LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends in Christ,

We are now 2 months into this pastor-sharing adventure. I am grateful for the ways in which ALC and Jubilee have already been working together, even before this formal pastor-sharing agreement started. That shared ministry has given us a good foundation, I think, for sharing a pastor.

It helps, too, that these congregations are both friendly and supportive. I have felt very welcomed by the people of Zion Jubilee, and very supported by the people of ALC. It is quite an adventure to figure out and adjust my own and my families' schedules to this new reality, especially with the realities of the Covid pandemic and my kids' health needs. And one of the things that has kept me busy is not ALC or Zion Jubilee-- the pastor of Immanuel in Independence is on sabbatical this summer, so I have filled in for some funerals for him, and I have presided over a funeral for a family that has no church home. Sometimes it's hard to plan and schedule, and I know as a pastor I need to have a lot of flexibility!

I am also grateful for the flexibility I have seen in both congregations as I adjust to this new workload and new reality. Both congregations recognize that things can't be exactly like they were before (but the whole Covid pandemic has already brought a huge amount of upheaval, so what's a little more?).

But the thing I am most impressed with is the recognition that no matter what, our focus is God. We, as congregations, do all that we do because of all that God has done for us, and because of how we want to share God's love with others.

As time goes on, and this congregational partnership continues, we will continue to try new things. Some of them will work well, and some of them won't. Some of them will be well-received, and some of them won't. And that's okay. The most important thing is that we always remember that no matter what, God is at work in us and through us, and God will guide us into the future.

Maureen led devotions from I Timothy: Chapter 6 11-12, Mathew 5:16 and a reading from *Christ in Our Home*. Secretary's Report – Mike Waring made a motion to accept the minutes of the April 12, 2021 council meeting as written. Second by Sue Hoey. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Beth Stanek made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. Second by Christa Leach. Motion carried.

Committee Reports

<u>Memorial</u> – We have received funds from Doris LeBahn and Mary Ann Shatzer Staples. They will be updated in the book.

<u>Abundant Life</u> – No report.

<u>Hospitality</u> – They do have a meeting coming up.

<u>Parish Ed.</u> – VBS is moving forward with planning. They will be using the Park Pavilion, Boy Scout Booth, and the Gazebo so participants can spread out. Shirley brought up an idea for an Inter-Generational Sunday School program. This would get involvement from the whole congregation. Discussion was also held about expanding the youth participating in the services.

<u>Property</u> – We will be having a congregational meeting on May 23rd to get approval for the cost of the windows plus the cost of labor for installation. We are penciled in for the work to be done in September. There was a limb from a tree that fell in the Prayer Garden and has been taken care of.

<u>Worship and Music</u> – The online music was not of good quality most recently. Charlie will check into and make needed adjustments. The mic upstairs may have been moved. Meeting was held last week for more planning for upcoming services

I have been working on some Continuing Education. I am slowly working my way through online training for Safe Gatherings, Abuse Prevention, and Clergy Ethics. These are workshops that the Synod requires pastors to take every 3 years. I also took part in a webinar with Dr. Emily Smith, an epidemiologist who is married to a pastor, about current Covid data and church precautions.

I have signed up to take a Continuing Ed class on June 9 called Leadership and Anxiety in the Church. I have also signed up to be a part of the Moses Project cohort, which is an ongoing Continuing Ed set of classes (designed specifically for rural and small-town pastors) that meets in person and online throughout the 2021-2022 school year. The first in-person class will be Aug 9-11.

I am continuing to work on organizing Vacation Bible School. The Community-wide VBS will be in person this year, outdoors at Land-O-Corn park, on the evenings of Aug 15-17, with a closing program on Aug 18. The theme will be Great Big Beautiful World. We have started publicizing and are continuing to recruit volunteers.

I am also continuing to work on the Ministerial Summer Food Program. I do all the ordering and coordinating food pick-ups from the Food Bank in Waterloo, and I have had a few volunteers offer to pick up food, so I am starting to try to coordinate their schedules. The food will be packed into boxes at St. A's cafeteria, 5 different times this summer, and families will come pick the food up. ALC and Jubilee's turn to pack the food will be July 21, at 4:30pm. ALC needs to collect instant oatmeal packets for this program.

I will attend a Board meeting for the Independence Food Pantry on Tues, May 11, and a meeting with the Jubilee Conference churches on Thursday, May 13. The Interim Bishop has asked each Conference to hold a meeting for all the Synod Assembly Voting Members from that conference sometime in May, to give the voting members a chance to talk about what we are looking for in a new bishop for our synod-- that meeting has not been scheduled yet for our Conference.

Winding Creek has asked the Jesup pastors to resume leading monthly Bible studies there. (There is 1 Bible study a month and each pastor will lead two a year). I will be leading the Bible study on Wednesday, June 2.

I would like to take vacation the week of July 2-July 10. My family will be going to Family Camp at Camp EWALU and then will be spending some time at my parents' house. I would also like to take vacation the weeks of July 26-Aug 8, for a family trip to northern Minnesota.

New Business

Committee Policies – All committees have returned theirs except for Audit and Hospitality. Need to meet with Parish Ed to discuss. The Technology committee wants to know if they need to have the login information and passwords for everything. It was decided that they need to know where/who has the equipment however for Pastor and Secretary, they do not need those. If there is other equipment that has login information, then yes. There is a new Funeral Policy that has been drawn up. This is to help clarify what tasks need to be done to assist with the service.

