CHILDREN'S SERMON

SCRIPTURE READINGS

First Reading: Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31

In the Bible, wisdom is portrayed in terms sometimes human and sometimes divine. Often, wisdom is personified as feminine. In this passage, Woman Wisdom is depicted not only as the first creation of God, but also as God's helper, rejoicing in God's creation, especially in human beings.

¹Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice? ²On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; ³beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: ⁴"To you, O, I call, and my cry is to all that live.

²²TheLORDme at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago.

²³Ages ago I was set up,

at the first, before the beginning of the earth.

²⁴When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water.

²⁵Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth—

²⁶when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil.

²⁷When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep,

Paul describes the life of faith with reference to God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. Even now, we have peace with God through Jesus, and our hope for the future is grounded in the love of God that we experience through Christ's Holy Spirit.

A Reading from Romans:

¹Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,²through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God.³And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance,⁴and endurance produces character, and character produces hope,⁵and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

SERMON- Video message from Bishop Jones HYMN OF THE DAY: ELW 412 Come Join the Dance of Trinity

- 1 Come, join the dance of Trinity, before all worlds begun— the interweaving of the Three, the Father, Spirit, Son. The universe of space and time did not arise by chance, but as the Three, in love and hope, made room within their dance.
- 2 Come, see the face of Trinity, newborn in Bethlehem; then bloodied by a crown of thorns outside Jerusalem.
 The dance of Trinity is meant for human flesh and bone; when fear confines the dance in death, God rolls away the stone.
- 3 Come, speak aloud of Trinity, as wind and tongues of flame set people free at Pentecost to tell the Savior's name.
 We know the yoke of sin and death,

our necks have worn it smooth; go tell the world of weight and woe that we are free to move!

4 Within the dance of Trinity, before all worlds begun, we sing the praises of the Three, the Father, Spirit, Son.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Thanks to all of you for the generous contributions for the personal care kits and supplies for our quilts. ALC delivered 41 quilts and 45 personal care kits to the Spring In-Gathering held at Immanuel Lutheran Church on April 9th. Clusters delivering items to Immanuel were Jubilee (ours), Tree of Life, Riverside, and 3 Rivers. Totals received that day were: 2,073 quilts, 331 baby quilts, 143 school kits, 699 personal care kits, 8 fabric kits and 20 blankets. Spring totals for the NE IA Synod are: 4,849 quilts, 851 baby quilts, 663 school kits, 2,049 personal care kits, 45 fabric kits, 51 blankets. Thanks again for your contributions to this important mission of American Lutheran. You are truly making a difference in our world.
