

REMEMBERING MY FATHER

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



Last Friday was the 59th anniversary of my father's death. It's always an odd day for me as I remember the day of his death, but I really don't remember him. I was barely five years old when he died suddenly of a heart attack. I have a few happy memories of him. I remember being at the World's Fair with him. I remember him taking 8mm silent movies of us with blinding flood lights which was the cutting-edge technology of the time. I know of him mostly through the stories my mother and siblings told of him. There is a sense of grief and loss, but also an air of unknowing as to who he was. I know he was a good man, and I am grateful for the ways in which he was able to influence my life.

My father served in the army during World War II. He was stationed in London. I know that part of his assignment was involved in classified work in trying to decode intelligence messages. He received some awards for his work, but he did not tell many stories of exactly what he did.

After his time in military service, he met my mother. They lived in Rego Park, Hollis, and eventually New Hyde Park where I grew up. He was not a lawyer, but he was the Office Manager of a large law firm in Manhattan. I'm sure there are many things I do now of which he would be proud. But I definitely did not inherit his organizational skills. I imagine there are times he would roll his eyes if he could see the pile of rubble on my desk and my attempts to sort through it. But he would be pleased that sooner or later I get it done.

I remember my mother telling the story of an occasion of becoming so angry when he died leaving her to raise four children by herself. But that one moment of anger awakened in her a deep determination to do what she needed to do to raise her family. And she did a remarkable job. I'm sure there were many times she prayed to him for strength and guidance. His prayer card was her bookmark that she used all the time. Celine Dion sings, "love can touch us one time, but last for a lifetime." I think that was true of their relationship. She never remarried. One of the comforting thoughts at the time of my mother's death was that they were united again.

This article was written two weeks ago. I had to get it finished before leaving for my preaching workshop in Washington. Originally, I was going to briefly mention his anniversary in last week's bulletin, as that was closer to the actual date. But suddenly the thoughts started flowing, I kept writing, and it became an article unto itself. It prompted me to look at old pictures. We have very few photos of him as he was always the photographer taking pictures of us. Reflective time like this sometimes raises unanswered questions and even a bit of sadness. But there has been something very comforting and affirming in spending this time thinking about him. Thank you for allowing me to share.

Practice of Faith

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2025")

When confronted with the living God, Abraham and his daughter in faith, Mary, react in the same way, with a response that is itself living, flexible, and openhearted. In the Gospel, Jesus is explicit in saying that this is what he needs from his disciples, not busyness over good works or anxiety about externals. The supposed rebuke of Martha can be a difficult passage, but ultimately it speaks to the fact that relationship with God is an intimacy that goes beyond formalities.

Find and read the poem, "Let Your God Love You," by Edwina Gately. Pray that you are not too distracted by externals to recognize and welcome God.

Consider whether being a minister of care is a calling for you. If so, ask your parish for training so that you may bring Communion to shut-ins and the sick.

Sit with an older member of the parish and listen to their faith story.



BLESSING BAGS Donation Request






