Amplifying the Voices of Iowa Children and Families

Individuals struggle without access to critical healthcare and family support services. Human service providers are overworked and underpaid. Former refugees and immigrants strive to build new lives in the U.S.

These are all issues faced by Iowans from all different walks of life. Join Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) to advocate for our community members at Lutheran Day on the Hill (LDH) on Monday, February 19, 2024.

In partnership with the three lowa synods of the ELCA, LDH is LSI's biggest day of advocacy. Over 150 participants gather at Capitol Hill Lutheran Church in Des Moines to learn about critical issues lowa children, adults, and families are facing. You'll learn more about the legislative process, the issues impacting your neighbors, and your role as a citizen in helping to amplify their voices.

After learning how to advocate for our neighbors, the group heads to the Iowa State Capitol to talk directly with legislators.

American Lutheran Church November 13, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 6:33 pm by President Christy Phillips. Present were Christy Phillips, Barb Hayek, Cindy Gosse, Shirley Bergman, and Sheila Collins. Mitchell Hayek joined by phone. Beth Stanek was absent

Barb Hayek led devotions.

Sheila Collins made a motion to amend the agenda with two additional items. Second by Sue Hoey.

Motion carried. Mitchell Hayek made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. Second by Shirley Bergman. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report - The checking account balance at the end of October was \$1,3081.70. Our Certificate of Deposit came due and was renewed for seven months at 5.0% interest.

Mitchell Hayek made a motion to authorize the Treasurer to renew CD's as they come due. Second by Sue Hoey. Motion carried.

Mitchell Hayek made a motion to transfer \$3,081.70 from the checking account to the General Savings and Emergency Fund. Second by Sheila Collins. Motion carried. Barb Hayek made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Second by Sue Hoey. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report - Cindy Gosse made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 9, 2023 Council meeting, the October 23, 2023 Special Council meeting, and the November 12, 2023 ALC/ZLC Joint Council meeting. Second by Shirley Bergman. Motion carried.

Committee Reports Hospitality - No report.

Memorial - Cindy Gosse made a motion to approve the revised Memorial Policy and Gift Receipt. Second by Sue Hoey. A roll call vote was requested. Cindy Gosse, Shirley Bergman, Sue Hoey, and Sheila Collins voted Yea. Barb Hayek and Mitchell Hayek voted Nay. Motion carried. Christy Phillips will send the new policy and receipt form to the Church Secretary so she can make it into a brochure. It will also be given to the Financial Secretary. The committee suggests giving some of the undesignated funds towards the National Youth Gathering in 2024.

Parish Ed - The children's Christmas Program will be December 17 during worship. First communion classes have been scheduled with instructor Sue Hoey.

Presidents - No report

Property - Parsonage: The parsonage is checked on about every two weeks. Thanks to Barb Hayek for removing the raspberry bushes. Shirley Bergman will check on the progress of composing a written renter's agreement for any future occupant, detailing what is permitted for the structure and grounds.

There is a city water survey that needs to be completed for both the parsonage and the church. Barb Hayek made a motion for Cindy Gosse to purchase a new vacuum for the parsonage, not to exceed \$100.00. Second by Cindy Gosse. Motion carried.

Church: Independence Plumbing, Heating, and Cooling will repair the toilet in the men's basement restroom and do the yearly furnace checks at the same time. Electrician, Dave Becker, repaired the flickering pendant light in the sanctuary. The committee is recommending the purchase of a new microphone for the pastor (see New Business).

Scholarship - No report.

Technology - No report.

Worship and Music - Hymns have been chosen through January 14, 2024. Christmas decorating will be after worship on November 26 and taken down after worship on December 31 by Youth and the congregation.

Special music for services is being encouraged. Christy Phillips will have the secretary email confirmation students about participating as Scripture readers.

Youth - The Youth will address the congregation on November 19 about their upcoming trip to the National Youth Gathering in 2024. A fundraiser list has been published.

Call Committee - Waiting for response to request for information from Synod representative Liz Albertson who has been on vacation.

New Business

- The Presbyterian Church has offered for area churches to help share the cost to sponsor a concert by Blake & Jenna Bolerjack. The total cost of their concert is approximately \$2,000.00. Sheila Collins made a motion to decline the offer. Second by Barb Hayek. Offer declined.
- Pastor's Wireless Microphone Barb Hayek made a motion to use Memorial Funds designated for online services to purchase a new Pastor's wireless microphone system in the amount of \$329.00. Second by Cindy Gosse. Motion carried.
- Offering Envelopes and Communion Count Offering envelopes and "I give online" envelopes will be placed in the pews. Christy Phillips will ask Secretary Chris Waring if she prefers to count communion cards from the pews or continue with the sign in sheet. We need an accurate count for the Synod and to establish qualified voting members.

- The Budget workshop will be on December 11, 2023 after the council meeting. The Budget Hearing will be after worship on January 7, 2024. The annual meeting is set for January 21, 2024.
- The Christmas offering will go to the Synod Good Gifts Program (similar to Heifer International). We will let the children pick which gift to send.
- Holiday Services will be December 24 morning service at 8:30 am and evening service at 4:30 pm.

ALC will host Lenten services on February 14 (Ash Wednesday), February 28, February 13, and March 28 (Maundy Thursday). Alternating with ZLC.

• Christy Phillips will ask our new secretary Chris Waring if she feels she has any conflict remaining on the Call Committee.

- Children's Corner Christy Phillips will have the secretary order some advent calendars and free materials from the ELCA for the busy bags.

Letter from Our Bishop

Dear Friends:

In November I learned that Kris Meyer was moving out of state and would no longer be able to continue to serve as the Vice President of the Northeastern Iowa Synod. The Synod Constitution calls for the Bishop, with the approval of the Executive Committee of the Synod Council, to "arrange for the appropriate care of the responsibilities of the officer until an election of a new officer can be held." (S8.55)

After careful consideration, prayer, and conversation with the whole Synod Council, Linda Groe as been appointed, and accepted, to serve as the Synod VP until an

election can be held at the next Synod Assembly in 2025. Her term as VP officially begins December 15th.

- Linda was elected to the Synod Council at the 2021 Synod Assembly. We felt it
 was important to have a VP that was elected to leadership by the Synod
 Assembly rather than bringing someone into this role who is new to the work of
 the Synod and Synod Council.
- Linda has served as the Chair of the Registration Committee at several Synod Assemblies and is the one who has presented the registration reports to the Assembly.
- Linda is a member of St. John Lutheran in Waukon. Her congregational involvement includes, Altar Guild, Choir, Bell Choir, LYO, WELCA, and Bible Study leader. She enjoys golf, scrapbooking, and reading.

Please join me in prayers of gratitude for the work of our outgoing VP, Kris Meyer, and prayers of blessing for our new VP, Linda Groe. The January/February 2024 issue of the Northeastern Star will include a more detailed article about this change in Synod leadership.
