



# Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

This week we formally said farewell to summer and welcomed autumn for the next three months. The transitional seasons remind us of change on many levels. I'm sure many of you wait as long as possible before turning on the heat for the first time. Some of these mornings can be challenging in that regard. There is beauty to the changing of the leaves, but it does lead us into the more bleak months of winter. There are many fun traditions and activities that go along with a season. I hope this season is filled with happy times and holy thoughts.

If you visit us in the evening, you will notice the parking lot has a significantly different look to it. All the lighting fixtures have been replaced. A number of years ago we replaced the old fluorescent type bulbs with LED bulbs. Although we were promised long life and reliability, they proved to be only a short-term fix that got us through a few years. This time we replaced the entire fixture which was a more costly undertaking. The man who designed the lighting upgrade in the Worship Area also handled this project, and once again he did a magnificent job. The lights are just as bright as before, but they provide a softer, warmer glow. I am delighted with the outcome. The cost of this project was near \$40,000. Thanks to the continued donations to the RAMR fund, we can do this work with no additional fundraising. Thank you. We now need to have a number of trees trimmed so they do not block the new lights. One thing always leads to another.

But we are not done with lighting projects. The atrium is the next project to be addressed. The old fluorescent tubes are no longer available. We need to see if LED replacement tubes will do the job. They may prove to have the same questionable reliability as when we changed the bulbs in the parking lot. A more significant improvement and installation of new fixtures may be required. There's more to come on this. And while we are at it, the walkway and driveway lights at the parish house have not worked for a couple of years. I have lots of flashlights, but it might be time to look for a more permanent solution.

We will be installing a water fountain in the atrium in the coming weeks. More and more people look for a source of drinking water during various services. We want to be able to address this need. The cost of the water fountain was about \$700 and the installation was provided by a parishioner.

While we will provide this amenity, this may be a good time to offer a reminder about things that can become a distraction during Mass. Yes, if someone is really thirsty and needs a drink, he or she should have some water. But it may not be necessary to drink from a crinkly plastic water bottle throughout Mass. Coffee and other beverages are not appropriate things to bring into the Worship Area. And be mindful of the sounds your cell phone might make as well as use of the phone during Mass. Our phones should not be a source of distraction to others.

As I write this article, I'm not sure where I stand with the "Route 66" trip. I have about 24 who have committed, but I really need 30 to make the trip work. It's still nine months away, but there are some rigid deadlines and restrictions with the airlines that demand a prompt decision as to what I will do. If you or anyone you know may be interested, please let me know by Tuesday.

Next weekend is our monthly Holy Hour on Saturday and Anointing of the Sick on Sunday.



# Liturgical Minister Training - Fall 2025

The Diocese of Rockville Centre will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One must attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

A Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.

You may not take EMHC Part A and the Lector Workshop on the same day.

**WORKS** (Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2025")

God has shown us, while we yet live, how we must live to be with him in heaven. The Gospel is a stark reminder that the unhoused person suffering at our feet is intimately known to and cherished by God; and that faith is not enough to secure the kingdom (the rich man, after all, was a believer). We have a choice to make - now.

It seems likely that Lazarus was a leper. Who are the lepers of today, whose wounds repel us and cause us to turn away? What comfort distracts us from our duty to them?

Pray to see the injustices that are right under your nose. Begin this week to address them with one small act of charity for somone at your doorstep, whose pain you may be dismissing.


