



THE ART OF WAITING



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

Whenever we hear that we need to face a period of waiting, inevitably we think that something has gone wrong and we try to minimize the delay. Be it waiting for a flight held up for stormy weather or a doctor whose appointment schedule is woefully overbooked, we tend to scrunch up our faces, look at our watches, and think how an injustice is being done to us. None of us likes to wait. Yet, in the face of these strong feelings of disdain, the Church tells us we are entering into a holy season where the focus is meant to be waiting and anticipation. This time of waiting in the Church looks and sounds different than how the rest of the world faces these days.

I don't know whether it is part of my DNA or it was something I was taught, but for me, waiting has its fruits. As a child, every summer we used to go away in August for a one-week vacation to New Hampshire. I remember delightfully counting down the days and planning. To this very day for me, planning and anticipating a trip is half the fun of going. In spite of that, I too find Advent to be a challenging time.

There is one exception to this rule of waiting that most people happily embrace. When an expectant mother shares the news that a child is on the way, there is a response of joy and excitement. Everyone knows the process can't be rushed; it will take nine months. We cannot lose the connection between a human birth and the story of the incarnation which proclaims that God has taken on human flesh and dwelt among us. Just as we anticipate the joy of a newborn child, we are called to have an open heart to allow the power of Christ Jesus to touch us once again. Too often we allow our failings or feelings of inadequacy to interfere with God touching our hearts. Allow these days to offer comfort and hope, and try not to fret about the busyness of the season.

We are happy to be able to offer a bit of spiritual guidance for this holy season. We have invited Father Larry Lewis to be with us. Father Larry is a Maryknoll priest whose full-time ministry is at Cormaria Retreat House in Sag Harbor. He regularly leads retreats and missions in addition to being a spiritual director. One of his passions is identifying spiritual themes in movies. The Pastoral Team and Staff shared an experience with him at one of his days of prayer last spring. We were touched by his lively spirit. In particular, he spoke of the spirituality of waiting which sparked in our minds the idea to invite him to Holy Cross for Advent. He will be preaching at all the Masses this weekend. On Monday evening, we will offer a more extended presentation regarding the charism of waiting. I am confident his words will help to provide a framework that will allow these days to be filled with wonder and joy. Please consider coming and giving a boost to your spiritual journey.

LITURGY BYTES by Michele Hall



Every year as we begin the Advent season, I use the Happy New Year greeting because for the Church it is the beginning of a new year! We move into another cycle of Scripture readings, especially noted is the Gospel which will be from Luke this year.

Even though the world around us has been moving into Christmas since early October (just visit the stores and you will see what I mean), the Church in her wisdom tells us to take time to prepare the way for the Lord.

Unlike Lent, where we tend to fast or give up things, Advent is a time of anticipation as well as preparation. Perhaps, joining with our Blessed Mother and Saint Joseph recalling their journey awaiting the birth of Our Lord is something on which we could reflect. How did they prepare? At this time of the year, I think about waiting especially when I am on a line waiting to check out. It is a good distraction to think, even for a few moments, on the waiting Mary and Joseph experienced and how they handled it. Waiting should also remind us of who we are waiting for and how prepared we are.

Another symbol that surrounds us is light. There are special displays all over Long Island with beautiful and spectacular lights. Many homes are decorated with lights, even before we celebrate Thanksgiving. Can we take this spectacular vision and be reminded of Christ, who is the Light of the World? Do we see these lights as a sign of renewal? Can we be a light for our world? Would this be the symbol to choose for your Advent this year?

May we all go forth whether in prayerful waiting or blessed lighting as we grow in our love for the birth, once again, of Our Lord Jesus.

Advent Wreath Weekly Prayer & Blessing for Your Home

This year, why not give some meaning to your Advent wreath to deepen your family's understanding and appreciation for this beautiful Advent season. Set aside a time when the family is together to pray and light the candle for the appropriate week. It is a wonderful way to engage in something prayerful with those you love.

Start with blessing the Advent Wreath:

<u>Pray</u>: Dear Jesus, as we light the candle on this Advent wreath, may the light of your presence bring joy to our hearts. Bless our family and our friends, and be with all who are in need this holiday season. Amen.

