National Adoption Month

November is National Adoption Month, a time to honor families who have opened their hearts and homes to children and teens. This month at LSI, we celebrate the families we support through Foster Care and Adoption and raise awareness for the hundreds of lowa children needing a safe, healthy home.

lowa foster families, like the Smiths*, raise the bar by opening their loving households to children and teens in need of a place to call home.

At LSI, we understand the importance of keeping youth in their communities to help maintain connections and stability during times of transition. So, when our staff received a referral for a teenage girl needing foster care placement, they looked inward toward the community.

At the time, homes in the area were either full or not open to accepting teenage placements. Coincidentally, the Smiths were present at a meeting the same night the referral came in. When they heard about Rebecca's* situation, they immediately knew who the child was and wanted to help in any way they could.

The Smiths were already over their licensing capacity, having been granted a variance to accept a sibling group. To be able to bring Rebecca into their home, they would need to be given another variance, which was almost unheard of.

"It was by chance, or the grace of God, that the Smiths were able to accept another child, and give Rebecca a stable placement with a family in her community," said Dawn Luetje, LSI Director of Resource Family Licensing and Support, working in conjunction with Four Oaks Family Connections.

Thanks to the combined support of the Smiths, LSI staff, and the community, Rebecca was placed in the foster home, where she could maintain her daily activities with the teachers, coaches, and friends

she was comfortable with. Rebecca continues to thrive in a stable, loving foster home environment and a caring community.

<u>Hospitality</u> – Cake, fruit, and bars were provided for fellowship following Confirmation on August 20.

<u>Memorial</u> – The committee met on September 5, 2023 to review the policy. Beth Stanek made a motion to publish the existing policy to the LAMP and the website. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion carried.

<u>Parish Ed</u> – Wednesday Worship begins September 20 and will be held every other Wednesday. On October 4 we will pack the school kits for Lutheran World Relief. The children's Christmas program will be December 17.

<u>Property</u> – Parsonage: Beth Stanek made a motion to accept the bid from Even Family Tree Service to trim four trees for \$1,712.00. Second by Barb Hayek. Motion carried. Options were discussed for re-landscaping the east side between the driveway and the front door as well as thinning/removal of hostas.

Church: The elevator has passed inspection. Cindy Gosse is the contact person with the insurance company for setting up the sensors in the basement. Allied Glass has installed new weather stripping on the front doors. Christy Phillips will remind the new neighbor to the south about ALC's right to dump snow behind the parking lot. Barb Hayek made a motion to accept the agreement from JDR Snow Removal for the parsonage and church for the 2023/2024 winter. Second by Beth Stanek. Motion carried. Lutheran World Relief – The 2023 Spring In-Gathering for the Jubilee, Tree of Life, and Three Rivers Clusters of the Women of the ELCA, NE Iowa Synod was held on April 15, 2023, at Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, Waverly, Iowa. American Lutheran delivered 58 quilts and 32 personal care kits to the In-Gathering. care kits to the In-Gathering. The total number of quilts received that day from the three areas were: 2,341 quilts, 81 school kits, 433 personal care kits, 247 baby kits, 59 fabric kits and 8 blankets. Two more In-Gatherings were held, one on April 17th in Mason City and May 6th in Decorah. The 2023 Spring In-Gathering totals for the NE Iowa Synod were: 4,781 quilts, 533 school kits, 2,221 personal care kits, 888 baby kits, 105 fabric kits and 66 blankets with 75 churches

supplying these items. All items made their way to the Lutheran World Relief warehouse in Minneapolis where they will be processed for delivery to places around the world and here in the United States where the needs are identified.
