By its very nature as a pursuit that in large part sets aside brute physicality in favour of thought and deed, motor sport is something of a great leveller in the world of sport, a discipline that ideally remains ignorant of race, colour, creed or indeed gender. In machinery of equal potency, equality should be a given.

The truth, though, is that motor sport has been traditionally seen as something of a "boy's club", an arena in which women have often been marginalised and on occasion actively discouraged from participation.

In 2009, the FIA set out to change that paradigm by launching its Women in Motor Sport Commission, a body tasked with creating "a sports culture that facilities and values the participation of women in all aspects of motor sport".

In the past decade, the Commission has been involved in a wide variety of projects in every area of motor sport activity, developing programmes to advance female participation on and off the track, through initiatives to raise awareness of the huge diversity of industry roles available to women in racing, rally, teams, events and race support, media, medical support and partnerships.

This booklet aims to inspire and encourage girls and young women to consider the opportunities both on and off the track, and to promote gender equality in motor sport to the general public. It describes the roles and careers of 22 great women who will be delighted to share their experience with you and support you in becoming one more woman in motor sport!



I used to accompany my dad to the races in Circuit de Barcelona Catalunya when I was a child, and when I turned 14 I started helping the organiser as a "runner", distributing all the official documents generated by the race director, the stewards and the timekeepers between the event's senior officials and teams and notifying the stewards' decisions and penalties to the competitors. When I turned 16, I took the ASN's course as a track marshal and passed the exam. For the next few years I combined my role as a runner with being secretary of the stewards, which gave me a great background in motor sport procedures and paperwork.

► What does your life look like now?

Due to my working commitments I'm based between Barcelona and the United States. My daily routine consists in working with the teams and officials on different aspects of the sport, clarifying sporting regulations and sporting procedures, and evaluating the course of the championships and their challenges. During the race weekends I am in control of practice and race development, as well as safety, the starting procedures and the use of the safety car. I've always loved working with young drivers (the future F1 stars), as it gives me the chance to be part of their development in the sport, creating a special bond that lasts for years.

➤ Your advice for the next generation

I would say that motor sport is a good option for women. 