(Sprinkle some holy water over the wreath if you have it.)

First Week of Advent: December 1, 2024

Light the first purple candle.

<u>Pray:</u> Dear Jesus, you are the hope in our messy world. This Advent, help us slow down, listen to your voice, and focus on what's really important. We place our hope in you as we prepare our hearts to celebrate your birth on Christmas. Amen.



If you are participating in our "Be an Angel" Christmas program, next weekend, December 7th and 8th, will be your LAST OPPORTUNITY to return your angel gifts or gift cards.

If you have not had an opportunity to participate, this will be the last week Angels will be available. Remember to indicate the amount of the gift card on the envelope or on the card itself with a marker.

Our Outreach committee will be sorting the gifts by Sunday, December 8th.

Unfortunately, gifts that come in after December 8th may not go to the people in need of them.

Thank you for understanding our need to have all Angel items returned by Sunday, December 8th, so that they can be distributed during that week.

Please be mindful of the following instructions for ease of distribution:

We are requesting gift cards from these local stores (Kohl's, Target, Wal-Mart) to enable our families to purchase for themselves and their children the items they need.

We are also requesting supermarket gift cards to enable each household to have a special holiday meal.

(Reminder: gift cards need to be activated at the register)

Sometimes Angels get separated from the actual gift card when they are returned. We ask that you, in permanent marker, mark the amount of each gift card purchased directly on the gift card.

This can be done on the top right of the front or back of the card. This would be very helpful in eliminating the time-consuming job of calling for amounts on cards of unknown amounts.

Thank you in advance for your help in this matter.

Some Angels are coded (orange, purple, green, red) for the agencies we reach out to each year (Mercy Haven, Talbot House, Pronto, Olsen's Rest Home). If you choose one of these angels, attach the Angel on top of the item with tape and return it to the Atrium by Sunday, December 8th.

When you purchase a gift card, please put the gift amount on the gift card.

This information is needed so parish outreach can distribute the cards equally. <u>Gift cards do not need to be wrapped.</u>

Please put the gift card in an envelope and place it in the GIFT BOX on the table near our Angel signs.

Please do not wrap gift items.

This makes it easier on sorting day to count and distribute to the agencies.

Thank you in advance for your understanding.

Gifts and gift cards can be returned until next weekend at Mass or dropped off during the week at the Parish Office.

<u>PLEASE NOTE: Sunday, December 8th, is the last day</u> to return gifts and gift cards.

This year 39 beautiful baskets were distributed to our families in need.


We are so grateful for the volunteers who shopped and created these one-of-a-kind baskets!

The families who received baskets were overwhelmed


by the generosity of our parish community.

Practice of Faith

(Excerpt from "At Home with the Word 2024")



The Church provides the season of Advent as a time to prepare for the coming of Christ. Mark the days through Advent with an Advent calendar, Advent wreath, and the daily reading of seasonal stories.

Build a home library of books focused on this season. Wrap the books and place in a basket near the Advent wreath. Unwrap and read one weekly.



The Jesse tree is an Advent custom that helps us connect the festive practice of decorating Christmas trees to the ancestors leading to Jesus' birth. Start with a bare branch or tree and hang one ornament representing an individual figure from the ancestry of Jesus each day.

Celebrate the optional Memorial of St. Nicholas on December 6. St. Nicholas was the bishop of fourth-century Myra (moderen day Turkey) and, according to legend, he anonymously offered generous help to those in need. One story says he dropped bags of gold down the chimneys of poor families, widows, and orphans. Surprise family members with a stocking filled with little gifts. Plan an anonymous gift for a person or agency in need.

Winter Windfall

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine, and this fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing, so we will continue as we have done for the past few years with our quarterly drawing.



- \$10 per ticket
- Tickets are available for purchase through December, January and February.
- Drawing will be held February 28.

This is the pay scale which will be offered:

- * 1 Prize @ \$250
- * 2 Prizes @ \$100
- * 10 Prizes @ \$50
- * 15 Prizes @ \$25



- This formula was based upon selling 250 tickets @ \$10 each. If more than 250 tickets are sold, the number of prizes will be increased.
