Delirium Tremens 8.5%

330ml 23

(8.5%) Ghent, Belgium

A rounded slightly malty pale blond with a long-lasting and dry bitter pleasant aftertaste. Unique taste resulting from the use of 3 different kinds of yeast. Consistently one of the world's most awarded beers.

Rodenbach Grand Cru 6.0%

330ml 22

(6.0%) Roeselare, Belgium

Highly respected and consistently winning awards, an extremely pungent aroma of rich grapey fruit. Slightly sweet but extremely acidic and very fruity.

La Trappe Dubbel 7.0%

330ml 21

(7.0%) Abdij van Koningshoeven, Netherlands

Made by monks, this Trappist beer has a deep brown colour & beige froth. Gentle caramel aromas & a rich malty flavour with a touch of sweetness. Smooth drinking yet has some real body & intense flavour.

Starts off with some citrus notes, followed by a refreshing touch, pleasantly spiced to give it great brightness. Golden beer with a light hoppy taste, that for 40 years has conquered the hearts of beer lovers the world over.

La Trappe Blond

(330ml 6.5%) Abdij van Koningshoeven, Netherlands

Fresh aromas and a balanced, slightly sweet, and lightly bitter taste. Key notes include hints of banana, clove, apricot, caramel, and peach.

Chimay Green

(330ml 10.0%) Scourmont Abbey, Belgium

Celebrating 150 years of brewing some of the most recognisable Trappist beers in the world. The monks at Scourmont Abbey have released this limited edition Strong Blonde ale. Get it while it lasts

Westvleteren Blonde

56

(330ml 5.8%) St Sixtus Abbey, Belgium

The monks brew this for themselves and not much ever leaves the abbey. Yes, the price is correct and yes, it's just a small 330ml bottle. Not much of this kicking about (south of the equator) so if you want it, be quick.

Amber, Golden, & Pale

Pauwel Kwak Amber

24

(330ml 8.4%) Buggenhout, Belgium

Toffee and sweet caramel, a good malty backbone, hints of that honey, clove, cinnamon, apple, a little raisin and plum. Comes in possibly the coolest beer glass ever.

Duvel Tripel Hop Cashmere

26

(330ml 9.5%) Breendonk, Belgium

This highly sought-after newcomer to the hop world enriches the typical Duvel flavour palette with hints of citrus, peach, melon, and tropical coconut.

Orval Trappist Ale

28

(330ml 6.2%) Notre Dame d'Orval, Belgium

The monks at Orval makes only one beer for the general public. It has an intensely aromatic character. Between the first and second fermentations there is also an additional dry-hopping process giving this beer its pronounced hoppy aroma and extra dry taste. Highly sought after ale favoured by connoisseurs.

Tripel Karmeliet

23

(330ml 8.4%) Buggenhout, Belgium

The famous 3 grain tripel. Refined and complex golden-to-bronze brew with a creamy head. Aroma has hints of vanilla mixed with citrus and banana.

Westmalle Tripel

24

(330ml 9.5%) Abdij van Onze Lieve Vrouw, Belgium

In 1936 the Trappist monks of Westmalle created the world's first Tripel. Strong, blond, fruity, and malty with rich foam and a long aftertaste. This is the mother of all tripels!

Yes, the price is correct and yes, it's just a small 330ml bottle. IYKYK

Saison, Sour & Fruit Beer

Boon Oude Geuze

28

(375ml 7.0%) *Lambeek, Belgium*

Brewed in the cold months between October & April, aged in oak casks for 1, 2 or 3 years and then blended. It is unfiltered, unpasteurised and unsweetened, continues to referment in the bottle and will age well for upto 20 years.

De La Senne Brett Saison

22

(330ml 5.3%) *Brussels, Belgium*

A spelt Saison, dry-hopped and fermented with added *Brettanomyces*. A very persistent creamy fine foam. Aromatic and fruity with notes of pineapple, quince, apricot, and gooseberry. A 'funky' touch, typical of *Brettanomyces*, completes the picture.

Lindemans Tarot d'or

21

(250ml 8.0%) *Vlezenbeek, Belgium*

Full-bodied and juicy, with notes of tropical fruits such as mango, lime and honeydew melon; a well-balanced tartness and a pleasant, easy finish. A beer more for a cocktail lover than a beer connoisseur.

Lindemans Pêcheresse

18

(250ml 2.5%) *Vlezenbeek, Belgium*

Golden-blond, slightly cloudy peach lambic beer. A vibrant, crisp balance of sweet, ripe peach flavours and a gentle, dry tartness often found in traditional lambic. Very low alcohol and quite sweet. Tastes like a peach Fanta.

Liefmans Kriek Brut

21

(330ml 6.0%) *Oudenaarde, Belgium*

A rich, mixed-fermentation Belgian Oud Bruin blend matured for 18 months. Infused with loads of real cherries, a distinct dry, tart-sweet profile with elegant, velvety complexities.

