### American Lutheran Church December Council Meeting December 11, 2022

President Sue Hoey called the meeting to order both in person and electronically on Zoom at 6:34 pm. Present were Sue Hoey, Beth Stanek, Barb Hayek, Cindy Gosse, Shirley Bergman, and Sheila Collins. Joining on Zoom was Mitchell Hayek. Christa Leach was absent.

Sue led devotions from Christ in Our Home.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – The November transfer of \$3,776.69 from checking to the General Savings and Emergency Fund was not made until December 2 so the balance in the checking account is actually \$13,665.71. Barb Hayek made a motion to transfer \$3,665.71 to the General Savings and Emergency Fund this month. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion carried. Shirley Bergman made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Second by Sheila Collins. Motion carried.

<u>Secretary's Report</u> – Cindy Gosse made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 14, 2022 council meeting as written. Second by Barb Hayek. Motion carried.

Committee Reports (See full reports in binder outside Secretary's office).

<u>Abundant Life</u> – No report.

<u>Hospitality</u> – Sign-up sheets for fellowship hosts are posted on the bulletin board outside the fireside room. <u>Memorial</u> – The committee met on November 29, 2022. There is \$1,228.88 of undesignated funds in the account. The committee suggests possible use of these funds could include at least one wireless microphone or community needs. The council felt the undesignated funds should be used for ALC needs.

Parish Ed – The Children's Christmas Program is December 18, 2022.

President's – ALC and ZLC agree to alternate Lenten services like last year.

<u>Property</u> – Church: The nativity scene has been set up and worship times changed on the outside sign. One bank of ceiling lights have been replaced with LED bulbs in Pastor's study. A new rebate program to be offered by MidAmerican Energy in 2023 will be reviewed.

Parsonage: The parsonage continues to be checked on and maintained twice a month. Mike Mostek will do snow removal in exchange for storing a car in the detached garage.

Scholarship - No report.

Technology - Council approved outsourcing technology problems when necessary. Cindy Gosse will talk to

Heartland Technology about which of their current internet packages is best for our church. Cindy will move forward on the previously approved computer purchases. Mike Waring is not using the laptop missing the number keypad for livestreaming (as stated in the October minutes). He has purchased a laptop sufficient to do the job at his own expense.

<u>Worship and Music</u> – The youth and volunteers from the congregation decorated the church for Christmas on November 20, 2022. Hymns have been chosen through January 15. Jessica Saunders has volunteered to sing at the Christmas Eve service. Caroling with First Presbyterian Church will take place on the afternoon of December 18.

Youth – The Youth made thank-you bags for the volunteers in the church. These were very much appreciated.

### **New Business**

Barb Hayek made a motion to give the Thanksgiving offering to the Independence Area Food Pantry and split the Christmas offering between LSI and EWALU. Second by Cindy Gosse. Motion carried.

The Budget Hearing will be January 8, 2022 after worship (11:00 am). The Annual Meeting will be January 15, 2022 with an inclement weather date of January 22, 2022.

### **Old Business**

The Ministry Site Profile from the Call Committee asks for the goals of the congregation from the Council's perspective. These goals include:

1. Increase worship involvement and youth participation

2. Empower committees

3. Encourage inactive members to reengage

4. Property improvements as needed (new or repaired roof when necessary)

The Ministry Site Profile's request for a dollar amount for Pastor's salary was modified to say commensurate with Synod Guidelines for years of experience.

Pulpit supply continues to be worked on.

A budget workshop will be held following the adjournment of this council meeting.

### **2022 ALC LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF PROJECTS**

The ladies of American Lutheran Church once again spearheaded projects for Lutheran World Relief in 2022. The following projects were generously supported by members of ALC:

- Spring Ingathering 41 quilts and 45 personal care kits
- Fall Ingathering 39 school kits

The totals for 2022 for the Northeast Iowa Synod are: 8,852 quilts, 4,837 school kits, 3,147 personal care kits, 1,558 baby care kits, 199 fabric kits and 65 blankets. These are amazing totals! The 2023 Spring Ingathering will be April 15<sup>th</sup> and the Fall Ingathering will be October 14<sup>th</sup>. Redeemer Lutheran, Waverly, will be the host for both. We will once again be delivering our finished quilts on April 15<sup>th</sup> along with personal care kits. ALC has used Lent as the time to collect items needed for these. Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 22<sup>nd</sup>. Personal care kits include the following items: **1 light-weight bath size towel**, **2 bath-size bars of soap**, **1 adult toothbrush**, **1 sturdy comb and 1 metal fingernail clippers.** As you shop during the next few weeks, you may want to consider purchasing these items. A suggestion would be that you provide items for one personal care kit. A collection point will be established during the Lenten season. Thank you for your continued support in carrying out the mission of ALC to nourish the world by faithfully sharing the gifts Jesus Christ has given us.

**Peanut Butter Donations for Jesup School**: Families are so appreciative of the peanut butter donations from local churches. Peanut butter is packed monthly in 50 backpacks. 26 families benefit weekly from this program. **Please leave donations in the shopping cart in the narthex.** 

**EPIC SCHOLARSHIP:** ALC is once again participating in the Educational Partners in Covenant (EPIC) Scholarship Program for the 2023-2024 school year.
