I can't recall the number of conversations with Elliott that have gone something like this:

"Dad, I need to go to blue store?" "Ok, why do we need to go to blue store?" "Because we need to!" "What for?" "Dad, don't worry I will show you!" "Well if you don't tell me, we cant go." "Ok, dad...... I need a new crane." "Why do you need a new crane?" "Because I need one." "Ok but whv?" "Because I am well-loved." "Ok Elliott, let's go to the blue store." "But why dad...why will I get a new crane?" "Didn't you say it's because you're loved?" "You're right dad, I am loved! That's why you give me things" "You are verv loved"

I struggle with these conversations. I think all people do. What is the correct thing to do? Is it to reward a behavior? Say if you are good, then I will buy what you want? Sure, there are times and instances in which that is a good thing, I suppose. But what tears me up on the inside, is those words, "I'm well-loved." There is nothing that my kids can do that will ever change that fact. They are loved. They know they are loved. But still, there is an internal struggle.

But then Jesus gives me quiet time. Maybe during the afternoon or maybe on a run or maybe in the silence of driving to physical therapy. He gives me time to pray. To reflect on His Word. As I reflect on God's word, I am amazed by how often I am drawn to the things Jesus gives. Isn't that how it should be? Shouldn't we take time in our days to remember what God gives to us through Jesus?

If I just took a few words to flesh out this question of what does Jesus give? I would start by saying he gives us himself. Jesus freely gives us his presence, first of course in baptism as he unites himself with us, and then by the giving of his body and his blood. It's a gift, that he gives to us. Sometimes we might ask why do we need his body and blood? Why do we need Jesus to clothe us in His righteousness? But we are constantly met with his words back to us. That we are well-loved. Not because of what we have done but because of who we are. We are a baptized child

of God. We are God's children.

As God's children, we are invited to ask "Our Father in Heaven" for the things that we need. But as I reflect on God's word, I am amazed especially in the Psalms how often David or the other writers always remind God of his steadfast love for them. In fact, a few weeks ago, we spoke Psalm 136 together, you might remember, the refrain is "Your steadfast love endures forever." In a sense, the authors of God's word are reminding God that they are well-loved by him. So shouldn't we when we pray/ask God for the things we need in our life, remind God that we are well-loved by him. In fact, in Jonah, it is this reminder of God's love for his people that he ends up relenting from his desire to destroy Nineveh. Yet, it was through God's love that he gave the people of Nineveh the exact thing they needed, forgiveness for their actions. And it is the same for us. God's perfect gift comes from his enduring love for us. That he gives us what we need.

Yet, I struggle in those conversations with Elliott. You're probably thinking that I am a soft, rollover parent. Who allows my kids to tug on the strings of my heart. To be honest, you are right, three simple words can do that to me. Hearing my children say, "I'm well-loved." Granted I am the one who taught them those words. After they asked why they got their toys. Or got their ice cream. Or got their kinder egg. Or they got a soda from the "green" gas station. (Which is MJ's East) Or whatever else they get when we go to a store and come home with something that desire. they Yet, I know that I am teaching my children about the greatness of God's love for them. That just as they ask Emily and me, that they too can go to God and Jesus for the things they need. Will God always answer his prayers, absolutely God will. Just not always that the way that Elliott and his sisters will always want to hear. Just as I don't always give in to the things he wants, but most of the time we do.

Yet they are growing to know that they are loved. You are loved. God shows you this love every day, every time we gather as the body of Christ, and all the moments that we have family and friends who remind us that we are well-loved. Because you are very loved Jesus! Who comes to give you his perfect gifts to remind you of his everlasting love for you!

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF 2021 Fall Collection Drive School Kits

Give a child the opportunity to go to school! Why school supplies? To children the who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. Public school is usually free; but, in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford.

We are asking for school kits to be packaged individually. In a large zip lock baggie.

School Kit Supplies:

•Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½" (no loose -leaf paper can be accepted)

•One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

•One pencil sharpener

•One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

- •Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- •Five #2 Pencils
- •One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- •One 2 1/2" eraser

"Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl 9:10).

God bids us to be faithful in the tasks He calls us to do. He calls us to be members of a family (husbands and wives; fathers and mothers; sons and daughters). He calls us to be members of society (those who govern and those who are governed). And He calls us to be members of His family, the Church (those who preach and teach and those who hear and learn). Each of these callings from God places a duty on us.

As members of a family, husbands are given the duty to die for their wives as Christ gave His life for His bride, the Church; while wives are given the duty to respect their husbands and submit themselves to them as the Church does to Christ. Fathers and mothers are to raise their children in the fear and admonition of the Lord, teaching them the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Scriptures concerning Baptism, Confession, the Office of the Keys, and the Lord's Supper. Children are to honor their parents throughout their lives, and even when their parents are no longer alive, serving and obeying them, loving and cherishing them, and speaking well of them.

As members of society, God calls those who govern to bear the sword, that is, to punish those who do evil (those who live contrary to God's will) and to reward those who do good (those whose lives are lived in conformity with God's will). Those who are governed are to obey their leaders as to the Lord Himself, for their leaders bear the sword of God's temporal justice for a purpose.

As members of God's own family, the Church, He calls those who preach and teach to do so in faithfulness to His holy Word. To preach and teach the Law of God to convict the hearts of hearers of their sin and to encourage, admonish, and exhort them to do good works in accordance with God's will. They are to preach and teach the Gospel, the full forgiveness of their sins accomplished by Christ and received through faith, not by works. They are to administer the means of grace in accordance with the Gospel and the Word of God. They do all this for the young and old alike, for those who are near and far off. Those who hear and learn are to submit themselves to their preachers and teachers. They are support them by their prayers and their gifts.

Each of these callings from God place a duty on us. They make a claim on our presence; on our prayers; and our time, talents, and treasures. So, "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl 9:10). Pray for your family, your government, and your church. Give of yourself by means of your time, your talents, and your treasures to your family, your government, and your Church. That is what it means to be faithful in the tasks that God has given us. That is what it means to do it with all your might.
