# Dear Redeemed and Loved Saints of Grace!

It is always a challenge to know what topic to write about each month. It seems like every day; some thought-provoking idea comes to mind only for something better to come the next. But there is one thought that is very pressing on my mind. It's the word "connect."

I very recently listened to a book called, <u>The Church Called Tov.</u> This book absolutely slayed me. Which is good. I enjoy books that make me think and have positive self reflection. "Tov" is the Hebrew word for good. It's the word that God calls creation. But what does this have to do with "connect"? It has to do with the understanding of "Tov."

What is tov about creation? What is tov about you and I? When we do what God created us to do. That is a simple answer because God created us to be specific people. To do specific things that He laid out for us. Don't believe me see Ephesians 2:10, we are the workmanship of Jesus, Paul says. When we do what God created us to do, He calls it Tov. When we are good neighbors, love our enemies, fulfill our responsibility as spouses, parents, siblings, children, coworkers, and the like, we are going what God created us to do!

But what about a church? How can a church be Tov? Obviously, it is straight forward, a church is Tov when we trust what Jesus has done for us. See Ephesians 5, Jesus scarified himself for the church so that she may be holy, blameless, and perfect in the eyes of His Father, our Father in Heaven. The not so straight forward answer is doing what the church is supposed to do.

What is the church supposed to do? Well, it has to do with connecting. But before we get into this, first let us remind ourselves what a church is. Martin Luther when commenting on the Apostles Creed in reference to the Holy Spirit, he reminds us that Holy Spirit is gathering us together into a community. The gathering of people is a new community created through Jesus, who gave us the Spirit when he breathed on us through baptism.

What is this community, or the church supposed to do? Connect. However, first think of the African proverb, "it takes a village to raise a child." This proverb is referring to how in some places in this world it truly takes all hands-on deck to make sure that the child has a safe place to grow up. The same is true in the church it truly takes a village to make a church Tov. No, I am not referring to all of the work that we do here at Grace. But I am referring to our care for one another.

What does a community do? It cares for one another. It sees who is around and who isn't and it doesn't let people fall through the cracks. I will be honest. As I write this, I realize that this is an area that I struggle in as well. Most Sundays my heart aches over those who aren't with us that morning.

# HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH NIGHT






# **Being Challenge**
