Dear Redeemed and Love Saints of Grace,

The other day as I was sitting in my reading chair, my phone buzzed with an alert. I looked up from my book and check the alert, thinking maybe it was a text or missed call. Instead, it was an article from my news app. As my eyes glanced the alert, it grabbed my attention, "Man wearing Jesus saves shirt asked to leave Mall of America." My first reaction was not shocking but I wanted to read the article to find out what happened. As the details of the story scrolled across my screen, I still cant stay I was stunned by the actions of the security team, but the accusations brought against this man wasn't anything he did. The primarily offense was the message of his shirt said, "Jesus saves."

As I finished the article, the author stated that the spokesman from the mall said the man wearing the shirt was allowed to stay in the mall without having to put on a new shirt. After putting my phone down and opening back up my book, my mind was starting to put connections together. The article said what people found offensive was the message "Jesus saves." Nothing else. Only Jesus. This is what St. Paul says in Galatians "the offense of the cross." In 1 Corinthians Paul writes how the cross because a stumbling block to those who don't believe.

Why does the phrase "Jesus saves" offend? If we are totally honest, the reason becomes very clear, what do we need saving from? As Christians when we hear the phrase "Jesus saves", we fill in the rest of the sentence with "from our sins." That is what we need saving from. Yet, there are too many times when we are honest, that as we stand accused of our sin, that we don't want to face the accusation. We don't want to admit that we are who our sin says we are. Our pride, or our view of ourselves wont allow us to admit who we truly are. People who need being saved.

The phrase then, "Jesus saves" becomes offensive because it places salvation in only one place. The cross of Calvary. There is no other place we can look. Only to the cross. For a world who doesn't want to acknowledge they need saving, it becomes challenging to focus on the work Jesus does for us. It becomes challenging to admit who we are. People who can't save ourselves. Instead, we are people who can only be saved through the love of our savior Jesus.

My thoughts slowly put these thoughts together over the last few weeks. Reflecting over this story, I realize that things will not get any easier. The world will keep pushing back, keep trying to get God's people to stop see the cross as the only way of salvation. The place where God shows us his love through his son.

Second thought for this newsletter this month, is I want to thank you all for all the Christmas cards. I know that I am little late on this, but it was my intention to get thank you cards out. I had them all written out and then a couple of my kids found my letters and rip them all up. I do apologize for that. Thank you all for the countless signs of your love for us. Thank you!

#### 35TH ANNIVERSARY OF GRACE CAMP

On August 22, 1988, the congregation of Grace Lutheran Church voted to buy 87 acres of farmland with the idea of transforming it into a beautiful area for quiet reflection, joyful worship, and other activities.

A 'Blessing of the Land' was held on October 30, 1988. The sermon was Matthew 28:18-20.

In March of 1989, there was a pledge drive to raise monies to pay for the camp. A member could donate \$550 for ½ an acre or \$1100 for one acre. There is a wooden plaque in the office of the Andrew building with 105 brass plates of those who donated!! On December 24, 1989, there was a mortgage burning.

What you see at Grace Camp today is the product of many, many hours of hard work by volunteers, members, and friends of Grace and lots of prayers.

#### The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod Newsletter Article – February 2023

Don't Replace "And" with "Or"

We've all heard that stewardship means giving to the church of our time, talents and treasure. This alliterative trinity helps us see that giving is not just about money, but about our whole lives. As we confess in the Small Catechism's explanation of the First Article of the Apostle's Creed, God gives us everything we have and enjoy. First we confess that God gives us "our body and soul, our eyes, ears, and all our members, our reason and all our senses" (SC II). Then we confess that He gives us material things. The time, talents, and treasure trinity places before our eyes the fact that we are to give something of all three of these things toward the mission of the church in thanksgiving for what God has provided. For everything we have, and indeed, everything we are, comes from God's fatherly, divine goodness and mercy.

The problem with this alliterative trinity comes when we replace one little word with another little word — when we replace the word and with the word or. It is always written with the and, but when we read it, we read it with the or. Thus this quite helpful trinity, which extolls that everything that we have and are is a gift from God, to be given back in service of His church, turns into a trinity that we can pick and choose from when we serve God. The giving of our time, talents and treasure turns into the giving of our time, talents or treasure.

Then the question arises: Can we give of our time and talents instead of our treasure? Or perhaps it is the other way round: Can we give of our treasure and not of our time and talents? But these are the wrong questions. The right question is, can we give of our time and talents in addition to our treasure? Yes, indeed, we are called to give of all three. The things that God gives us are not to be pitted against one another. Rather, they are given to us, and we are to press them all into God's service for benefit of His church and our neighbors in need.

Thus, we give all three. We give our treasure in the form of a generous, first-fruits proportion of our income. We give of our time in generosity for the benefit of Christ's holy church. We give of our talents in the same manner. Since God gave us all these things, we are called to give generously of all these things in faith toward Him and in fervent love to our neighbors.

For God has provided all these things for us. Out of His fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, He gives us each time, talents AND treasure as a means to bless those around us. We serve our neighbors with these things, blessing them with the blessings with which God has blessed us. We give of our time, talents and treasure to our families, our society, our church and our local congregations. And we do this because we know that we are not our own. Rather, we belong to God. We have been bought with a price: the holy, precious blood and innocent suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. He gave everything — His time, His talents and His treasure — to have us as His own and to live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence and blessedness. We have these things as gifts and blessings from God.

Let us then press them all into service for the sake of His love — time, talents and treasure together.
