In this Lenten season, our special

Lenten offerings will go to three places-- the Buchanan County Food Pantry, Habitat for Humanity, and the Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) Program. With this in mind, I wanted to tell you a bit more about the YAGM program.

Young Adults in Global Mission is a program of the ELCA that began in 1999. Young adults, age 21-29, are invited into a transformative year of international service. They volunteer for the year, serving as the hands and feet of Jesus in a particular setting in the world, and learning from the people among whom they live and serve. They worship at Lutheran churches in the geographic area they serve. They do work involving things like education, faith formation, health, development, human rights, homelessness, addiction recovery.

The Northeastern Iowa Synod has a companion relationship with the Lutheran Church in Hungary, and we are very fortunate to have a YAGM site in Hungary as well. This year, there are 7 YAGMs serving in Central Europe. They begin their year of service in August & September with an in-country orientation, where they learn the languages of Hungarian and Serbian, depending on the specific site where they will serve.

Many of the YAGMs in Central Europe work specifically with the Roma community. The Roma people are a persecuted minority in central Europe, and they have often been taught that they are less valuable than other people. Many of them do not have the resources to have a good quality of life. The YAGMs work to empower the Roma people and to help them know that they are worthy of God's love. They teach them farming techniques and teach them to express themselves through art, and they help provide them with an education.

Many participants in the YAGM program come home to America with a renewed sense of call to serve God. Several of them go on to seminary to become pastors; others become other types of leaders in their faith communities. Young Adults in Global Mission is an amazing program, and we are proud to help support it!

I attended the monthly Pastor's Conference Meeting of the Jubilee Conference

The snow has been frustrating this last month or so; I haven't been able to do as many visits as I'd like, and we have had to cancel many Confirmation classes and the last 2 Be Our Guest meals. Hopefully that doesn't continue!

The Christian Unity service had low attendance, but it went well. I really enjoy working with other churches on efforts like this.

JAM will begin again on Wed, Feb 27 at the United Methodist Church. JAM will be held after school on Feb 27, March 13, 20, and 27, and April 10 and 24. The final program will be on the evening of May 1.

On Tuesday, Feb 19, I will be attending Lutheran Day on the Hill. This is an event put on by LSI where people go to the state capital in Des Moines and talk with congresspeople about supporting LSI's priorities. This year's legislative priorities are 1. Increased funding for Iowa's child welfare services, 2. Accountability and oversight for Iowa's Medicaid Managed Care Organizations, and 3. Support for services that empower refugees. I have never been to Lutheran Day on the Hill before, and I'm excited to go!

On Thursday, Feb 21 I will lead worship at a care facility in Independence.

On Sunday, Feb 24-Tuesday, Feb 26, I will be attending a gathering for Women Rostered Leaders in the Northeastern Iowa Synod. This event will be held at Camp EWALU.

Ash Wednesday will be on March 6. Our worship service will be at 7pm. We will also have Lenten worship at 7pm on March 13, 20, 27, and April 3 & 10. The theme for these services will be "Stories from the Early Church," and the music will be Holden Evening Prayer led by Kristin and Alyssa Hoey.

The Taste of Camp EWALU event will happen this year on Sunday, March 17. We will leave after Sunday school, have lunch at the camp, get a wagon ride, try the low ropes course, and cook our supper over the campfire. All are invited! I have put suggested donation as \$10 per adult and \$5 per child, with the rest of the cost coming from our Luther League Youth Ministry Fund. I have also invited Pastor Mike and the people from Zion Jubilee to come, they are hoping to increase camp participation at their congregation.

Pr. Mark Anderson, Assistant to the Bishop, was able to secure a scholarship for me to go to a Continuing Ed event called "Generosity Transformed," which will be held in Indianapolis on April 29-May 1. Hopefully this will help me get lots of stewardship ideas I can share with the congregation!

New Business:

Jesus is given freely through Holy Communion

I have a good friend who always looks for the "for you" in every sermon. She wants the preacher to move beyond the theological and the academic to the Good News of Jesus Christ that is "for you."

I know, as a preacher, that sometimes I miss that hoped-for goal.

However, there is one place that the "for you" is clearly spoken and received. It is one of the most evangelical moments in my life. The bread and wine are offered without condition. Jesus is given freely and becomes a part of my body as surely as I am a part of his.

I am grateful when congregations make the sacrament of Holy Communion available as often as possible to as many people as possible. *Use of the Means of Grace* is a helpful study guide in assisting congregations to make changes that allow for that to happen.

The congregation that I served experienced significant growth with two general groups of people when we moved to every Sunday communion. The first ones were those, particularly nurses, whose shift rotations sometimes prevented them from receiving the sacrament for months at a time. The other group was divorced Roman Catholics who could no longer commune, but had a deep appreciation for the sacrament and the liturgy of the church.

When congregations make the sacrament available to young children, it is helpful to hold classes for them and their parents. The children benefit from learning together with their parents. The greatest beneficiaries are almost always the parents.

I will always remember one child demonstrating how he held his hands to receive the body of Christ. One hand was placed on top of the other. "I make a manger for Jesus," he explained to me.

That is the Gospel that we celebrate. Once again, I encourage your congregation to seek to expand the availability of Holy Communion to the baptized. You can count on renewal in the congregation and new voices of witness.





Flood Bucket Collection: There is an urgent need for Flood Buckets in Iowa! The Northeastern Iowa Synod of the ELCA Lutheran Church distributes Flood Buckets to people affected by flooding, but during the current flood, they are running low on their inventory! They are calling on people throughout northeast Iowa to donate the supplies needed for flood buckets. Each bucket needs:

- *1 5-gallon bucket with re-sealable lid (nothing that has held chemicals)
- *4 scouring pads
- *One scrub brush
- *7 sponges, assorted sizes (at least 1 hefty sponge for washing mold)
- *18 reusable cleaning towels
- *one 12 oz. bottle of Lysol concentrated disinfectant
- *one 25 oz. of liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn)
- *one 50 oz or two 25 oz bottles of liquid laundry detergent
- *one package of 48-50 clothespins
- *Clothesline, two 50ft or one 100ft
- *Two pairs latex gloves (long heavy duty, like Playtex dishwashing gloves)
- *One pair work gloves
- *28-bag roll of heavy-duty trash bags (30-45 gallon)
- *one 6-9 oz. bottle of insect repellent (pump, drops, or lotion, no aerosol)

Special Lenten Offering: Our special Lenten offering, given at the Wednesday evening Lenten services, and any other offering specifically marked for Lent will be divided between the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) program, Habitat for Humanity, and the Independence Area Food Pantry.
