Introduction to the day



Today is the first of five Sundays with gospel readings from John 6, the first four of which focus on Jesus as bread of life. Today Jesus feeds thousands of people with five loaves and two fish. 

A reading from 2 Kings.

⁴² A man came from Baal-shalishah, bringing food from the first fruits to [Elisha,] the man of God: twenty loaves of barley and fresh ears of grain in his sack. Elisha said, "Give it to the people and let them eat." ⁴³ But his servant said, "How can I set this before a hundred people?" So he repeated, "Give it to the people and let them eat, for thus says the LORD, 'They shall eat and have some left.'" ⁴⁴ He set it before them, they ate, and had some left, according to the word of the LORD.



GOSPEL: John 6:1-21

The holy gospel according to John

Glory to you, O Lord.

In John's gospel, the miracles of Jesus are called "signs," because they reveal the true character of God. As such, they remain within the mystery of God and cannot be brought under human control.

¹ Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. ² A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. ³ Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. ⁴ Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. ⁵ When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?" ⁶ He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. ⁷ Philip answered him, "Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." ⁸ One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, ⁹ "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" ¹⁰ Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. ¹¹ Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. ¹² When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost." ¹³ So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. ¹⁴ When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world."

¹⁵ When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.

¹⁶ When evening came, his disciples went down to the sea, ¹⁷ got into a boat, and started across the sea to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. ¹⁸ The sea became rough because a strong wind was blowing. ¹⁹ When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. ²⁰ But he said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid." ²¹ Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land toward which they were going.







American Lutheran Church Celebrates 90 Years!

The early beginnings of American Lutheran date back to 1932 when a canvass of the area was undertaken by Rev. Henry Mueller of Waterloo that indicated sufficient interest in establishing a church in the area. This was due St. Michael's Lutheran (the Forks) north of Jesup having been disbanded and the closing of St. Paul's Lutheran Congregation in Westburg Township south of Jesup. On July 3, 1934, the first organizational meeting was held in Colonial Hall in Jesup with 39 baptized members (28 confirmed). Rev. Harry A. Wilke was the first called pastor under whom the congregation progressed.

 $_{18}^{}$ Plans were made to build a new bungalow-chapel for a place to

worship. A lot was purchased on the corner of Sixth and Purdy Streets to build the new chapel and provide a space for the future building of a church. The congregation's first house of worship was ready in May 1935. The congregation was soon outgrowing the chapel and plans began for a new sanctuary to be built on the corner where the parsonage was standing but World War II delayed this construction. On April 11, 1948, ground was broken on the new brick church with the old parsonage that sat on the corner having been moved away. Christmas Eve services were held in the new basement that year. The chapel adjacent to the church was converted to serve as the new parsonage. The new brick church and the parsonage were dedicated on July 3, 1949, on the fifteenth anniversary to the day of the founding of the church. The bell on the top of the current brick sign at American came from the old St. Paul's Lutheran Congregation, Westburg Township.

An addition to the church was added in 1964 to provide more educational space, a pastor's study, a multi-purpose room and larger entry. American Lutheran was bequeathed a house on 8th Street to serve as the parsonage in 1984. The bungalow-style parsonage was sold and moved out to the country that same year. The space vacated by the parsonage was paved over to create a parking lot. Stained glass windows were added to the sanctuary windows in 1978 and a large stained-glass window was added in the balcony window in 1994. In 2009, an addition was built to include an elevator to provide accessibility to all three levels of the church.
