



PARISH LIFE



Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

This article was inspired by the celebration of the feast of St. John Vianney which took place this past Monday, August 4. Ideally, this would have been more appropriate had I written it last weekend, but the idea only came to me now.

St. John was born in France in 1786. He grew up in the midst of the French Revolution. During that time, Catholicism needed to be practiced in secrecy. In his childhood, John viewed the work of priests and nuns as heroic work in the midst of political turmoil. He desired to be a priest and eventually began his studies. He was never a good student (something that I can relate to), but persevered and was eventually ordained. He was sent to a parish in a small town called Ars. The Latin word for a parish priest is "curate," and the French translation is "cure'." That is why he is known as the Cure' of Ars: the parish priest of the town of Ars. He is considered the patron saint of priests and parish life. His parish struggled in living out their Catholic faith, and it took great effort for him to awaken in his people a desire to grow and be faithful to God. St. John is remembered for having spent countless hours hearing confessions. His devoted service to one small parish became the source of many to embrace and grow in their faith.

Our Catholic faith is universal. The Eucharist is the Body of Christ no matter where it is received. But the way in which the faith is lived out on a daily basis is a very local experience. The parish becomes that place where one grows in and experiences their faith in prayer and action. The leadership of a parish plays an important role in how the various dimensions of faith are experienced. But the life and energy of a parish go beyond any one person. There is a relationship that develops between a pastor and the people of the parish. It takes time for that harmony to evolve, but it is mutually beneficial when it happens.

It is a beautiful thing to see how this parish community becomes a source of life for so many. There are some for whom their contact is infrequent or perhaps casual. But for many, Holy Cross has become a significant part of their life. There are times when life defining moments take place here such as a baptism, marriage, or the funeral for a loved one. But it is often in the more ordinary events of weekly Mass or participating in a ministry or activity that the bonds and connections grow deeper. We benefit in sharing life with one another. The fabric of who we are grows ever stronger.

On Monday evening there was a social gathering for priests hosted by the pastor of Cure' of Ars parish in Merrick. It was an occasion to give pause and reflect upon the precious gift of priesthood that we share in. Most assuredly, the variety of priests present oversee their parishes in different ways. But yet, we all recognize the privilege we share in. To be in a position to guide the faith journey of another is not to be taken lightly. Thank you for the openness, trust and support you show me. Together we continue to grow in celebrating our faith in this little corner of the kingdom that we call Holy Cross.




Thank you to everyone who donated diapers and wipes for our Outreach family. The response was amazing! We are fully stocked with diapers and wipes for a while.

When Your Journey Continues

This group is NOT for newly bereaved. Our next newly bereaved support group will begin in November.

If you are struggling and do not feel you have made much progress, please consider joining the support group. The group will focus on helping you understand the grief process and your own individual reaction to loss. By learning coping strategies, you will be able to manage your grief better and begin the critical process of adjusting to living in a world without the deceased. The group is not therapy but simply a discussion group where you will meet other people who have also suffered a loss. Through sharing life experiences, you can learn from one another which will help in your grief journey.

Focus on Religious Freedom Catholics for Freedom of Religion <u>cffor.org</u>

Religious Freedom in the Workplace Protected by New Federal Guidelines

Clinton Administration's 1997 Guidelines Similar to Trump Administration Guidelines

The free expression of religious beliefs is assured by the First Amendment and includes spoken expression, religious apparel, jewelry and icons as well as religious items displayed. The new guidelines issued July 28, 2025 by the Federal Office of Personnel Management (OPM) are meant to insure that the federal government is not only in compliance with Constitutional religious freedom, but is welcoming to religious expression by Americans of all faiths in its workspaces.

In its Memorandum the OPM points out that our nation was founded with religious freedom for all and Americans are entitled to express their faith openly in their daily lives. The Memorandum also refers to Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act and its protection from discrimination in hiring because of a candidate's religion. Title VII also gives protection for many aspects of religious expression including discussions about religion, display and use of items such as Bibles, artwork, crosses and mezuzahs on employees' desks, on their person, and in their assigned workspaces. Also, groups of employees may come together in prayer as long as it is done outside the regular work time.

The Memorandum calls for ongoing attention to the religious freedom of employees in the federal workplace to reflect the Constitutional religious liberty of all Americans.


