




IS IT STILL CHRISTMAS?



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

I understand that for most folks your tree has been down, and the decorations have been put away for a few weeks now. But here at the church we still have the creche up and we are singing Christmas carols. In the liturgical year, Christmas season does not end until the Baptism of the Lord. This feast does not always coincide with Sunday; it depends on what day of the week Christmas falls. But, for this year, Christmas lives on for this final weekend.



The 11:30 Mass will be particularly busy as we invite back all the families who had their children baptized here in the last year. Actually, this year the list of invitations spans two years because last year the Baptism of the Lord did not fall on a Sunday. We will offer the little ones a simple prayer of blessing. I'm sure there will be a chorus of young voices heard throughout the Mass. Rarely is that sound a distraction to me. It is a sound of new life, and we are delighted to welcome the families for this celebration.

This is the first article in about a month that is being written a couple of days before the weekend. The last few weeks, the articles had to be submitted weeks prior due to early deadlines for the Christmas and New Year bulletins. I can now pass along some parish news in a timely way.

Hopefully, by the time you read this column we will have a signed contract for our lighting project. It is a bit of a lengthy process as we need to hire our own lawyer to draw up the contract. This is a requirement of the Diocese that safeguards the interests of the parish. We need to make sure that there is proper insurance in place and that the terms of payment are favorable to both parties. We are looking for the project to begin at the end of January or the beginning of February. The Worship Area is quite dark for the evening Masses and any evening activities. This project is very much needed.

We have not yet hit the "total button" on the Christmas collection. We still receive envelopes and donations for several weeks afterwards. The good news is that we raised almost \$8,000 in the special "Let There Be Light" envelopes. The bad news is that it looks like the overall Christmas collection will be lower than last year. I was hoping for an additional boost for our lighting project in addition to the regular Christmas offering. It appears the same total amount of money will be raised, but it is split between the two collections.

This coming week we have some fun activities planned with our Religious Education children. I offer a "walk-through Mass" for our fourth graders. I don't actually celebrate Mass but rather explain all the details of the Mass to them. I show them the vessels we use and explain the vestments I wear. There are usually a few good questions posed at each gathering. Those questions often don't come from the kids but rather from their parents who are also watching. In addition, our Level 1 children will be given a tour of the church. There are many aspects to the church that the little ones may never have noticed or don't understand. It is a wonderful teaching moment.

Now go home and take down your Christmas stocking if it is still hanging on the fireplace.



LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



This weekend the Church celebrates the feast of the Baptism of the Lord which traditionally ends the Christmas season. The beautiful decorations of this season will slowly be removed as we enter Winter Ordinary Time and return to the green color. Some years, the way the calendar falls, the Baptism of the Lord does not fall on a Sunday as it does this year. The Baptism of the Lord Jesus is the great event celebrated after the feast of the Epiphany because it is the occasion of the first public revelation of all the three persons in the Holy Trinity and the official revelation of Jesus as the Son of God to the world by God the Father. It is also an event described by all four Gospels, and it marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. This year at the 11:30 Mass, we invited the families who had children baptized here within the past two years to join us for a special blessing.

We know from Scripture that Jesus descended into the Jordan River even though he really did not need to be freed from sin. Jesus conferred on water the power of a true baptism which would remove sin. Many points in Jesus' baptism are symbolic of what has happened at our baptism. At Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him; at our baptism we are baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. At Jesus' baptism, Christ was proclaimed the beloved Son of the Father, and at our baptism we become the adopted sons/daughters of God. Today, let us celebrate our first Sacrament with our families and friends!

Have a blessed, healthy, and peaceful week ahead!

After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." -Luke 3:21-22



Our homebound folks receive friendly telephone calls by Outreach volunteers to keep up the connection and to assess ways the parish can be present to these loved parishioners. At Advent and Easter time a volunteer will visit them and bring a gift from the parish community. Eucharistic Ministers are also available to bring communion to the homebound who desire it.

These are some of the ways Holy Cross reaches out to the homebound and hospitalized. Please help us by contacting Parish Outreach or a member of the Pastoral Team if you know of anyone we can serve in their time of need.
