This is a sample request that might be helpful in finding the right person for the project.

Drop in sink:

“We are in need of a reliable craftsman to make some rough cuts in our solid surface countertop. We are replacing our current sink with a drop-in sink. The cuts will be covered by up to an inch, therefore no polishing is required on site. The new sink will be on site so you can calculate exact measurements. This is a simple drop-in sink with 1” flanges on all 4 sides. The opening you will make may be larger in size than current. No holes for faucets will be drilled. We simply need a rectangular cut in our countertop. Thank you.”



Retrofit top mount farm sink:

“We are in need of a reliable craftsman to make some rough cuts in our solid surface countertop. We are replacing our current sink with a drop-in retrofit farm sink. The cuts will be covered by up to an inch, therefore no polishing is required on site. The new sink will be on site so you can calculate exact measurements. This is a simple drop-in sink with 1” flanges on all 3 sides. The opening you will make may be larger in size than current. No holes for faucets will be drilled. The only critical cuts are the ones that extend beyond the cabinet (countertop overhang). These cuts must be slightly longer than the apron, as the apron of the sink will slide through this opening. There is a channel behind the apron that will allow the sink to slip over the face frame of the cabinet without any cabinetry cutting at all. Simply remove the false drawer heads and the sink slips into place. Thank you.”
