Children's Sermon

Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

1Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. 2For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. 3When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! 4But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that

day to surprise you like a thief; 5for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. 6So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; 7for those who sleep sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. 8But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. 9For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, 10who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. 11Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.

Covid-19: The numbers for Covid in Buchanan County, and pretty much everywhere else in lowa, are skyrocketing right now. Our county test positivity is currently at 22.7%, and it seems like it will be a while before that number drops below 10%. As a reminder, our metrics for holding worship in person vs. online are:

If one (or more) of the below criteria are met, we will return to online only until the numbers return to within our designated ranges:

- Greater than 10% 14-day average positivity rate in Buchanan County, as measured by the Iowa Coronavirus website OR
- 6 or more active positive cases in the Jesup community school district, as communicated every Friday by the superintendent of schools OR
- 20 new cases per day in Buchanan County for 2 or more days in a 7-day period, as measured by the Iowa Coronavirus website.

At this point, we plan on worship being online only (and by mail for those with no internet) until further notice. Hopefully the numbers will drop again soon.

In the meantime, please remember to love your neighbor by wearing a mask, washing your hands, and social distancing.
