Dear Saints of Grace Lutheran Church,

It's turkey time! Well, ok maybe you don't like the traditional turkey dinner for Thanksgiving. Maybe you are counting on someone in your family to provide a deer or some other wild game to be what you feast on for the meal.

Well, whatever may be in front of you, understand why we sit down for a Thanksgiving meal. Our traditional thanksgiving meal isn't as much as a meal that is meant for giving thanks, as much as it is a reminder of what it means to be reconciled. Or a better way of saying it is that what takes place is a restoring of relationships with others in your family.

Maybe that is not how you celebrate the holiday, but in 1863, President Abraham Lincoln received a letter about restoring the Thanksgiving holiday. Not just restoring the holiday but making it a federal holiday. This wasn't something that could have been easily done, you know, in the middle of the civil war. But the letter that the President received was a letter that was already thinking about how to restore the South back into the Union when the war ended. What better way to restore/repair a relationship with a bitter enemy than sitting down over a meal?

While that in itself may be difficult to imagine doing. Intentionally inviting someone over who may make a meal somewhat uncomfortable. Yet this is what God has done to you. When his Son spoke the words "Take Eat and Take Drink, this is my body, and this is my blood. Given and shed for you." Every time those words are spoken to you, it is a reminder that while you were/are a bitter enemy of God because of your sin. God has given you a meal of his son's body and blood that restores/repairs/reconciles you to him. Through this eating and drinking, he calls you forgiven. He calls you loved. No longer are you one who was cast out by your sins but now you are one who is set apart because of his love for you.

Through this love that God in Jesus has shown you. That while you were far off because of your sin, Christ brought you near to him by giving up of himself. Giving up of his body and his blood so that you may be brought back to life as a redeemed Child of God

The Preschool Board






Needed


