It has been about a year since we heard of a new virus coming to the United States. It was around a year since we began to hear new words being added to our daily vocabulary. Words like "shelter in place", quarantine, mask mandate, COVID-19, the list can go on and on. But it was about eight months ago that we began to say to each other "I can't wait for normalcy to return" or "I can't wait for next year."

There is nothing wrong with that line of thinking. I can't wait to be able to not have to be reminded to grab my mask as I walk out the door. I can't wait till there can be comfort in knowing that I will be safe from the virus. But at the same time, there is a danger in looking too far back or too far ahead, because we will miss what is happening now. I realized this in my own thinking, and in my guidance of Grace over the last nine months.

But then I realized I wasn't alone in my failure. I have been reading through Isaiah 40-55 as I plan for Lent and I stumbled upon Isaiah 43. Where God's chosen people, just like you and I, were struggling to keep their eyes on the present. To keep their eyes on what God was doing for them. Instead, all they wanted to do was look back. All the way back to Moses. What they thought had to be the "golden age." God was with Moses. Moses even got to have daily briefings with God. Sometimes he would spend 40 days and 40 nights upon the mountain. It is tempting to think all was great. Especially when you consider the turmoil Israel found itself in in the mid to late 500's B.C era. Conquered and battered. A throne was overtaken. Tribes forever lost. Certainly, didn't look like the "golden age." A time when God would be in their midst. In Isaiah 43, God who speaks through Isaiah tells the people of Israel about what He is doing for them now. Israel was exiled. They chased after other gods. Now they were being punished for their sins. They were conquered. Their homeland was lost. They were sent to a foreign land. But in this foreign land, the people of Israel cried out for their God to rescue them. And just like in the first Exodus, God heard their cries for saving and He came to their aid to lead them out of Babylon and back to Israel. God was acting in their midst. Yet God through Isaiah asks Israel, "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" Israel was not seeing what God was doing for them in the now! Their minds were still in Egypt and what happened over 1000 years ago. They were so preoccupied with the past that they completely missed what God was doing in the present.

I had to catch myself a lot over the last year and I still have to catch myself today. I need to be reminded. I need to let my eyes, ears, and hearts stay focused on the present. So that I may see what Jesus is doing, what he is up to. Not what he will do a year from now but now. I want to focus this year on seeing what Jesus does in the life of the people he encounters. What he does in our life when he encounters us. To focus on the reign of God. On his active daily presence in our life.

It is easy to look ahead or to just focus on the past. But what are we going to miss? We will miss what Jesus is doing through his active reign/ presence in our life. No matter what this year brings, let your eyes be focused on the love of Jesus!

"I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:8-9).

Without commands or even arm-twisting, St. Paul encourages, even challenges, the Church in Corinth to demonstrate the sincerity of their faith by their generosity in giving. He does this because giving generously is a gift of the Spirit given to us through the Gospel.

St. Paul wrote: "But just as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us—see that you also excel in this grace of giving" (2 Corinthians 8:7). In other words, just as we grow in faith and speech and knowledge of eternal things by the Holy Spirit through the Word of God, so also do we grow in giving from the same Spirit through the same Word.

The problem is that the grace of generosity often grows cold in us. It's not so much that we stop giving, but we don't put it first. We treat it like all the other bills that must be paid. It becomes a chore, just one more thing to check off a list of things to do. That empties it of its spiritual power and robs us of the joy that Christ and the Scriptures assign to it.

On top of that, since this generosity is linked to faith and knowledge of divine things, a lack of excelling in giving is sure sign that our faith and knowledge of God are under attack as well.

Thus St. Paul points to the foundation of generosity: the generosity of Christ Himself. Even though He was rich, He became poor so that we who are poor might become rich. Thus, the incarnation, suffering, and death of our Lord on the cross is the reason, source, and driving force for our generosity in giving to the church.

And since Christ who was rich became poor so that we might be rich in His grace—of which generous giving is part—so we also who are rich in His grace can excel in pressing His grace into service toward the gracious work of the church.

Pay attention to what you give to the church so that you may excel at it. And if you find that your heart has grown cold or indifferent toward it, immerse yourself in God's Word. Read it at home. Attend Bible Class. Hear and listen to it preached in the Divine Service. Be reminded of what Christ has done for you in His incarnation, suffering, and death. For this will strengthen your faith and knowledge. And where that excels, so will the grace of giving excel also.
