September 2024 – Impact of In-Kind Donations

A nearly empty closet containing the few items a refugee could fit in their suitcase when traveling to the US turns into a place of pride when filled with hand-sewn clothes made from that fabric. If I could dream...I dream of curtains for bare windows and cloth to cover worn tables. I dream of the magic of small pieces of fabric fitting into beautiful patterns in quilts to brighten homes and become treasured wraps providing comfort and warmth. These dreams are becoming a reality thanks to the generosity of an LSI donor.

Connie Hansen from Audubon, Iowa, is no stranger to fabric and sewing. Connie has enjoyed sewing for much of her lifetime. In her younger years, she shared her passion for sewing, serving as a 4-H leader in Melville Township, sewing clothes for herself and daughter. Through the years, her love and passion for quilting has grown friendships with others who love the craft. Connie dreamed of keeping her newest neighbors warm with her remaining fabric and donated the yards to LSI. This fabric will be used by our newly resettled immigrant and refugee families to create quilts and clothing, helping them feel more comfortable in their new homes. Why is change so scary? It is for me as well as you. I think its because we are so comfortable with the now – why should we change! But change happens whether we want it or not.

Change will be happening at ALC. As you witnessed at the Youth Led Worship service, we have lots of youth and they are hungry for spiritual nurture. We have fantastic youth leaders as well.

The 13 confirmation students are bright and fun to be with. And they too are looking for how their faith will effect their lives. Both groups want worship that speaks their language and speaks to their hearts.

So ALC will be making some changes. Slowly I will introduce some different words in worship. We will begin using the more contemporary Lord's Prayer (which is closer to what Jesus taught). And we will experience different Christian Creeds. The creed used in the Youth Service comes from the Celtic tradition.

We will move the baptismal font to the center aisle in readiness to baptize Elaina Sue Clark in October. We will leave it there, full of water every Sunday. As you come forward for Holy Communion, touch the water and remember your own baptism. Making the sign of the cross is optional, but it does remind us that through baptism we are buried with Christ and we are raised to new life with Christ.

The Praise Team will be returning and singing new songs once a month. Hopefully this will encourage young families to return to worship.

We are actively working on the MSP (document for the Call process) to update and revise it to include the energy that is evident at ALC.

All these changes may seem like too many, but we cannot stay locked in the past. We must move forward or this church will not grow.

Let us pray together: O God, You know which direction our congregational life is headed. Guide our path and heart as we continue to trust You through these changes in our life. While we don't understand what You're doing right now, help us depend on You as we navigate these changes. In Jesus' name, amen.

Council Meeting

August 12, 2024

Meeting was called to order by President Christy Phillips at 6:30 p.m. Present: Cindy Gosse, Barb Hayek, Maureen Even, Shirley Bergman and Pastor Pat Mohr-Kelly. Absent, Mitch Hayek.

Devotions by Pastor Pat.

Motion by Barb Hayek second by Shirley Bergman to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report:

Treasurer Cindy Gosse reported that \$5,000 was transferred from savings for the annual insurance premium payment. Also, with the current offerings and reimbursement from Zion for July expenses the current balance of checking is \$8,571.31. Motion by Maureen Even second by Barb Hayek to approve the Treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Motion by Maureen Even second by Cindy Gosse to approve the minutes of the June 17th and July 8th reports with corrections. Motion carried.

Christy Phillips reviewed the report submitted by Secretary Chris Waring of the tasks she performed the past month.

Committee Reports:

Hospitality – No report

Parish Ed – VBS was held August 4th with around 60 kids attending. The first evening was very hot so the 2nd night it was moved to JBF, returning to the park the rest of the week. The kids really enjoyed the week. The offering was designated for the University of Iowa Children's hospital, raising \$326.73. Each night a family within the community talked about their experience with the Children's hospital. Parish Ed will meet on August 13th to discuss Wednesday worship. Leaders this year will be Christy Phillips, Teri Schares, Beth Stanek and members of the Youth Group want to help. Sara Borland and Beth Stanek will continue to lead the Youth Group.

