





CONNECTEDNESS BRINGS LIFE

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



A few experiences this past week have reminded me of the life and energy that come from being in relationship with others. Last year when I went on retreat, one of my Southwest Airlines flights was overbooked. I volunteered to give up my seat and received \$1,000 in flight credit for a future trip. I didn't want that credit to go to waste, so I used a bunch of it this past week. I flew out to Albuquerque to meet with a friend. We've known each other for over twenty-five years, but because of the distance we rarely get to see one another. It was a great gift. From there I flew to Tampa to spend a couple of days with my sister and my grandniece. I had spent time with my sister on my summer vacation, but my four-year-old grandniece is still trying to figure out who is this crazy Uncle Michael from New York. Children bring a wave of happiness to life.

Last weekend after the 5 o'clock Mass, over 100 parishioners took advantage of our invitation for a little barbeque in honor of our feast day. (A huge thank you to our Knights of Columbus for sponsoring the meal.) The evening weather was perfect for this near autumn gathering. I was amazed and delighted how many people came and how long they stayed. As we were heading out to the courtyard, I asked one parishioner if she was staying. Her response was, "Of course, I would never pass up a Holy Cross gathering." At every table I visited, people said, "This is wonderful." There is something life-giving that comes from sharing a simple meal with others. It was a beautiful evening.

There is life that comes from time shared with family, friends, and fellow parishioners. But there are other ways in which we also make meaningful connections. We once again used the "white cloth" to help celebrate our feast day. It is hung across the back window of the sanctuary. I preached about it in my homily. When I referenced all the names of the deceased written on it as having a connection to someone in this community, I saw a lot of heads nodding. A number of parishioners commented how they appreciate all the meaning that cloth has taken on. Even when our loved ones have gone before us, we can gain great solace in embracing the memories. There is also something comforting in knowing that we are not alone in missing our departed ones. There is strength that comes from sharing in that common experience.

There is one additional element of connectedness that cannot be ignored. It is when we remind ourselves that God's presence is woven deeply into all we do. On our feast day we were reminded of how we encounter the Lord in the reality of the cross. We are blessed with so many opportunities to encounter our God. May we always be renewed in life and love which comes from God.







LITURGY BYTES *by Michele Hall*



Please check out the information from the Diocese regarding training to be a Eucharistic Minister and Lector on the opposite page. Both ministries are needed, and it is a wonderful opportunity to deepen your own faith by serving others.

Briefly, you can choose to serve at the Mass you normally attend. Schedules are made up in two-month segments. Special times of the year (Christmas, Easter and Holy days) are not assigned, giving you the opportunity to pick your own Masses according to your schedule. A few ministry meetings are held during the year for reflection and support. Specific training to procedures followed here at Holy Cross will also be provided. The Diocese offers training only twice a year: fall and spring. So please consider this invitation as we begin the fall season.

If you are thinking about either ministry, EM or Lector, please feel free to contact Michele Hall at the Parish Office. In addition, you will be asked to speak with Fr. Michael so a formal letter on your behalf may be sent to the Bishop's Office along with registering you for one of the training dates. The second phase after the Diocesan training will be to complete your contact information and meet for a simple Holy Cross training before serving the first time.

If you feel a little shy, we also invite you to join our other ministry of being an Usher and Greeter at Mass. Again, you choose the Mass to assist at. This ministry is particularly needed at those holiday times in the Church year.

Pray about it, reflect about it, ask questions, speak with others already serving! We are here to also listen to your concerns and questions.

TRAINING OPPORTUNITY



Liturgical Minister Training~ Fall 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This “BASIC” training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors. You may not take EMHC Part A and the Lector Workshop on the same day.

Membership in the Catholic Church



Do you know someone who is:

- not baptized, but interested in learning about the Catholic faith?
- baptized in another Christian denomination, but wishes to explore membership in the Catholic Church?
- baptized in the Catholic Church but hasn't celebrated the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist (Holy Communion)?

Then, the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is just what they're looking for!

RCIA is the process through which adults are welcomed and fully initiated into the Catholic Church.

RCIA = OCIA

At the close of the Second Vatican Council, the RCIA was re-introduced as the means for adults to join the Catholic Church. RCIA, or, the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*, is a months-long process in which inquirers learn more about God and about Catholicism as they journey toward being received into the Church. In 2021, after a lengthy study of the RCIA, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops approved a new translation in which the process would be called **OCIA**, or, the **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults**. Since this is a more accurate translation of the original Latin, RCIA will become OCIA officially on the 1st Sunday of Advent this year. For all you Catholic trivia buffs, share the news!


Practice of Hope (Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2024")


Each day, this week, hold in your prayer someone who models service. How does this person humbly help others? How do their actions point to God's goodness? How do they challenge you to a life of service to others?




