Dear Redeemed and Loved Saints of Grace!

There are countless stories about Fred Rodgers that I could share with you but one that stands out is from an interview he once gave about asking a child to pray. Mr. Rodgers visited a fourteen-yearold child with cerebral palsy and after spending the day with him, Mr. Rodgers asked him to pray. The confused child thought Mr. Rodgers was offering to pray for him but instead Mr. Rodgers was asking this child who could only speak with a computer to pray for him. As he was relaying this story to his interviewer, the interviewer confused like the child, asked Mr. Rodgers why someone as godly as him, should need the prayer of a child. Mr. Rodgers responded, "Oh, heavens no, Tom! I didn't ask him for his prayers for him, I asked for me. I asked him because I think that anyone who has gone through challenges like that must be very close to God. I asked him because I wanted his intercession."

"I wanted his intercession." A few weeks ago, those were the words that stuck to my mind. Wanted. Needed. Intercession. We talked about prayer. We read about prayer. We spent time discussing the role of prayer. The small group I attended had a great discussion of the place of the Lord's prayer. Which I am planning to preach on this summer.

But think back to week 3 of the being challenge when we spent time praying. One of the specific challenges was to pray for direction. Specifically, God's direction. Now, this can encompass a lot of different areas of your life. Two that come to mind are families and jobs. But I have been stuck thinking about God's mission.

Remember last newsletter we talked about the church following the mission of God. Of course, meaning that the church is responsible to share the Good News of Jesus with our communities. How we also get the opportunity to practice our sharing the Good News with those here at church. The importance of learning to do it here helps us to become more confident when we go where we are led.

Now you start thinking of communities and that gets tricky because where do you start? We learned from Pastor Zehnder that communities are family, friends, classmates, coworkers, church, city we live in, and the list keeps growing and growing. We start in a very narrow circle and before you know it we are looking at vast amounts of people.

Now we are taking the next steps. Where do we take the Good News of Jesus? That is why I thought about this story of Mr. Rodgers and the child he visited. Why I spent countless hours thinking of those final words of the interview, "I wanted his intercession."

Before we continue, we need to answer what does intercession mean? Most likely you already know but I also realize that is not a word we typically use. But it means to speak on one's behalf. Or more specifically to pray on one's behalf.

It is something that we always need. I crave it when people say they are praying for me. I always joke with Emily as I walk past her pew, I will poke her shoulder and say, "pray for me." We are pretty good at praying for each other. Praying for our family and friends.

But what about our city? Have you ever found yourself wandering through the streets and start praying for the homes you see? Or do you find yourself praying for the businesses? Or for the park? The school? The fire department? The police? Do you drive by the assisted living home and pray for the building and the people inside? Do you ever just walk the streets and pray that God would direct to you to the needs of our community? Then you have prayer walked.

Last summer we talked about the Luke 10:2 prayer, praying to the Lord of the Harvest. We prayed that God would show different opportunities to enter the harvest field. I hope that you are still paying attention to the ways in which we can share the gospel with those around us.

This year, I want us to think of entering the harvest field differently, by interceding for our community. How would we do this? Through intentional prayer walking. One Saturday a month we meet at church to prayer walk through our community. Stopping when we notice things to pray for. Whether it be businesses, or people, or whatever it may be. But the main point would be is we would walk through the neighborhoods of our community, praying for the people of De Witt, in the midst of God's harvest.

Our first opportunity will be Saturday April 27th at 9am. I think the last Saturdays of the month will work the best. We will have a few general directions that we will point people to walk with your group and you walk and when the Spirit leads you pray. Whether you walk for a full hour or just 10-30 minutes. We will be covering our community with prayer, through our intercession. There is nothing better than that!





Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have every bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a "title search." Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you'll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, "That's mine: I had it first."

You can't understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor's possessions are his: you don't have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership to you? Paul says, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God's leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since you belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.

This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.
