



COME, HOLY SPIRIT



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

Sometimes the liturgical calendar does not coincide with life. The celebration of Pentecost does not take place for four weeks. The Sacrament of Confirmation for our young people will not be celebrated until the beginning of June. In spite of that, we are very conscious of the working of the Holy Spirit. As I write this article, the Cardinals are preparing to enter the Sistine Chapel to begin deliberations for the new pope. If ever there was a time to be praying for the Holy Spirit to be at work, this is it. The man chosen will play a critical role in the direction of the Church as we move forward.

The movie Conclave was very timely in its release. Certainly, there are aspects of Hollywood that were added to the production of the film. But it does give some insight into the process of choosing a new pontiff. There is a deep font of traditions that surrounds the selection process. Beyond doubt, there are human dynamics at work in identifying the perspective and potential style of leadership of each candidate. Surrounding all of this, we pray, is the working of the Spirit that will identify a new Shepherd for the Church who will lead with compassion and love. My favorite scene from the movie was the depiction of a subtle, but powerful wind that moved through the Sistine Chapel as they were about to take what would be the final vote before a consensus was reached.

This issue is not something limited to the election of the pope halfway around the world. Assigning and moving pastors is part of every Diocese. It is a daunting task to meet the needs that are present. The number of priests continues to decline. This year there will be no priestly ordinations for our Diocese. The number of qualified pastors is limited. More and more parishes are facing changing dynamics including the need for sacraments to be offered in languages other than English. I feel blessed that I am not part of the "pastor shuffle" this year, but it is likely that next year both Holy Cross and I will be part of this process of change. We need the working of the Spirit not only in the Sistine Chapel but even more locally.

This weekend was our second and final celebration of First Holy Communion. We had 120 children share in the sacrament for the first time. First Communion always has an element of challenge to it. There are some families who are regularly part of our Sunday celebrations. There are some families and guests for whom it has been a while since they have been around. We always want to be welcoming and gracious to all, but we also need to maintain a respectful celebration of the sacrament. I hope we are able to achieve a happy balance between the two.

We are sorting out two lighting issues. Several of the LED lighting fixtures throughout the parking lot, (which were supposed to be maintenance free and last forever) are blinking like strobe lights. We also have an issue in the atrium. The fluorescent tubes that we use are no longer available as they have been determined to be detrimental to the environment. I'll keep you posted as we make progress in addressing both issues.

Last but not least, a Blessed and Happy Mother's Day to all of our moms. Each year we offer one day for the lifetime of love you share with your children.



MASS OF THE EARLY CHRISTIANS



LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



All the way back around 150-155 AD, St. Justin Martyr wrote one of the earliest descriptions of the Mass. See how it parallels to the structure of Mass today but slightly out of the order we are familiar with in some parts.

And on the day called Sunday, all who live in cities or in the country gather together in one place, and the memoirs of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read, as long as time permits (Liturgy of the Word - New and Old Testament readings), then when the reader has ceased, the president (priest) verbally instructs, and exhorts to the imitation of these good things (Homily). Then we all rise together and pray....for ourselves....and for all others in every place, that we may be counted worthy, now that we have learned the truth, by our works also to be found good citizens and keepers of the commandments, so that we may be saved with an everlasting salvation (Universal Prayer). Having ended the prayers, we salute one another with a kiss (Sign of Peace). There is then brought to the president of the brethren (priest) bread and a cup of wine mixed with water (Liturgy of the Eucharist - Presentation of the Gifts), and he taking them, gives praise and glory to the Father of the universe, through the name of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and offers thanks at considerable length for our being counted worthy to receive these things at his hands (Eucharistic Prayer). And when he has concluded the prayers and thanksgivings, all the people present express their assent by saying Amen. This word Amen answers in the Hebrew language to - so be it (Great Amen). And when the president (priest) has given thanks, and all the people have expressed their assent, those who are called deacons give to each of those present to partake of the bread and wine mixed with water over which the thanksgiving was pronounced (Holy Communion), and to those who are absent they carry away a portion (Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion bringing Communion to the homebound).

And they who are well to do, and willing, give what each thinks fit; and what is collected is deposited with the president (priest), who succors the orphans and widows and those who, through sickness or any other cause, are in want, and those are in bonds and the strangers sojourning among us, and in a word takes care of all who are in need (collection).

Have a blessed, prayerful, and joyful week ahead!

Like the early Christians described in Acts, we are inheritors of the gifts that flow from the resurrection: faith in God and the promise of eternal life and salvation given to God's children through Christ. Regardless of rejection from the world, we believe in this promise.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus likens his followers to trusting sheep, who hear his voice and follow him. Have you justified Jesus' faith in you this week? Are there ways you may have betrayed it?

As an expression of faith, attend daily Mass if you can this week.


