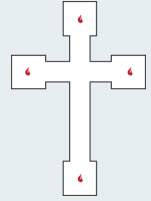

GETTING MY KICKS

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



This past week I have been on the Route 66 trip along with thirty-seven parishioners. As you gather on Sunday morning, we will be doing the same for the 9:00 Mass at St. Francis Cathedral in Santa Fe. I'm looking forward to this adventure along this historic American highway. Most of Route 66 has been replaced by Interstate 40, but there are still some remnants of the original road. There are also several small towns that maintain the character from decades ago that were part of that cross-country experience. Our trip began in Oklahoma City (although Route 66 begins in Chicago), which is a place I have never been before. I have not spent much time exploring middle America. I'm looking forward to experiencing this part of the country. I must admit, this is a bit of a travel overload with Ireland having been only a month earlier. I do not plan on being away for any additional weekends for the rest of the summer. I'm looking forward to enjoying the season around my house.

On Wednesday of this week, we will welcome Bishop Andrzej Zglejszewski to Holy Cross. He will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for 102 of our young people. It is always a happy day for those receiving the sacrament as well as their families. We are grateful to all the catechists who helped prepare our students for this day. In many instances it is the same catechist that has been with the same students since they made their First Holy Communion. Thank you also to all those who prayed for our candidates and even wrote them some words of support and encouragement.

Next week is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Traditionally, this day was referred to as Corpus Christi. This day will always have a special place in my heart. In 1988, that was the weekend of my ordination, so it was the feast day that was celebrated at my first Mass. As we have done previously, we will have a Eucharistic procession at the end of each Mass. We will walk past the Children's Garden and then along the path that goes through the Stations of the Cross. We will end with a Eucharistic blessing in the courtyard. Pray for sunshine so we don't get rained out.

Please consider attending the Knights of Columbus' Dinner Dance on June 13. Last year a great time was had by all. It was a fun evening with fellow parishioners. It's hard to find a night out with friends including dinner for only \$40. We greatly appreciate the support of the Knights who in turn help support the parish.

Thank you to all the parishioners who assisted in the setting of the altar last weekend at our Pentecost Masses. It was a simple gesture of setting the altar with care and reverence. For me it was a way to focus on the precious gift of the altar that we are privileged to share in. But it was also an affirmation of the people who are called to the table. There were young and old who were part of the ritual. Everyone demonstrated a great sense of reverence and care. There is a rich blessing when we are able to share in a prayerful and holy moment together. Thank you to all who made this possible.

We are in the planning stages of some Family Evenings of Summer Fun that will take place on the front lawn of my house. Look for more details in future bulletins.

What is Heifer International?



Heifer International is a nonprofit organization dedicated to ending hunger and poverty in a sustainable way. Its core purpose is to empower families and communities, especially in developing regions, by providing them with the tools, resources, and education they need to become self-reliant.

Rather than simply giving short-term aid, Heifer International focuses on long-term solutions. One of its most well-known approaches is providing livestock—such as cows, goats, chickens, or bees—to families in need. These animals can supply nutritious food like milk or eggs, generate income through the sale of products, and even help with farming through labor or fertilizer.

A key part of Heifer's mission is its "Passing on the Gift" model. When a family receives animals and training, they agree to pass on the first offspring to another family. This creates a ripple effect, allowing entire communities to benefit and grow stronger together.

Beyond livestock, Heifer International also emphasizes education and training in areas like sustainable agriculture, environmental care, gender equality, and financial literacy. This holistic approach helps communities build stable livelihoods, improve nutrition, and protect their natural resources.

In essence, the purpose of Heifer International is not just to alleviate hunger temporarily, but to create lasting change by helping people gain independence, dignity, and the ability to support themselves and others.

Holy Cross and Heifer International-

Our relationship with Heifer has been long standing. Over the years, we have counted and collected over \$15,000 dollars for Heifer International. Our very own "Kevin Bacon," our pig-shaped collection container, can be found most weekends in the Atrium waiting for you to "feed" him your quarters. These quarters collected over time add up! Depending on how much we collect, we then decide what animal(s) we can purchase to help a family.

We hope to continue supporting Heifer and the good work they do. **Your vote counts!**

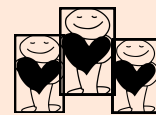

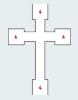

Practice of Charity

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity is a day to recall how we are invited to know, love, and serve God, who reveals the fullness of love to us and challenges us to be changed by it. In today's readings God is described to Moses as being slow to anger and abounding in love; St. Paul then encourages the Corinthians to reconcile with one another. And, of course, the passage from John's Gospel roots our salvation in God's love for us.

Think about how God loves us, and how that should inform our love for God and one another. Reflect on places and moments in your life when God's love has been especially clear to you.

Consider times when someone demonstrated slowness to anger or abounding love, or the kind of encouraging care to which Paul exhorts the Corinthians. How did those experiences make you feel? What can you imitate from them?

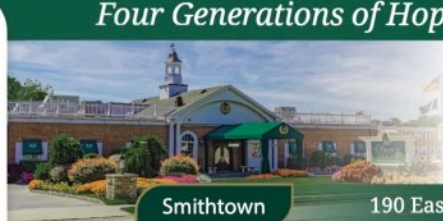
