Second by Cindy Gosse. Motion carried.

<u>Parish Ed</u> – No report submitted Cindy Gosse mentioned that Worship Wednesday has not been available the last two scheduled days. 

New 'C3' Ministry Fair to offer more than 20 workshops by Marcia Hahn

All congregation members from the Northeastern Iowa Synod are invited to attend the synod's first "Creative Collaborative Congregations (C3)" Ministry Fair Saturday, June 1, at Wartburg College, Waverly.

This new event is an opportunity for lay people, pastors, and deacons from across the synod to gather in fellowship, learn together, share ideas and get inspired with skills to strengthen their congregational ministries.

This year's Ministry Fair replaces the Synod Assembly, which will take place every other year and will meet again June 7, 2025.

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE The Ministry Fair will feature more than 20 workshops, along with round table discussions and displays to support congregations, staff members, council members, Sunday school teachers, youth leaders, and volunteers in their ministries and administrative activities. Parents and family members will find several workshops on faith in the home, keeping children safe, spiritual practices, and other family focused topics.

Everyone will be able to attend two workshops in the morning beginning at 9 a.m. and two in the afternoon, concluding at 3:45 p.m. Check-in for the fair will begin at 8:30 a.m. The day will also include a devotional worship service, lunch . with round-table conversations and a service project to support area food pantries. Bishop Kevin Jones and his tuba will be part of the live worship band planned for the C3 Ministry Fair worship service on June 1. Everyone who plays an instrument is invited to join the band, which will be directed by Pastor Dave Efflandt

## Opportunity for Service in our community and beyond Summer Food Program

The Jesup Ministerial Association will be offering bag/boxes of food for families that have been prescreened and signed up for this program. The churches participation: United Methodist, First Presbyterian, St.A's, Jubilee, American Lutheran and Jesup Bible Fellowship.

This program will provide food for approximately 12 families in our school district, two times a month from June 5- Aug 7<sup>th</sup>. Each church has an assigned day that they will be responsible for the packing and distribution. The families are responsible for arriving at St.A's on the delivery dates, the volunteers do not deliver items to the homes.

Our congregation has been asked to **supply boxes of Instant Oatmeal and canned vegetables.** You can drop off your donations in the shopping cart at the entrance of our church.

#### SERVICE PROJECTS TO SUPPORT FOOD PANTRIES

The Hunger Network invites congregations to bring birthday cake kits and packages of sanitary products to be distributed to food pantry ministries in this synod. The birthday cake kits contain items needed to celebrate a birthday or special day, including a cake



mix, candles, canned frosting, a can of soda (to replace oil and eggs), and a birthday card in a foil cake pan. Additional items can also be added, such as paper plates, sprinkles and other cake decorations, streamers, and party hats. Please include this recipe with your donation: Baking Instructions: Happy Birthday! To make a cake without eggs, oil and water, mix 1 can of pop with the cake mix. Bake according to the box directions.

The Cake and Sanitary products may be dropped off at the church. **<u>Deadline</u>** is **May 21**<sup>st</sup>.


