Dear Redeemed and Loved Saints of Grace,

Before I went on vacation, I was pretty excited. In fact, really excited. The anticipation of sharing in the very special memories with Emily and the kids was and is something I will forever cherish. When you ask about how it all went, I am very excited to share the places and the experiences we had in and around the ocean. Of course, there will be things that didn't go to plan and as always that is and will always be okay, because they are not vacation ruiners. It can't take away the cherished memories I have.

Last time I proposed the question about you showing someone your bathroom in your house. This month I want to ask you what are you most excited about? What can't you wait to tell others about? That you just can't wait to stand before someone to share/express your excitement? A couple of weeks ago a small group of men gathered at the Old Library and we talked about the words/titles God gives to people. One of the words/titles is the priest. Exodus 19: 6 "you<sup>[a]</sup> will be for me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation." God says you're a priesthood of all believers. To be expected this does come as a shock, I am supposed to be a priest? That is exactly what God calls you to be a sharer of the good news.

Understandably, a priest does a lot of things, that is very true, but for whom? Well to your neighbors! My responsibility is to the local church of Grace, your responsibility is to those around you, namely family and friends.

Take a moment and lets think about the reach we have as Grace Lutheran Church in De Witt, and finding a footing to be people who are proclaimers of his Word. The last three months, we have average about 165 people in worship. We have had a high of 300 around two big events of Easter and Confirmation, and we have a low of 125. But lets take this average worship attendance of 165 and truly look at the ability we have to truly share the good news of God to our community De Witt.

Lets take our 165 people and play an experiment. Lets say that each one those people talks to ten people every week. I mean truly having a conversation with ten people. For one month our congregation would have 6650 conversations with people. Over the course of the year our congregation will have around 200,000 conversations. Now in my made up experiment I would understand that you are talking to a lot of the same people. But still 200,000 conversations is thirty six times the size of De Witt. Think about it, our congregation has the ability to have conversation with everyone in our

city THIRTY SIX times! That is amazing! That is the ability of our congregation when we engage in the mission of God.

What is the mission of God? It is going and making disciples of all nations. But the mission of God isnt limited to Sunday mornings. Our engaging and inviting people to have conversations about Jesus isn't limited to telling them to go to church. Our ability to invite conversations with others about Jesus is an everyday mission. This is the work that God is calling you to do. The moment he announces over you that you are his priest, he is sending you out to have conversation about his Son.

Our vocation as priests is to take what we learn in church and engage in those conversations with the people we speak with.

Now lets go back to those 200,000 conversations. What if out of those conversations we devote to one a week to engage our neighbor in a conversation with Jesus. How many conversations could our congregation of 165 worshipers reach? For one year we would have engaged 7970 people about Jesus. By the way that is forty eight times larger than our worship attendance.

This gets me excited. How God can and has used his church to reach the masses. He is going to use us, to engage in these conversations to sow His seed, and allow God to do what he does best with his word.

If you cant tell, I love speaking about the mission of God, This is what gets me exicted. I do also get excited about sharing with you treasured memories, but I want to get you excited also about joing in the mission of Jesus. Sharing with others the greatest news we get to share.

Jesus loves this world!
