It was an opportunity to teach and give insight into Jesus and the message he spoke. But it was also a wonderful opportunity to raise questions as to how the students saw themselves in relation to Jesus. Sometimes it was as simple as reminding each student that they are unique, they matter to God, and God knows who they are. It is a great gift to be able to work with young people as they discover and learn about who they are themselves.

This same way of looking at how the question is answered can also be applied to who we are as a parish community. From the very beginning of this parish a decision was made to embrace the welcoming and accepting spirit that Jesus demonstrated. That insight into who Jesus was is incorporated into the very design of the building. A statue of Jesus welcoming his children into the building is what you see as you approach the door in our courtyard. Even on the cross, Jesus extends his hand to reach out and offer his comfort and life in the midst of his own suffering. We want to be a welcoming community which reflects that loving and accepting spirit of Jesus. It is worthwhile to ponder the answer we would offer to that question. It will reveal our understanding of Jesus, but it also reveals who we are.

On another note, this week we remembered the tragic events of September 11 that took place twenty-three years ago. All of us remember where we were as we struggled to comprehend the events as they unfolded that day. There was so much suffering and sorrow. Sadly, there will be some events that demand that we simply stand in the shadow of the cross and realize we share in something far greater than any of us can fully embrace. There are still many who carry the emotional scars and even lingering health effects related to that day. We pray for comfort, healing, and the resolve to move forward believing the Lord calls us beyond the power of the cross to know his life.

Practice of Charity (Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2024")

Today, we struggle with Peter as we ponder where following Jesus might lead us. The passage from the letter of James reminds us that our faith must inspire us to act in a very specific way: our actions must focus on radically following Christ and dedicating ourselves to justice. Jesus openly speaks to his disciples about the suffering he will endure, which reminds us that the cost of discipleship is great. Following God's call to act justly can be scary.

Spend time resting in peace knowing that God opens your ears so you may hear God's call. Ask God to help you pinpoint one action you can take today to open your heart so that you can think as God does.

Who is someone who inspires you to deny yourself and follow Jesus? Reach out to them this week for conversation about what you are hearing God say to you.



The Parish Feast Day



Every year on September 14th, our parish celebrates its feast day along with the Church. It is called the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This is the name chosen by the early parishioners of our parish. Although it is not our actual anniversary, we do remember it in a special way each year. I thought it might be of interest to learn about the origin of this feast, especially this weekend.

Early in the fourth century, Saint Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the holy places of Christ's life. She razed the second-century Temple of Aphrodite, which tradition held was built over the Savior's tomb, and her son built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre on that spot. During the excavation, workers found three crosses. Legend has it that the one on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying woman.

For Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a Background Screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements.

- 1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children session: www.Virtus.org
- When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.
 - a. If you have not already attended Virtus, you are a first-time registrant.
 - b.The first screen will ask the name of your organization from the drop-down list, select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
 - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
 - d.One screen will have the Codes of Conduct. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - e.Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
 - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the Background Screening application.
- 2.Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop, you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide your Social Security number; if you do not provide a Social Security number, you will be charged a fee.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the "Submit" button.
