By the time we came home on January 4th, both kids upon sitting on the couch in our house threw up. Five days into the new year every one was on the verge of exhaustion, sickness. So much for that idea of rest. Instead, we were ready for the year to start over.

But it didn't. Thankfully the second week of the month wasn't as bad. The second week of the year only brought about blood draws, change of medicines, change of doctors, one kid feeling better but only for the other to stay the same, one parent feeling run down and the other on the verge. This doesn't even bring up that we tried twice to see Star Wars, and twice we had to leave early. Once for Elliott who got scared, and once because we got yelled at by a guy for bringing our kids to a 10 am showing of the movie. What a month!

January truly was a rough month. Thankfully the third week was a little quieter. Except the power went out, and we had to explain to a very confused three-year-old why the power didn't work. That didn't go over to well. Around the same time, Elliott decided that he was afraid of his closet. Oh, what a week.

Then to top it all off, I realized it was exactly one year ago, I began my struggle with depression. What a month. Maybe as you sit and read this, you can relate, or feel my frustration with this month. It is a tough month. But even with all the frustration this month, I am reminded of Jesus' words, "Come to me." This is by far the toughest word that Jesus speaks. Go to him. During this past month, every time the frustration came, these words came squarely in my mind. Go to Jesus. Hear his word. Hear his authority overall. Go to him and allow him to cover all your worries, and fears. Go to Jesus and he will bring to you rest. He will wrap you in his

Gerald John "Jerry" Gisel, 86, of DeWitt, Iowa, died Sunday morning, January 5, 2020, at Genesis Medical Center-East, Davenport.

Jerry was born February 1, 1933, to John and Ruby (Biedler) Gisel northeast of Delmar and moved near Welton in March of 1936. He graduated early from Welton High School in 1951. Jerry started working for Ernest Soenksen Construction and assisted finishing Grace Lutheran Church. In November of 1951 he started working for Clinton Engines in Maquoketa. He married Marjorie Jane "Margie" Soenksen December 14, 1952, by the Rev Theodore Hinck at Grace Lutheran Church, DeWitt. Jerry was drafted by the United States Army and ran the motor pool. He was stationed at Camp Roberts, California, Germany and Des Moines. Margie preceded Jerry in death October 21, 2016.

He was a member of Grace Lutheran Church, DeWitt. Jerry loved playing cards and doing custom combining and baling and selling CB and two way radios.

WHAT IS OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD? Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international Christian relief and evangelism organization headed by Franklin Graham. The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world, and together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Since 1993 Operation Christmas Child has collected and

delivered more than 168 million shoeboxes to children in over 160 countries and territories. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received.

The offering will be used to purchase shoeboxes, fees for shipping, and include "The Greatest Journey" for each box purchased.

After receiving shoebox gifts, many children are invited back to participate in our discipleship program, The Greatest Journey. Through this 12-lesson course, which includes Bible stories and Scripture memorization, they learn how to follow Christ in their daily lives as they share Him with friends and family.
