Dear Redeemed and Love Saints of Grace!

When do you show people your bathroom?

A curious question, to be honest. I stumbled upon a podcast by two LCMS pastors in Arizona who started their conversation with that one question. As they bantered back and forth, they gave the usual answers. Like when someone asks. But then the conversation turned when one pastor said, "after you remodel. Because that is when you are most excited."

I thought about that line as I walked through my house, as I gazed through each room. I noticed the lack of excitement. Don't get me wrong, I love my house. I love everything about it. But I also know where all the faults are. Faults that I am proud of but also faults I am not so proud of. Such as I am very proud of the coloring the kids have done on the wall but I am not very proud of the burn marks found closely to the oven. Yet, it is these faults that make it challenging sometimes to open the door, to let others in.

I think it is the same as the church. Our church. Let's not get it wrong. We love our church. We love everything about it. The families that gather around our pews. The memories we made in the various ministry events, whether it is VBS, day or summer camps, just sitting in the pew hearing the great news of Jesus for you. There is a lot we love about our church. But there are also faults. The spots and stains on the walls and carpet. The typos found in pastor's article and sometimes on the screens or bulletin. We are very aware of all these things. Some of these we are proud of. I once remember a visitor remarking fondly over seeing a mark on one of these Jesus statues remembering the day it happened. Others we are not. Just like we are aware in our homes, we are hesitant to open the door and let others in.

But have you noticed that when we are excited about an event, we over look the faults of our house? Its seems like when the kids have birthdays or we have people bring their dogs over the coloring on the wall becomes a fun story or instead of shame, there is a uniqueness about the time the dogs turning the stove on and caught a box full of diapers on fire. And in a quick panic accidentally knocking a fully-on-fire diaper on the floor which left the wood floor burnt. These no longer cause hindrance but a chance to embrace those in my home.

But what about our church? What excitement level would it take for us to overlook our faults and open the doors for others in come in? I know what my answer is and will always be. The pure excitement of knowing that every time we gather Jesus is with us. The same Jesus whom God the Father sent in the flesh, to be born of a woman. He comes to be with us. In those 60 wonderous minutes, we are being taught by Jesus his grace, mercy and love for the children of God. We

LWR Baby Care Kits


