Dear Redeemed and Loved Saints of Grace!

Do these newsletters work? It is something I have been thinking about the last few weeks. I know that they get taken home. I know that they get read. But do they work? Does the message get across? Does the vision that I have, that we have for our congregation become clear? Are you feeling encouraged to share what you hold on to so close?

Too many thoughts. Too many questions roll through my head. Too many questions that do not have solid answers. I am currently working on a presentation for our circuit that is making me ask a very difficult question, upon myself. The presentation is based upon the mission of God and what is the task of the local church, in the greater mission that God has laid. This of course is more than "Go make disciples." It certainly has roots in the creation story, "Go be fruitful and multiply." Yet it remains consistent in 1 Timothy God desires all to be saved. Where does this leave the local congregation? To assist in the mission God has given.

As I work on the presentation my mind is drawn to a sermon series that I am also working on based upon the seven churches in Revelation. The first church in Ephesus is being condemned by Jesus for abandoning their first love and instead choosing to focus on doctrine. What Jesus is pointing out to them is that they have abandoned the mission of God. When the church in Ephesus first started, they had a heart for people. They longed for what God longed for. Every week their place of worship would be full. But, over time, they stopped loving the people in Ephesus, instead choosing to focus on making sure their doctrine was faithful. No longer did they desire to follow the mission God laid before them. Understand that both are needful. We need to be faithful to both the mission of God and the commandments that Jesus has taught the church. But what we cant do is place more emphasis on one and not the other. The church of Laodicea did that. They misplaced their emphasis on loving people and soon what happened to the church was they forgot what the truth of God truly taught. They abandon doctrine.

Back to the question I am pondering, do these newsletters work? Because I want us to hear the mission of God. As I am doing some research on the project for the circuit, I am finding some things I have always believed but it's nice to be reminded, and the answer to whom the Gospel is for? Answer everyone! Whether you are an every week attender, a lapsed Christian who is slowly losing your faith or a non-believer the proclamation of the Good News that Jesus died and rose for you is necessary for us all to hear every single week. It is necessary for us to hear that Jesus died for the people whom God the Father in Heaven loves. He loves the world so much that he sent Jesus to redeem it from our sins.

As we hear this message of how much God loves the world, it should remind us of what the mission

#### What is Operation Christmas Child?

Operation Christmas Child began in 1993. Since then, every year, people fill shoe boxes with small toys, gifts, personal care items, pencils, pens, and other little presents which are than given to children around the world.

How do shoebox gifts impact the church? In more than 170 receiving countries and territories, shoebox gifts are used by local Christians as a strategy for evangelism, discipleship, and the multiplication of believers and churches in their communities. More important than the items inside the shoebox, the gifts are an opportunity to share God's love—and the Good News of Jesus Christ—with children in need.

What is the purpose of Operation Christmas Child? The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world. Through this project, Samaritan's Purse partners with the local church worldwide to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and make disciples of the nations.





#### How can you help?
