### A New Home for D.

D. wanted to become more connected to her community, while still ensuring she could receive the care she needed on a daily basis. Through LSI, D. has been able to enroll in the Host Homes program, which provides 24/7 care for individuals with disabilities and mental illness who thrive in a one-on-one setting instead of a busier group home environment.

D. was able to move into a private family home with her Host Homes mentor, Anita, and they have built a friendship and a shared social life. Anita is there to support D. as she works on her personal goals, while D. is still able to get the care she needs.

Currently, one of D.'s goals is to exercise and become more active in the community, so the duo enjoys shopping and walking around the local mall to stay active. Back at home, the two can work on skills – like hygiene and cooking – that make D. feel more independent and confident.

“I like helping D. and seeing her progress and growth in her daily living,” Anita says. “When you and the person in your care begin living like a family, when they are able to trust you and open up, then you know you’re getting somewhere.”

### **American Lutheran Church June Council Meeting June 13, 2022**

President Sue Hoey called the meeting to order both in person and electronically on Zoom at 6:30 pm. Present were Sue Hoey, Shirley Bergman, Cindy Gosse, and Barb Hayek. Joining on Zoom were Mitchell Hayek, Christa Leach, Beth Stanek, and Sheila Collins.

Sue led devotions from the song *Father, I Adore You*, and concluded with prayer.

Treasurer’s Report – The checking account balance at the end of May was \$11,100.26. There will be no transfer to the General Savings and Emergency Fund this month due to upcoming bills. Going forward we will be splitting the supply Pastor cost with Jubilee 50/50. Barb Hayek made a motion to approve the prorated payout of Pastor Kristen Corr Rod’s unused vacation. Second by Beth Stanek. Motion carried. Sheila Collins made a motion to approve the Treasurer’s Report with one correction. Second by Barb Hayek. Motion carried.

Secretary’s Report – Cindy Gosse made a motion to approve the Secretary’s Report with two corrections. Second by Beth Stanek. Motion carried.

**Committee Reports** – Full committee reports are available in a binder outside the secretary’s office.

Abundant Life – No report.

Hospitality – A joint congregational farewell potluck was held at ALC on Pastor’s last Sunday.

Memorial – No report.

Parish Ed – Planning is underway for Vacation Bible School.

President’s – Both congregations are working on establishing a Call Committee.

Property – The bell rope has been replaced. Spahn and Rose has been contacted to find a contractor to do slate roof repairs. Karr Tuckpointing has advised no tuck pointing is needed. Soft spots in the plaster in two places need to be repaired. Pat Winblade has agreed to serve on the property committee. Barb Hayek made a motion that the \$175.00 from the sale of the Sunday School tables be put in the Memorial Fund and designated for Youth. Second by Mitch Hayek. Motion carried. The Rod family is mowing the lawn at the parsonage. Barb Hayek, Cindy Gosse, and any other welcome volunteers will do landscaping/weeding as needed. When the Rod family moves, a picture inventory of the parsonage will be taken for insurance.

Scholarship – The six hundred dollars budgeted for the EPIC scholarship this year went to Alyssa Hoey, student at Wartburg College. (Previous recipient, Kristen Hoey is no longer a student at Wartburg). Wartburg matches our contribution. Treasurer Cindy Gosse will make a timely payment.

Technology – The laptop computer donated by Bryan Tonne is insufficient to operate the online video. Cindy Gosse will see if it could work to replace the outdated Treasurer's computer. If not, she has council approval to use up to \$1000.00 from the equipment fund to purchase a new one.

Worship & Music – Due to difficulty in meeting together, the committee has developed a sheet in google drive to choose hymns. There were 21 in attendance at the Midweek Boost on May 25. Midweek Boost has been

suspended for the summer.

Youth – The Youth had a successful and fun mission trip to Milwaukee. They will put together a presentation video to share at a future worship service. A pool party is being planned for later this month.

### **New Business**

Mitchell Hayek made a motion to approve the membership request of Cory Winkelpleck and the transfer of his records from ALC in Grundy Center. Second by Barb Hayek. Motion carried.

The signing of the Certificate of Completion of All Obligations form for Pastor Kristen is on hold.

Beth Stanek made a motion to table the appointment of a Call Committee until further council decisions have been made about sharing a Pastor with Zion Jubilee. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion carried. A special council meeting will be held June 22 at 6:30 pm for discussion.

Barb Hayek will be the new council representative on the Hospitality and Parish Ed committees. Cindy Gosse will be the new council representative on the Technology committee.

### **Old Business**

Christa Leach made a motion to ratify the Special Vote of May 17, 2022 which gave Treasurer Cindy Gosse access to use the BANKIOWA card and remove the access of Pastor Kristen. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion carried.

Pulpit supply has been worked out for most of the summer Sundays.

The possibility of having a joint confirmation class with a Jubilee instructor is being discussed.

The Faithful Innovation Community program at Luther Seminary is on hold.

**Correspondence** – none.

**Deacon assignments** - were made for July.

Beth Stanek made a motion to adjourn. Second by Cindy Gosse. Meeting adjourned at 8:29 pm.

**American Lutheran Church  
Special Council Meeting  
June 22, 2022**

A special meeting was held to decide how the call for a new Pastor would be determined.

President Sue Hoey called the meeting to order at 6:36 pm both in person and electronically on Zoom. Present were Sue Hoey, Barb Hayek, Beth Stanek, and Shirley Bergman. Joining on Zoom were Cindy Gosse, Christa Leach, Mitchell Hayek, and Sheila Collins.

Sue opened the meeting with a prayer.