Property/Technology – Shirley Bergman met with Pastor Pat and Rich to review the parsonage contract. Thank you to members of the congregation that assisted with unloading the POD at the parsonage. A tree will need to be dug out of the rose bush on the east side of the church behind the bell. Dave Peterson was called to fix the door on the bell tower. Pastor Pat asked if it was ok to plant some mums in pots to add some color to the landscape at the parsonage. Barb Hayek said she would pick up some mums when they are available for Pastor. Mike Mostek asked if the garage would be available this winter for use. After discussion, motion by Barb Hayek second by Maureen Even to allow Mike Mostek to use the garage in exchange for removing the snow at the parsonage. Motion carried. Pastor reported the smoke alarm goes off when they turn on the oven. Maureen Even will get the alarm in the hallway of the parsonage replaced.

Scholarship – No report

Worship & Music - A meeting was held July 11th to choose hymns and plan the 90th Anniversary music. Carol Anhalt will lead the choir and choir members were contacted. The 90th Anniversary celebration was very nice. Thank you to members of the committee for all of their work, Maureen Even, Mary Adams, Chris Waring, Sheila Collins and Shirley Bergman.

Youth – The youth have returned from a very successful gathering in New Orleans. All the youth were sent a letter for Sunday evening, August 15th to get together with pizza to organize plans for the year.

Call committee – Committee Chair Amanda Phillips has not heard anything from the Synod. Pastor wants to work with the Call committees to update the MSP. After it is updated it will go back to the council and then the congregation before sending to Pastor Liz at the Synod. Pastor expressed we have to make it look good and inviting for a candidate.

Pastor's report – Pastor has started visiting members especially shut-ins. Pastor would like Chris Waring to continue to attend the Ministerial meeting and Mary Adams to continue with the devotions at Winding Creek so she can concentrate on revitalizing the church. Pastor presented the ELCA curriculum she wants to use for confirmation. It is lively and the kids will enjoy it. She wants the students to understand the meaning and not the memorization of the Commandments. Also, involving the kids in worship. All council members agreed with Pastor's

recommendation to use the ELCA curriculum. Pastor would like to have a healing service. Council agreed to allow a healing service quarterly. Confirmation orientation will be August 28th with pizza. Confirmation will meet every Wednesday evening. Women's Bible Study will be September 5th at ALC. Pastor assisted with VBS.

New Business:

Cindy Gosse presented information on the copier replacement. Two proposals were received and reviewed with Chris Waring. Cindy Gosse recommends the Canon copier for a 60 month lease. Motion by Barb Hayek second by Maureen Even to proceed with a 60 month lease with Gordon Flesch for the Canon copier. Motion carried.

Confirmation curriculum has been ordered. Letters have been sent to all confirmation students and parents.

Jessica Saunders sent an email to the secretary to ask if they could use the fellowship hall on August 24th from 1-5 for her daughter's birthday party if there is inclement weather. Motion by Cindy Gosse second by Maureen Even to allow Jessica Saunders to use the fellowship hall on August 24th. Motion carried.

Deacon assignments for the month of September were made.

Motion by Cindy Gosse second by Maureen Even to adjourn at 7:58 p.m. Motion carried.

Every Fifth Sunday

If you would like to participate, please come forward after worship to the altar rail. You may either stand or kneel. I will stand in front of you and ask what needs healing. You don't have to answer, but you may tell me what needs healing. It can be physical, emotional, or spiritual.

Then I will lay my hands upon your head and say a prayer asking for the Holy Spirit to come. Anointing with oil is a symbol of God's claim on us as a beloved child of God. If you would like more conversation about this ministry, please come and talk with Pastor Pat.

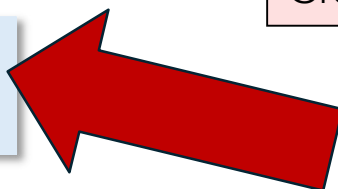
