



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

The past few weeks my columns have been about spiritual matters and life within the Church and beyond. These are certainly pertinent and appropriate things to write about. But it's also fun to write about the silly and more ordinary stuff of life, particularly as we move closer to the summer.

Allow me to begin with a tale of yardwork at the house. My TV room has a wall of windows that faces the front of the house. In front of those windows is a row of ornamental shrubbery. I do my best to keep them pruned and trimmed and looking neat. There are a variety of plants, but two of them have been a nuisance since the day I moved here. They look like azalea bushes, but they have thorns. Through the years it has been a painful task to prune or to pick weeds around them. I dread going near them because they always seem to get me. SIGNING OF THE SENSES



LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



You are probably wondering what the above notation, "signing of the senses," is referring to. This is the gesture we do at the beginning of the Gospel acclamation read by the priest or deacon at Mass. Many things happen at Mass that we often participate in without fully knowing their meaning. So why do we do this, and what does this gesture mean?

As the priest or deacon proclaims: "A reading from the Holy Gospel according to......" the congregation responds, "Glory to you, O Lord." At that moment, everyone makes three small signs of the Cross on their forehead, lips, and heart. Why?

This triple sign of the Cross is more than a ritual. It is a silent prayer. With this gesture, we ask the following:

- May the Word of God be in my mind or in my thoughts.
- May the Word of God be on my lips and in my speech.
- May the Word of God be in my heart and shape my love.

It is a personal moment of devotion and preparation asking God that His Gospel transform our minds, guide our words, and purify our hearts.

The practice has roots back over a thousand years in Church history and shows the deep reverence the Church gives to the Gospel. It reminds us that we are not listeners of the Word but are called to live the Word in our lives. So, next week at Mass as the Gospel begins and you trace the cross on those three spots, remember what you are saying:

"Lord may Your Word be in my mind, on my lips and in my heart. Amen."

Have a prayerful, restful, and joyful week ahead!



Practice of Hope

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2025")

The Gospel is clear that the poetic serenity and confidence of the first reading ("The Lord possessed me, the beginning of his ways...l was his delight day by day") is possible because it is mediated through the person of Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Through baptism, we are invited to enter into this relationship of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, which is our hope of salvation.

Read the poem "Hope Is a Thing with Feathers," by Emily Dickinson, with its intimations of the freely given gift of the Holy Spirit. Thank God for his gift of the Holy Spirit and hope. End your prayer with the doxology ("Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit...")

Find an area of your life where you are fearful and make an active choice to replace that fear with hope - believing that you are God's delight.