The call choices are:

- A. Continue the agreement we currently have with Jubilee where ALC holds the full call and ZLC pays 50% of the Pastor's salary and benefits package, book allowance, continuing education, mileage, and attendance at Synod Assembly. This requires 30 days' notice by either congregation, the Pastor, or the Synod to dissolve.
- B. ALC and ZLC hold the call jointly in a 50/50 split. All costs would be negotiated including those mentioned above plus parsonage expenses and parsonage maintenance (up to a certain dollar amount) and would be shared equally. This choice requires congregational approval and is more difficult to dissolve.

After much discussion, the conclusion was that the joint call appears to be the better choice. It provides for more financial stability for us and for a prospective Pastor. Beth Stanek made a motion to move forward with a new contract for a joint call with Jubilee. Each church will hold 50% of the call. Second by Shirley Bergman. Motion carried.

Discussion continued, aided by a sample blank contract and a sample actual contract provided by Pastor Brackett. Points to be included in a future agreement (exact wording to be determined) are:

1. Congregational Identity
2. Start Date
3. Shared Pastor name and percentage division.
4. Pastor Financial Compensation based on Synod Guidelines  
(ALC continues to pay the salary and is reimbursed by ZLC)
5. Pastor Benefits
6. Worship Schedule
7. Joint Council Meetings
8. Parsonage Expense List
9. Future call committee formation
10. Possibly confirmation instruction provision
11. Dissolution terms

Beth Stanek volunteered to write a contract draft and email it to council members for approval at the July council meeting. If the draft is approved, it will be sent to ZLC. Pending their approval, a congregational meeting will be scheduled.

Mitchell Hayek made a motion that pending ZLC council approval of a joint 50/50 call contract, a call committee be appointed consisting of four members from ALC and four members from ZLC with one cochair from each congregation and one seat allocated to a youth member. Second by Beth Stanek. Mitchell amended his motion to make youth appointees nonvoting members. Second by Beth Stanek. Motion carried as amended.

To aid in our decision-making, Sue Hoey will send an email inquiry to call committee candidates asking for their reason for wanting to serve.

Beth Stanek made a motion to adjourn. Second by Cindy Gosse. The meeting adjourned at 8:35 pm.

President Sue Hoey called the meeting to order both in person and electronically on Zoom at 6:35 pm. Present were Sue Hoey, Barb Hayek, Cindy Gosse, Shirley Bergman, and Sheila Collins. Joining on Zoom were Mitchell Hayek, Christa Leach and Beth Stanek.

Sue Led devotions from James 2: 8, a reading from *Christ in Our Home* and concluded with prayer.

Treasurer's Report – The checking account balance at the end of June was \$14, 440.44. The vacation payment due Pastor Kristen Corr Rod was split 50/50 with ZLC and has been paid. There will be no transfer to the General Savings and Emergency Fund this month because property insurance is due. Sheila Collins made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report with one correction. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion carried. Barb Hayek made a motion to switch property insurance companies from Church Mutual to Grinnell Mutual for cost savings and comparable coverage at a cost of \$5,770.00. Second by Shirley Bergman. Motion carried.

Second by Shirley. Motion carried.

Cindy Gosse made a motion to ratify Amanda Phillips, Chris Waring, Merritt Jones, and Bill Schneider as members of the call committee with Hannah Borland as a nonvoting youth member. Second by Barb Hayek.

Motion carried.

**Lutheran World Relief School Kits:** School supplies are beginning to appear in stores which means the beginning of a new school year is right around the corner. Each fall, ALC has made school kits for the Fall WELCA In-Gathering that collects items for Lutheran World Relief. Last year our goal was to make 30 school kits. We exceeded our goal when we were able to put together 42 kits!

Each kits contains the following:

**4 70-sheet notebooks of college-ruled paper,**

**1 30-centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other,**

**1 pencil sharpener,  
1 pair of blunt scissors,  
5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers,  
5 blue or black ink ballpoint pens (no gel ink),  
1 box of 16 or 24 crayons  
and 1 2 ½ inch eraser.**

As you are shopping the next few weeks, please consider picking up some of these items – or the needed items for one complete school kit. We will also need material and cord to make the backpacks. If you would like to contribute monetarily to this cause, please put your donation in an envelope marked “Lutheran World Relief School Kits” (checks need to be payable to American Lutheran) and place in the offering plate. The Fall In-Gathering is October 8th at Immanuel Lutheran in Independence. Items for the school kits will need to be brought to the church by September 18th to allow time for putting the kits together and have them blessed during worship service prior to boxing them up and delivery on October 8th. A table will be set up in the Upper Narthex for your donations. A goal of 30 is set once again but let’s challenge ourselves to see if we can meet this goal – or exceed the 42 kits we made last year! Thank you for your continued generosity in supporting this ministry of American Lutheran to Lutheran World Relief.

**Lutheran World Relief Quilts:** The ladies of ALC will once again begin to make quilts for Lutheran World Relief beginning in September. We were able to send 41 quilts to the Spring In-Gathering that was held at Immanuel Lutheran in Independence in April. On September 12<sup>th</sup>, we will meet at 1 PM in the Fellowship Hall to get organized for the coming year. We will be going through the fabric and material that is on hand to sort the fabric by color, determine which fabric should be used for the backs and which should be used for the quilt blocks and what could be used for the filler. No sewing skills are required for this type of activity! We invite anyone who would like to join us to come that day to assist with this organization. Anyone who likes to sew, iron, or tie knots are invited to join this group. We will meet approximately twice a month from September 12<sup>th</sup> to April.
