

### Weekly Reflection by Fr. Michael

I am writing this column on Sunday evening. I'm still immersed in the "high" that was created by our Founders' Day celebration. The title of this article is taken from the story of the Widow of Nain that is found in Luke's gospel. Miraculously, Jesus was able to raise from the dead the widow's only son. For those who witnessed that event, they came to the conclusion that "God has visited his people." Yes, we believe that God is always present, but there are moments when his presence is felt in a deeply personal and unmistakable way.

Through the years I have been blessed to share in some rich and transformative moments of prayer. When I was in my 30s, I participated in several men's retreats in New Mexico that were life defining. More recently, the Religious Education Congress in California provided prayerful settings that awakened the soul. I have had times in my life when I concluded that "God visited his people," and I was part of it. It is profound and humbling when we experience the Spirit of God surrounding us in an unmistakable way. My role as a priest and pastor is not simply to have these moments for my own enrichment, but rather to energize me to help bring about these kinds of moments for the people to whom I minister. I believe we had one of the moments here last weekend as we honored our founding parishioners. In particular, it was at the 5:00 Mass that the Spirit abounded and there was life in abundance.

There were parts of the celebration that were nostalgic. It brought together a multitude of parishioners. Some folks who normally attend one of the Sunday Masses came to the 5:00 instead. Some folks who ordinarily would not be at Mass because of health or mobility issues arranged to be present. Some folks even drove in from out of town. For founding parishioners, it was a glorious reunion. But for those of us who were not founding parishioners, it was still inspirational. There were some familiar faces who I never knew were founding parishioners. It was a great celebration. These were the people who helped to create much of what we still enjoy today. There is great value in stopping to recognize bonds that have been made as well as progress through the years.

This is not about what I or any one individual did. It was a matter of creating a space and time for the Spirit to come to life. When the Spirit is allowed to flow, amazing things can happen. An obstacle to the Spirit is when we are convinced we have the definitive plan. There are times when the spiritual contributions of many come together in a way that takes on life in abundance. There will always be heartache and brokenness in life that can derail us. As a people who believe in the gift of the resurrection, we don't surrender to despair but rather seek life and hope where it can be found. While all the woes of the world are not suddenly removed, we can have rich experiences that nourish and empower us to keep moving forward.

Thank you to all who were part of last weekend's festivities. I pray that it was a rich blessing that renewed the spirit of many. For those who are observant, this is not the first time I have used this as a title. There have been other joyful and life-giving moments when I was inspired to write such a message. How blessed we are to share in this faith community.

### Liturgical Minister Training - Fall 2025

The Diocese of Rockville Centre will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

**Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion:** Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

A Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.

You may not take EMHC Part A and the Lector Workshop on the same day.



Important information was shared about preparing for emergency situations like hurricanes and power outages, and participants received an emergency preparedness backpack.