Shared Ministry Contact discussion – As soon as the contract is signed, we will need to have it sent to the Synod Office. They will have it signed, make copies for them, and then will return it to us. If Sheila is unable to sign, who else can?

Special Congregational Meeting – We will need an updated bid for the meeting on the 23rd to ensure we are presenting the correct amount as prices may have changed. We will also be sharing the details of the contract for Pastor sharing with Zion Lutheran Jubilee. This meeting will be after the 9:00 a.m. worship service on May 23, 2021.

Old Business

Goals – new ideas, strategy plan. Nothing was discussed.

Transfer In/Out – Received request for transfer in for Bill and Barb Schneider from Holy Trinity Lutheran in Dubuque Iowa. Motion was made by Sue Hoey and was seconded by Mike Waring. Motion Carried Correspondence – Received correspondence looking for donations for EWALU and ELCA Ministries. Also received an order for the Labor Law Notice. These can be downloaded and printed.

American Lutheran Church June Council Meeting June 14, 2021

President Maureen Even called the meeting to order at 6:33 p.m. Present were Pastor Kristen Corr Rod, Maureen Even, Shirley Bergman, Mike Waring, Sue Hoey, Loren Corkery, and Sheila Collins. Absent were Christa Leach and Beth Stanek.

Maureen led devotions from *Christ in Our Home* and a reading from Galatians 6: 11-18.

<u>Secretary's Report</u> – Mike Waring made a motion to accept the May 2021 Secretary's report with name spelling corrections. Second by Sue Hoey. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – The check book balance at the end of May was \$5,511.06. We will pay off the BANKIOWA loan balance including the interest owed. We will ask Zion Lutheran – Jubilee to pay for the current month by the 15th of the following month to allow time to bill for mileage and other variable expenses. The fixed (Pastor's package) and the variable expenses (mileage, continuing ed, book allowance) will be kept track of separately. Sheila made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. Second by Shirley. Motion carried.

Committee Reports

<u>Memorial</u> – No report.

Abundant Life - No report.

<u>Hospitality</u> – No report.

<u>Parish Ed</u> – VBS is being planned. Shirley Bergman will ask for a council representative for the Parish Ed. committee.

<u>Property</u> – The stained-glass window repair bid is over \$11,000.00 and recommends extensive repairs and upgrades beyond just replacing the broken panes. We will put this project on hold.

Basement windows will be ordered by July 1 for installation in September.

Weeding has been done around the parsonage and mulching has been done on the east and south sides. The neighbor to the south of the parsonage will be expanding his driveway to the north. He will grade and seed the parsonage property where it meets his driveway and tile a down spout east to near the curb all at his own cost. Pastor will call Primrose Heating and Air Conditioning to snake the parsonage drain per their recommendations after last year's blocked drain problem.

Tim Davis will chemically treat the parsonage and church lawns each fall and spring.

The council will use a NEIA Synod checklist to inspect the parsonage and the church building this fall.

Scholarship – No report.

<u>Technology</u> – Maureen will contact Bryan Tonne to get surge protectors with battery back-up for both routers at a cost of \$40.00 to \$50.00 each. One TV appears to no longer be working.

<u>Worship and Music</u> – A memorial service is tentatively being planned for Saturday July 17 for congregational members who passed away during Covid. Families will be contacted.

July 24 is tentatively set for Tyler Hoey's ordination ceremony.

News for the LAMP is due by the 23rd of each month.

A new card is being developed to put in the pews to capture visitor contact information and/or prayer requests. Youth – We are starting to make plans for the National Youth Gathering next year. ALC youth will be

sponsoring "lunch in the park" this Thursday June 17 as a fund raiser.

<u>Pastor's Report</u> – Pastor Kristen led devotions at Winding Creek Meadows in June and led a Bible study for summer staff during staff training at Camp EWALU. She did an online continuing education course on leadership and anxiety in the church and attended the all day, online Synod Assembly. Kevin Jones, son of Pastor Tom and Kaye Jones was elected as the new Bishop of the NEIA Synod. He is currently Pastor at Trinity Lutheran in Mason City. Pastor Kristen was elected to the Synod Council.

New Business

The supply pastor for Pastor Kristen's vacation on July 4 will be Pastor Phil Borleske from Vinton. He will do both services.

Live streaming of the worship services will continue for now.

Fellowship will begin again after worship on Sunday June 20.

The Facebook page will be updated on mask policy and fellowship.

Shirley Bergman has been working on updating the Committee policies. Jessica Saunders, church secretary will have copies available electronically. A couple of printed copies are available for review. We are exploring the possibility of having individual tasks with detailed instructions available to make it easier for more members to participate. This is a work in progress. It could include intergenerational Sunday School tasks. Shirley and Pastor have made an event calendar noting what needs to be accomplished in each month of the year and what notifications need to be added to the LAMP each month. The council will use a NEIA Synod checklist to conduct annual reviews of all employees and the congregational ministry in the fall.

Old Business

The Pastor sharing contract with Jubilee has been signed by the interim Bishop and will be on file in the secretary's office.

Mike Waring made a motion to ratify all motions that were made by council electronically on Zoom since March 2020. Second by Sue Hoey. Motion carried.

The financial secretary records will be added to future financial audits, per Synod Guidelines.

We are still looking for help for the Treasurer position, especially tax help through the Synod.
