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MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 15, 2016 REGULAR BOARD MEETING

The annual "CHRISTMAS LUNCHEON" was held for the Authority Board, guests and staff at noon.

Authority Board Meeting

1:35 P.M.

CALL TO ORDER/ ROLL CALL: Chairman Stoneburner called the meeting to order at 1:35 P.M. Commissioners present were Jimmy Stoneburner, Wes Kahler, Lysanne Harma and Paul Dykstra. None absent. Also present were Executive Director Rich Pierson, Executive Assistant Anne Richmond, and Engineer Tom Wheat.

REVIEW AND SET THE AGENDA: Kahler made the motion to accept the Agenda as presented. Motion was seconded by Dykstra. **Motion carried; all ayes.**

MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER 30, 2016 REGULAR MEETING: A motion was made by Harma and seconded by Dykstra to accept the regular meeting minutes of November 30, 2016. Motion carried; all ayes.

HEAR THOSE PRESENT (Non-Agenda Items): None Present.

CORRESPONDENCE:

David Worthington-DEQ SAW Email Chain on Budget Amendment + Extension Pierson emailed a summary of the discussion that he had with the DEQ on December 9, 2016 regarding the Authority's request for our 3rd SAW Budget amendment and an extension. Our request will be reviewed at a higher level within the next week or two.

Piotrowicz-37th Street New Connection Grinder Pump Tap May Not Be Feasible Mr. Piotrowicz requested the cost to connect the new house that he is constructing on 37th Street to sewer. Since the 12" pipeline is underwater in front of Mr. Piotrowicz's property, the degree of difficulty for GLSWA to excavate, dewater, and possibly cut the road in an effort to "tap" the pipeline for his connection may be prohibitive. Pierson quoted a total of \$10,850 for a grinder installation / public sewer connection to Mr. Piotrowicz's property with \$5,850 as the "Connection Fee" (based on 200 feet) plus \$5,000 installation but advised Mr. Piotrowicz that GLSWA would need to do a test dig beforehand to see if it is feasible.

Tom Wheat – M96 Interceptor Agreement for Interceptor/Trunk Sewer Pierson and Wheat discussed the potential timing of the repairs needed under M96 where Augusta's flow combines with Gull Lake flow, flows under M96 in Galesburg. and flows through Galesburg, Comstock, and Kalamazoo Townships to the Kalamazoo Regional Wastewater Facility. In Wheat's opinion, the scaling within the pipe is not necessarily corrosion and the pipe is likely to last for a number of years. Also, the ductile iron pipe is within a steel casing which should contain the flow should the ductile iron be compromised. The Wastewater Contract with Kalamazoo is scheduled to be negotiated in 2017, and it is highly likely that the Operations. Maintenance and Repair/Replacement/Rehab of all inter-municipal pipes will be addressed within that document. Therefore, Pierson and Wheat are recommending "no action" on this pipe at this time, pending the agreement with Kalamazoo moves forward during 2017. Should this pipe not be addressed within the proposed agreement, then in 2018 GLSWA should resolve the issues with our own intermunicipal agreement.

Alison Wood-MI Water Assoc Pierson to Present at Local Conference Pierson has agreed to give a presentation on our PICA work at the MWEA/MI AWWA Infrastructure Funding Seminar on Wednesday, February 8, 2017 held at the Lansing Conference Center in conjunction with Joint Expo & Operators Day.

Graham/Larsen-Woodlawn Private Building Sewer Crosses Neighbor's Property The 4" building sewer from 15968 Woodlawn (Lots 2 + 3 – Little Slam Interests, LLC) crosses diagonally over lots 4 + 5 (J Cooper vacant property). Pierson brokered a plan for the pipe to be rerouted in 2017 contingent upon receiving Mr. Cooper's financial commitment and an easement from the new buyers, Del Eldridge and Beth Stewart. The Authority will then plan to coordinate with the new buyer's plumber to install a new pipe for Mrs. Larsen when the new buyers build their home in 2017.

Arbor Terrace Apartments Grease and Syringe Problem GLSWA notified Arbor Terrace of excessive grease build-up and a number of syringes that had to be manually removed from our public pumping station on their complex and informed them that this abuse of the public sewer system must stop immediately. We provided flyers to assist with education of their tenants.

Dando-1680 N 37th St Odor Complaint Response GLSWA received an odor complaint for both inside and outside the residence at 1680 N 37th St. Aaron Grogg investigated and told the homeowner that we could put a charcoal filter on his vent stacks to solve the outdoor odor issue. *Pierson will email the homeowner a letter of the homeowner obligation to maintain the charcoal filter after it is installed.* The homeowner's basement vent is being vented with an Oatey Vent. Grogg explained how this vent works to the homeowner. The homeowner is going to change the Oatey Vent to address the inside odor issue.

Shurmur-12410 N Sh Lk Dr Proposed Grinder Pump Connection Pierson provided a quote of \$14,291 for a grinder pump sewer connection to 12410 N. Sherman Lake Drive consisting of a Connection Fee of \$10,264 and an estimated installation cost of \$4,027. Pierson informed Ms. Shurmer that while financing is not currently available, the Authority Board is considering offering partial financing of the Connection Fee.

Zeithammel-2877 N 37th St

Proposed Grinder Pump Connection
Pierson provided a quote of \$12,000 +/- for a grinder pump sewer connection to 2877
N. 37th Street consisting of a Connection Fee of \$9,125 and an estimated installation cost of \$3000. Pierson informed Ms. Zeithammel that while financing is not currently available, the Authority Board is considering offering partial financing of the Connection Fee.

NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTS UPDATE

Zoetis / MDEQ (PPP) Update Budget Update
Pierson informed the Board that Zoetis Flow is currently below budget for the year
and flow from PPP has been higher than budgeted.

Connection Fee Financing Request Legal Counsel to Draft Resolution The Board discussed financing of connection fees. Dykstra made the motion to authorize the Authority attorney to draft a resolution to finance 50% of a Connection Fee of \$5000 or more for 5 years at an interest rate of 5%. Motion was seconded by Harma. Motion carried; 3 ayes; 1 absent (Chairman Stoneburner had stepped out of the meeting from 2:00 to 2:05).

Rosenberger-Havens Condos Discussion on Settlement of Outstanding Issues Mr. Rosenberger has not paid GLSWA \$8,704 in engineering inspection costs for sewer pipeline installations for the Havens of Richland development from 2008 - 2010. In addition, GLSWA incurred an estimated cost of \$3,750 to re-install frames/covers and clean gravel and dirt in the pipeline. Pierson discussed settlement

of these issues with the Board. Pierson to review a proposed settlement with Mr. Rosenberger.

Policy on Donut Gasket Abandonment + Re-use of 4" Pipes Update We are testing the guidelines of the proposed policy and will finalize this in January.
