CHILDREN'S SERMON

FIRST READING: 1 Kings 19:4-8

In a contest with the prophets of Baal, Elijah proves that the Lord is God. Afterward Elijah orders the killing of the Baal prophets. Angered by the deaths of her prophets, Queen Jezebel threatens to kill Elijah. This reading finds Elijah fleeing, fatigued, and in utter despair.

A reading from Kings

4[Elijah] went a day's journey into the wilderness and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: "It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors."5Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, "Get up and eat." 6He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again. 7The angel of the Lord came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." 8He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.

PSALM: Psalm 34:1-8

SECOND READING: Ephesians 4:21--5:2

Christians are called to be imitators of God. This does not mean Christians are perfect. Rather, the Spirit is at work in our lives so that our actions and attitudes genuinely reflect the love and forgiveness we have received through Christ and his death.

A Reading from Ephesians

4 21 If you have really experienced the Anointed One, and heard his truth, it will be seen in your life; for we know that the ultimate reality is embodied in Jesus! ²² And he has taught you to let go of the lifestyle of the ancient man, ^b the old self-life, which was corrupted by sinful and deceitful desires that spring from delusions. ²³ Now it's time to be made new by every revelation that's been given to you. [2] 24 And to be transformed as you embrace the glorious Christ-within as your new life and live in union with him! For God has re-created you all over again in his perfect righteousness, and you now belong to him in the realm of true holiness. ²⁵ So discard every form of dishonesty and lying so that you will be known as one who always speaks the truth, for we all belong to one another. ²⁶ But don't let the passion of your emotions [a] lead you to sin! Don't let anger control you or be fuel for revenge, not for even a day. 27 Don't give the slanderous accuser, the Devil, an opportunity to manipulate you! 28 lf any one of you has stolen from someone else, never do it again. Instead, be industrious, earning an honest living, and then you'll have enough to bless those in need. ²⁹ And never let ugly or hateful words come from your mouth, but instead let your words become beautiful gifts [1] that encourage others; do this by speaking words of grace to help them. 30 The Holy Spirit of God has sealed you in Jesus Christ until you experience your full salvation. So never grieve the Spirit of God or take for granted his holy influence in your life. [1] 31 Lay aside bitter words, temper tantrums, revenge, profanity, and insults. 32 But instead be kind [9] and affectionate toward one another. Has God graciously forgiven you? Then graciously forgive one another in the depths of Christ's love.

5 Be imitators of God in everything you do, [h] for then you will represent your Father as his beloved sons and daughters. ² And continue to walk surrendered to the extravagant love of Christ, for he surrendered his life as a sacrifice for us. His great love for us was pleasing to God, like an aroma of adoration—a sweet healing fragrance. [i]

⁴⁷ "I speak to you living truth: Unite your heart to me and believe—and you will experience eternal life! ⁴⁸ I am the living God, the true Bread of Life. ⁶² ⁴⁹ Your ancestors ate manna in the desert and died. ⁵⁰ But standing here before you is the true Bread that comes out of heaven, and when you eat this Bread you will never die. ⁵¹ I alone am this living Bread that has come to you from heaven. Eat this Bread and you will live forever. The living Bread I give you is my body, which I will offer as a sacrifice so that all may live."
