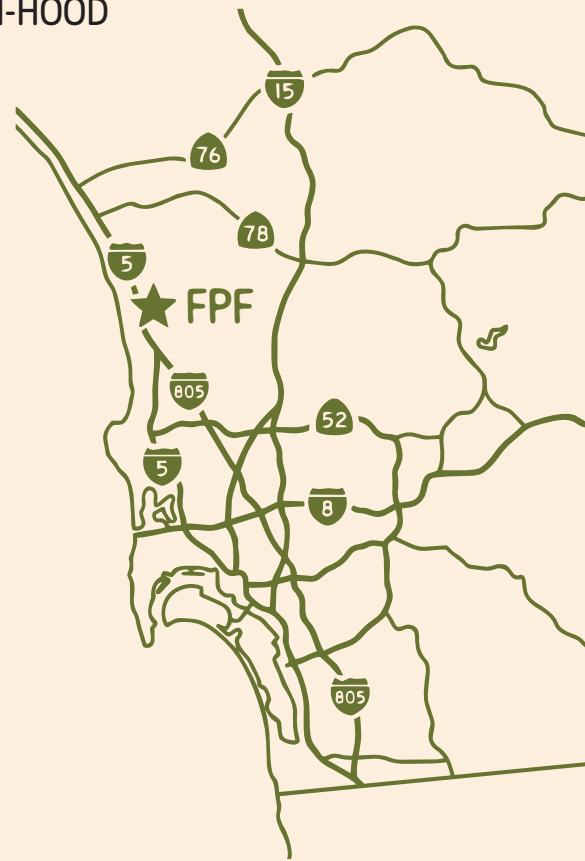
SPRING & SUMMER IN A COASTAL AGRI-HOOD

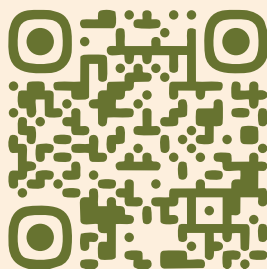

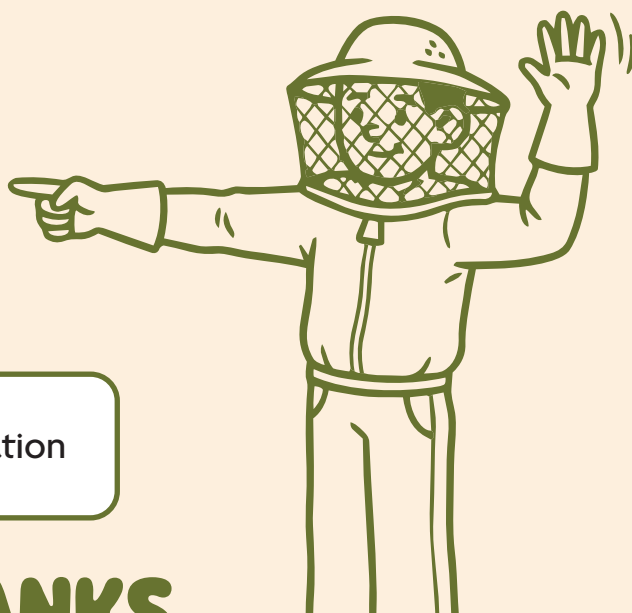
