



THE SPIRIT ABOUNDS



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

As we approach Pentecost, this is the season to celebrate the Holy Spirit. That will be happening in many ways in the coming week. On Friday, Bishop John Barres will be here to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for 110 of our young people. Confirmation day is always an exciting and joyful day. Much preparation goes into receiving the sacrament, both for the young people as well as the parish. We pray that it will be a day in which they truly experience the power of God dwelling in their hearts and enabling them to use their gifts in service of the Lord. We are grateful to all those who helped to bring this day to fruition. Remember to pray for our young people.

Not only will the Holy Spirit be celebrated on Friday but on the weekend as well. Sunday is Pentecost, the day in which we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. Pastors are given permission to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for adults within the parish on Pentecost. This year we have a dozen people who have prepared for the sacrament. Two will receive at the 5:00 Mass and ten will receive at the 11:30 Mass. In addition to the sacrament, our liturgies will reflect the joyful spirit of the day. Pentecost deserves to be celebrated with enthusiasm and hope. We will do our best to bring the day to life here at Holy Cross. Remember to wear something red.

There are several events sponsored by the Diocese to bring to your attention. All of these are in relation to the Eucharistic Congress. On Tuesday, June 3, there are two opportunities. The first is a Eucharistic procession beginning at Sts. Philip and James Church in St. James and journeying to St. Patrick's in Smithtown. The procession begins at 11:00AM. The second event is a Revival Night taking place at St. Patrick's Church beginning at 7:00PM. The grand finale of the Congress will take place on Sunday, June 8. It will be held throughout the day at St. Anthony's High School in South Huntington. The day includes Eucharistic Adoration, speakers, opportunity for Reconciliation, and Mass. There is no cost for this event, but pre-registration is necessary. For additional information, please check the Diocesan website at drvc.org/congress.

Also, in the midst of this busy week, I will celebrate the 37th anniversary of my ordination to priesthood. As I am sure happens in married life, anniversaries give pause to reflect upon all the past years. It's remarkable how fast 37 years have gone by. There have been many changes in Church life since I was ordained, and I am sure many changes still to come. While there have been times of challenge, it has been a life filled with abundant blessings. There are parts of my life that are out of my control, such as where I will be assigned to work and live. That can be unsettling, but time and time again the Spirit has proven to lead and guide me with great wisdom. I feel richly blessed for being able to share this time with the good folks of Holy Cross. Thank you for all your support and encouragement. Together we work to bring the spirit of our Risen Lord to life within this community.

COMING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT



LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



Next weekend the Church celebrates the great feast of Pentecost, which along with Christmas and Easter are some of the great feasts of Christianity. Pentecost commemorates not only the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and Mary, but also the fruits and effects of that special event. The coming of the Spirit gave much grace and faith to the Church and all its children.

Jesus told his disciples that He had to leave them because the Paraclete needed to come to them, and He had to go to send the Spirit to them. As we know, He kept His promise and sent the Paraclete. As Easter is the feast of the resurrection, Pentecost is the feast of the visible mission of the Holy Spirit to the Church and to all of us. The life of Christ, which received at Baptism, is made perfect by the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Pentecost is the complement and completion of Easter. Pentecost is sometimes called the "birthday of the Church" when its leaders saw things in a new and different light. The Spirit of love and truth dwells in the Church and leads her each day. Pentecost is a day of thanksgiving for the foundation of the Church and for the coming of the Holy Spirit and, henceforth, the Sacrament of Confirmation which we will celebrate with our young people on Friday, June 6th, and with adults on the weekend.

On the weekend of June 7 and 8, wear something red to Mass as we celebrate this feast and place ourselves in the hands of the Holy Spirit! With the Church, on this day, we pray:

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth. Amen

Have a spirit-filled, prayerful and blessed week ahead!




