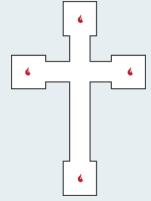

HEAVENLY THOUGHTS

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael



At some point in my childhood, I was taught a simple formula for remembering one of our Marian feast days, the Assumption. That feast is celebrated on August 15. I'm not sure how old I was when I learned this or who taught me, but here is what was said. "One day Mary disappeared. Where did she go? We ASSUME she went to heaven. Thus, we have the feast day of the Assumption." While not theologically perfect, this simple thought reminds us of a profound part of our faith tradition. We embrace that Mary's role in the story of salvation is unique. She was singularly chosen to be the bearer of God's son. Because of this honor, we believe that she herself was conceived without sin. And we believe that at the end of her earthly life, she was assumed into heaven both body and soul.

This holy day gives pause to reflect upon a great mystery which is part of our belief: heaven. We all have some image of what we think it looks like. We can all give some description of that in which we believe. But when we try thinking through all the details, our minds fail in being able to embrace it all. We think of it as a place, but where exactly is it? What will we look like once we are there? We leave our human body behind in death. Do we experience heaven as if we were in our youth, middle age, old age? What happens if we meet someone in heaven we didn't like in this life? We believe it is eternal, but when we try thinking about forever, our logical minds can't comprehend.

This lack of complete understanding is not meant to frustrate us. It reminds us that we always live in the shadow of God's grace that goes beyond all of us. There is something contradictory at work. We stand in the midst of great mystery, yet we are united deeply with God and are filled with hope. Belief coming forth from that which we cannot see or prove is called faith. Mary had great courage to trust the hand of God at work in her life in amazing ways. We too dare to walk that path of faith. We may contemplate what awaits us after this life's journey, but we can also know of God's wisdom and grace touching us here and now.



Several words of thanks need to be offered. First, a heart-felt thank you for those who assisted in our clean-out project in the basement. Summer heat and humidity were part of both days. In spite of that, everyone carried on getting the task completed in short time. Over the course of two weekends, a tremendous amount of stuff was removed. Happily, we were able to give away many usable items. The rest was thrown away. There is still some organization that needs to take place in the basement. Now we have room to sort things out and to store them properly. A second thank you to the many people who have responded so generously to our appeal for additional food items for our food pantry. At this point, we are happy to report over-flowing shelves in our pantry. The requests keep coming, but we are in good shape to be able to respond to them thanks to your generosity.

Last week I advertised the overnight trip to Lancaster in November. Much to my amazement, we had a full bus by 12:00 Noon on Monday. I am delighted to have so many people who want to travel, but I hate being the bearer of bad news when I have to report that we are sold out.

Practice of Charity

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2026")

It is always hard to read harsh or condemnatory words in Scripture, especially when they don't correspond to our experience of God's love. However, we can hold those words up as a mirror to our own faith practice: Are we gatekeepers, the kind of people who exclude, as those in today's readings do to the Gentile and the Canaanite woman in today's readings? Or are we opening gates wide, inviting any and all to experience the healing power of the Gospel?

Reflect on a time when someone came to you in need, and you turned them away. What could you have done differently? Resolve to respond better the next time someone in need approaches you.

Research the charitable arms of the Catholic Church. Catholic Charities and Catholic Relief Services commit to serving those in need for an oft-quoted reason: "not because they are Catholic, but because we are Catholic."



Accessibility Issues



A few weeks ago we received a call from a long-time parishioner who sadly told us she is no longer able to attend Mass at Holy Cross. She is limited in her mobility and has found the walk from our parking lot to the Worship Area too difficult, even using one of our handicapped parking spaces. We do have handicapped parking spaces, but some of them are on hills, which makes using a wheelchair or rollator potentially dangerous. Some of the spaces require a fair bit of walking.

We don't have any viable options for making our handicapped parking easier to use. But the question has been raised, can we do anything to improve the accessibility of our building from our parking lot?

Some possible considerations:

- Have rollators, walkers and/or wheelchairs available to use to provide access to the building.
- Have trained volunteers who could assist parishioners in using this equipment to get inside.
- It was even suggested that we have a golf cart to drive people from their parking spot to the atrium doors.
- Can we create a "Mass transit" system where parishioners can offer rides to those who are unable to drive?
- Are there other needs or potential solutions?

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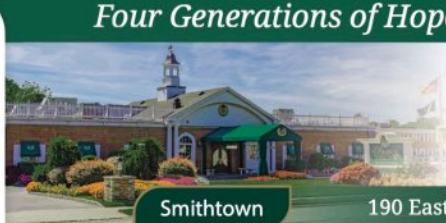
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
