Dear friends in Christ.

Summer is nearly here. For many years of my life, one of the highlights of my year was spending time at EWALU Bible Camp in the summers.

I fell in love with the place the first time I was a camper, the summer before I was in 5th grade, and I spent as much time as I could there for the next several summers of my life. I had many empowering experiences, like going off a zip line even though I am terrified of heights, learning how to hike at night without a flashlight, and learning how to start



a campfire even in the rain. Summer camp gave me a new way to experience my faith, singing songs around a campfire, exploring the beautiful woods that God had created, and experiencing Bible stories in new ways. I loved going stargazing at camp at night, thinking about the Bible story where God tells Abraham to look at the stars, and that's how many descendants he would have. It always seemed a little easier to believe God's promises when I was looking at a majestic, star-studded night sky.

Camp had plenty of silly times as well. Once when I was a counselor for Confirmation campers, the youngest campers were supposed to spend their evening going to the camp's farm and visiting the animals there. However, it was the first week of camp, and the farmers who lent us their animals for the summer hadn't brought the animals yet, so there WERE no animals on the farm. We still wanted those young campers to have a fun experience, though, so we Confirmation campers and counselors went to the farm before they got there, and we climbed into the animal pens and pretended to be the animals when the young campers got there! It was very silly, and we learned that sometimes living out your faith means doing silly things to help others have a good experience.

There was a counselor, one year, who made up the story that a "rabid goat" wandered the woods to scare campers that got out of their cabins without permission. His story was so over the top that none of his campers were actually scared, but they did think it was silly. Later on, we were doing a craft project, making sock puppets that we would use to put on a puppet show of the Good Samaritan story. I noticed that two of the campers were making a "rabid goat" sock puppet. "This rabid goat is going to play the part of the Good Samaritan! Because NOBODY would expect a rabid goat to be helpful, just like NOBODY in Jesus' time would expect a Samaritan to be helpful." I was impressed that this silly connection helped

the campers understand the Good Samaritan story in a deeper way.

Camp helped me learn that God has a great sense of humor and that faith is not meant to be just for Sundays, but integrated into everyday life, so that as we go through life we feel empowered to serve God and to learn about God in new ways. I pray that you have many experiences this summer that help you learn about God in everyday life!

American Lutheran Church Council Meeting April 8, 2019

President Sara Borland called the meeting to order at 6:26 PM. Present at the meeting were Sara Borland, Maureen Even, Kaye Jones, Loren Corkery, Mike Waring, Christy Phillips, Wayne Schneider and Pastor Kristen. Absent was Christa Leach.

Devotions started with everyone's high and low for the past month. Pastor played a song from Isaiah 43 by John Hermanson.



Secretary's Report—Wayne Schneider made a motion to accept the secretary's report. Maureen Even seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report—Wayne Schneider made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Maureen Even seconded the motion. Motion carried. The checkbook balance at the end of March is \$-477.28.

Committee Reports:

Memorial—they have met 2 times. A rough draft of the committee policy was presented to the council.

Abundant Life—a thank you goes out to all who helped with Consecration Sunday, April 7. Extra pledge cards will be sent out to the ones who was not able to make it on April 7.

Hospitality—met on April 4 and discussed on what items to put into the church welcome bags. They hope to have the bags ready by Easter Sunday. Easter breakfast will be served between the 8 AM service and the 10 AM service.

Parish Ed—Sunday School is coming to an end this month. There is a VBS meeting at St. A's on April 14 at 4 PM. The theme this year is Mars and Beyond.

Property—met on March 31. Spring cleaning was a complete success thanks to 29 volunteers. All building ceiling light covers were washed; sanctuary beams were dusted; ceilings and corners of stairwells and rooms were dusted; and window blinds were dusted the week before March 24. Following the service on March 24 all room windows were washed, outside Sunday School windows were washed, narthex windows inside and out were washed twice, woodwork was washed, and south stairwell landing and steps were scrubbed. Pews were washed late afternoon March 24. All building padded stacking chairs were cleaned the week of March 24. Spring landscaping maintenance has been completed. It has been determined that the existing plungers in the 3 bathrooms are inadequate. Ray Zummak will replace those plungers.

Scholarship—no meeting

Technology—As a part of our new website, we upgraded our email system from an older platform to Outlook, giving Pastor and Secretary email additional storage and functionality.

Worship & Music--Charlie has been working on redoing the sound system, replacing the mixer with an old one of his that still works, and it seems to be doing a better job of making the volume loud enough to hear without being too loud. He recommends replacing the handheld microphones (they are both quite old and one of them literally fell apart in his hands, so the current ones up front are ones that belong to his band, but they don't have a way to switch them on & off). He recommends getting a model that would be \$35 each piece.
