Dear Redeemed and Loved Saints of Grace!

LORD'S PRAYER AS MODEL

After hearing Jesus teach and preach on the authority of God's word in the Sermon on the Mount, his disciples approach Him with a simple question. Can you teach us to pray? Jesus responds with the LORD'S PRAYER, which for the disciples and us becomes a model in praying. How? By following the example Jesus gave.

- READ Jesus used His words to form His prayer. As we follow what Jesus does, we can take passages of scripture, read and re -read God's word.
- MEDITATE Take time to reflect on what you have read. Take time to hear how God is speaking to you.
- SPEAK After reading and re-reading and reflecting on what God has said, use God's words. As you pray to Him, use His words to form the basis of your prayer.
- CONTEMPLATE When you are done praying. Rest in the promises of God's Word. Taking what you read and reflect on with you. Serving as gentle reminders that God is with you always.

Jesus taught us to pray by using words of God to form how He prayed. For us, we should follow as He taught. Using His Word and the Scripture to guide how we pray.



Grace Ev. Lutheran Church will be 100 Years Old this year. Have you ever wondered how church services came to be here in DeWitt? The following is a portion of the Church History article which was published in the 50th Anniversary program and written by Mrs. Vernie Tralau.

In 1863 a number of families from Hampton, Illinois, settled in the Grand Mound area to worship and spread the love of Christ. A missionary of the Lutheran, Church, Missouri Synod, Ohio, Rev. J.F. Doescher, contacted these people, and they started worshipping in their homes, and later in a

schoolhouse. Because of the large area which Pastor Doescher had to cover from 1863-1868, services were led by a couple of schoolteachers with Pastor Doescher or the Missionary Director supplying the sermons. In 1871 Rev. C. Seul of Lyons and families that were interested organized a congregation, Immanuel Lutheran Church, Calmus, Iowa.

Pastor Seul also assisted in organizing a congregation at Lowden. He suggested that the two congregations call a pastor to serve both perishes. The Rev. Herman Engelbrecht of Iowa City was called in 1871, and in 1872 a new church was built in what was known as Buena Vista, south of Calamus. This church was dedicated in 1873. Pastor Engelbrecht was called to Chicago, Illinois, and accepted. The Rev. J.H. Brammer of Denver, Colorado, was called in 1873 and accepted the leadership of both congregations. With Pastor Brammer's leadership both parishes prospered and grew in number. It was then that they agreed that each church should have a pastor. Since Pastor Brammer lived in Lowden, it was agreed that he should stay there and Immanuel, Calamus, would call a new pastor. The Rev. W. Mallon accepted the call and served from 1876-1878.

In 1878 the Rev. C. A. Bretcher was installed at Immanuel and served until 1882 when Rev. Alexander became the pastor. Rev Alexander had to resign eighteen months later, due to health issues.

In 1886 the congregation experienced financial problems and was not able to support a pastor and maintain a church. A decision was made to contact the Lowden congregation to see if they would share their pastor. Everyone agreed and this continued from 1886-1896.

During the years 1886-1896 a number of Lutheran families settled in Grand Mound and DeWitt. A Missionary by the name of Rev. H. P. Greif, Assistant Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church saw the desperate need of helping these families and took the responsibility of breaking bread with them. During this time, in 1892, the Rev. H. Niemand of Charlotte began holding services in Grand Mound.

In 1896 a mission congregation was organized in Grand Mound. It was then that the District Mission Board urged the Calamus congregation to call a pastor who would serve both Grand Mound and Calamus. The Rev. C.A. Broecher was called. He accepted. By 1902, it became necessary to add to the Calmus church building.

In 1903 the mission group at Grand Mound was officially known as Trinity Lutheran Church, Grand Mound, Iowa. Shortly after this Pastor Broecher accepted a call to Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The Rev. F.O. Lothringer was installed in 1903 to serve both Immanuel and Trinity.

Sometime between 1903-1913 the first known church services were conducted in DeWitt. Records are not available on this. (History tells us that Rev. Lothringer had his brief case stolen while attending a convention of the Lutheran Church. It contained all the books and papers examined prior to the congregation's acceptance as a member of the synod of Missouri, Ohio, and other states.)

Pastor Lothringer conducted the first Lutheran services in DeWitt. They were conducted in German and held on alternating Sunday afternoons. Services were held in a church building known as "Old Free Methodist Church", located north of DeWitt on Highway 61, the northeast corner of Sixth Avenue and Thirteenth Street.