Rodenbach Alexander

23

(330ml 5.6%) *Roeselare, Belgium*

This extraordinary sour beer has a unique, balanced and complex finish with subtle fruit and wood notes. Made using 1/3 young beer & 2/3 beer matured in oak foeders for 2 years steeped with the juice of noorderkriek cherries.

Delirium Red

23

(330ml 8.0%) *Ghent, Belgium*

Famous for their 'Tremens' beer. This is their fruity red version – flavoured with cherry & elderberry. Finally back in Australia after a long absence, it just keeps selling out.

Westmalle Dubbel

22

(330ml 7.0%) *Abdij van Onze Lieve Vrouw, Belgium*

Westmalle invented this style of beer, this is that invention. Dark red-brown with a rich, complex taste. Touches of caramel, malt and fruity esters reminiscent of ripe banana.

Gouden Carolus Whisky Infused

29

(330ml 11.7%) *Mechelen, Belgium*

Cuvee van de Keizer Imperial Dark infused with Gouden Carolus single malt whisky distilled from batches of Gouden Carolus Tripel. The result is a unique beer: powerful and full-bodied, with touches of vanilla, oak and chocolate.

Chimay Blue

26

(330ml 9.0%) *Scourmont Abbey, Belgium*

Top-fermented Trappist beer. Fragrance of fresh yeast with a light, flowery rosy touch is especially pleasant. Its flavour accentuates the pleasant sensations perceived in the aroma, while revealing a light touch of roasted malt.

St Bernadus Abt 12

26

(330ml 10.0%) *Watoll, Belgium*

Brewed in the classic Quadrupel style of Belgium's best abbey ales. Dark with a fruity aroma, full of complex flavours and a long bittersweet finish with a hoppy bite. Worldwide seen as one of the best beers in the world. Very balanced, with a full-bodied taste and a perfect equilibrium between malty, bitter, and sweet.

Westvleteren 12

(330ml 10.2%) *St Sixtus Abbey, Belgium*

World famous and famously difficult to source. If you know it, you know it and you'll know why it has this price tag.

Struise Pannepot 2024

29

(330ml 10.0%) *Oostvleteren, Belgium*

Often called an Old Fisherman's Ale. A rich, dark vintage ale delivering a complex flavour profile featuring heavy notes of plum, fig, raisins, and dark chocolate.

De Molen 'Kandij & Kaneel' Quadrupel

28

(330ml 10.5%) *Bodegraven, Netherlands*

Refined & warming. Brewed with candied sugar (kandij) and cinnamon, it delivers a complex and sweet profile balancing rich malt sweetness with a dry finish.

Uiltje Imperial March

26

(330ml Can 9.2%) *Haarlem, Netherlands*

Imperial Stout with a rich, heavy, and malt-forward profile. A decadent dark winter warmer packed with deep roasted flavours, a perfect slow-sipping companion for a chilly evening.

Barley Wine

Uiltje Royal Oak

28

(330ml Can 11.0%) Haarlem, Netherlands

French-oaked barleywine. Bold beer with a rich profile of dark caramel, toffee, dried fruits (figs, raisins), and toasted chestnuts. The French oak adds subtle vanilla, wood, and tannin complexities to the sweet malt base.

Using a secret blend of delicious dessert pears, this carefully-crafted Earthen Pear cider displays the fragrance of pear and mixed fruits as well as hints of floral notes.

Trattore West Country Style Cider

(330ml 5.8%) Gippsland, Victoria

A blend of Gippsland-grown heritage apples used to make an English-style cider with earthy aroma, a rich amber colour and a tart apple flavour with a natural firm tannic structure and a mouth-filling texture.

Schipper Bitter

12

(30%) Muiden, North Holland, Netherlands

Originally created for sailing enthusiasts in the historic harbor town of Muiden (close to Amsterdam), it evolved from a local novelty into a nationally recognised "heart-strengthening" digestif. Notes of anise, mint, cinnamon, and orange zest.

Schrobbeler Kruidenlikeur

11

(21.5%) Tilburg, North Brabant, Netherlands

Amber coloured caramel liqueur with 43 different herbs. A 'milder' drink created in 1973 to enjoy during the Brabant carnival.

Boomsma Cloosterlikeur

12

(30%) Leeuwarden, Friesland, Netherlands

Based on Brother Jacob's 15th century medicinal recipe using wild foraged botanicals to produce this vivid green liqueur with an earthy sweet profile.

