As many know from various news sources the last 12 months, the Pacific Northwest has seen a lot of benchmark events. Starting September 2020 with the wildfires that darkened their skies and made it hazardous to work outside. Then in February the ice storm that caused power supply issues for more than a week in much of the grass seed production areas. As they entered late spring, Oregon was hit with one of the driest on record. Lastly came the heat dome near the end of grass crop finishing out, and right before harvest. All these events have led to, and no doubt contributed to the harvest failure that will be talked about for decades to come. As all crops were hurt to some degree, most crops were hurt significantly, which wasn't fully realized until well into the harvest season, causing lots of confusion and uncertainty to farmer prices, as well as market prices. Many bid deadlines came before this information was fully acknowledged, coupled with the fact that carryover seed was very low due to increased consumption through the pandemic. Ultimately seed prices needed to increase as not to put a hardship on the farmer. In cooperation with the Oregon Department of Agriculture's negotiated pricing order, on June 24, 2021, the seed industry and OGSBA, originally came to an agreement. This ODA pricing order increased both tall fescue and perennial ryegrass by 35% to 45% over last year's grower prices. As it was realized as seed started to be harvested, just how bad the crops are this year, grower prices went up on tall fescue (July 19th) and perennial ryegrass (July 21st) roughly an additional 12%.