Juttertje kruidenbitter

12

(30%) Texel, North Holland, Netherlands

From Holland's OG holiday island. In 1970 a man named Cor took over an old Advokaat distillery and discovered a very old notebook. The recipe for this drink using local herbs and enjoyed by beachcombers (juttertje in Dutch) was in it and Cor re-created it to much celebration. Notes of cinnamon, anise & orange peel

Coebergh Wilde Bessen Likeur

11

(20%) Amsterdam, North Holland, Netherlands

Traditional Dutch berry liqueur using Jenever as a base and adding ripe wild black berries and herbal extracts for a sweet-tart, smooth flavour.

Pisang Ambon Banana Liqueur

10

(17%) Amsterdam, North Holland, Netherlands

"Pisang" translates to banana in Indonesian, while "Ambon" refers to the Maluku island of Ambon, reflecting Dutch colonial heritage and Indonesian recipe used to create this sweet banana liqueur with subtle spice notes. Fuck knows why it is bright green – it just is and always has been since its creation in 1948.

Agwa de Bolivia, Coca Leaf Liqueur

10

(30%) Amsterdam, North Holland, Netherlands

Made from real Bolivian coca leaves and other botanicals including guarana, ginseng, mint & green tea. Bales of coca leaves are shipped under armed guard to the Netherlands where the active narcotic compounds (cocaine alkaloids) are unfortunately removed in a high-security lab, making the drink legal. Boo ☹️

Ponche Caribe Pistachio Cream Liqueur

10

(10%) Curaçao, Dutch Caribbean

A creamy, rum and brandy based cream liqueur with rich pistachio nutty flavour. Like Bailey's but with a distinct Caribbean flavour profile (& nuts). It's a dessert.

Salmari Premium Salmiak Liquor

12

(25%) Espoo, Finland

Not Dutch, but Finnish, the Finns love salty liquorice even more than us and this intense liquor is the saltiest. This has become a staple of a Dutch night out.

Jenever / Genever

Genever is the traditional, juniper-flavoured national liquor of the Netherlands, often described as a whiskey/gin hybrid. It is made from a base of malted grains (like corn, rye, and wheat) distilled into a rich malt wine, then infused with juniper and other herbs

Bols Jonge Jenever 11

(35%) Amsterdam, North Holland, Netherlands

Clean & crisp, smooth profile of soft juniper, subtle malt wine, and gentle herbs.

Bols Zeer Oude Genever 13

(35%) Amsterdam, North Holland, Netherlands

The term "zeer oude genever" (very old genever) does not refer to the actual age of the liquor in years. Instead, it describes a traditional old-style recipe. This particular one being from 1820 with notes of malt wine, juniper, and licorice.

Bols Corenwyn 14

(38%) Amsterdam, North Holland, Netherlands

Barrel-aged genever made with over 51% malt wine, featuring rich notes of malt, oak, and juniper. Its history dates back to the founding of Lucas Bols 1575

Ketel One Jenever 11

(35%) Schiedam, South Holland, Netherlands

Classic young grain jenever with tasting notes of fresh pear, apple pie pastry, and a clean, lightly sweet, and mellow finish.

Blankenheym Genever 13

(38%) Schiedam, South Holland, Netherlands

Notes of toasted grain, sweet caramel, and a double infusion of juniper berries

Bokma Oude Friesche Graangenever 12

(38%) Leeuwarden, Friesland, Netherlands

Aromas of green juniper and clove, a palate of soft grains and cinnamon

Bokma Jonge Graangenever 11

(35%) Leeuwarden, Friesland, Netherlands

Known for being the first "young" jenever made using 100% grain neutral spirits. Light juniper and cereal notes

A short history lesson: Why is Jenever not the same as Gin?

During the Eighty Years' War (1568–1648) and the Thirty Years' War (1618–1648), English soldiers fought alongside the Dutch. They noticed Dutch troops taking bracing swigs of *jenever* before entering battle to steady their nerves. The English dubbed this liquid bravery "**Dutch Courage**". They fell in love with the drink, slurred the name down from *jenever* to "gin", and brought a powerful craving for it back home to Britain.

When English distillers tried to cash in on this new trend, they ran into major roadblocks:

- **Lack of Malt Expertise:** The Dutch were masters at fermenting and gently distilling grain into a smooth, flavourful "malt wine". English distillers didn't have this know-how.
- **Inferior Stills:** English equipment produced a harsh, foul-tasting, industrial base spirit.
- **The Juniper Over-Correction:** Because their base spirit tasted so terrible, English distillers dumped massive amounts of juniper berries & spices, into the liquid to mask the burn.

These shortcuts completely bypassed the traditional whiskey-like profile of genever. Instead, it created an entirely new category: a completely neutral spirit sharply dominant in botanical flavour.

The English spirit finally cleaned up its act in the 19th century with the invention of the column still. This technology allowed distillers to create a genuinely pure, smooth neutral alcohol. Modern gin follows these methods and is delicious. We have loads of them, see the next page for our range...
